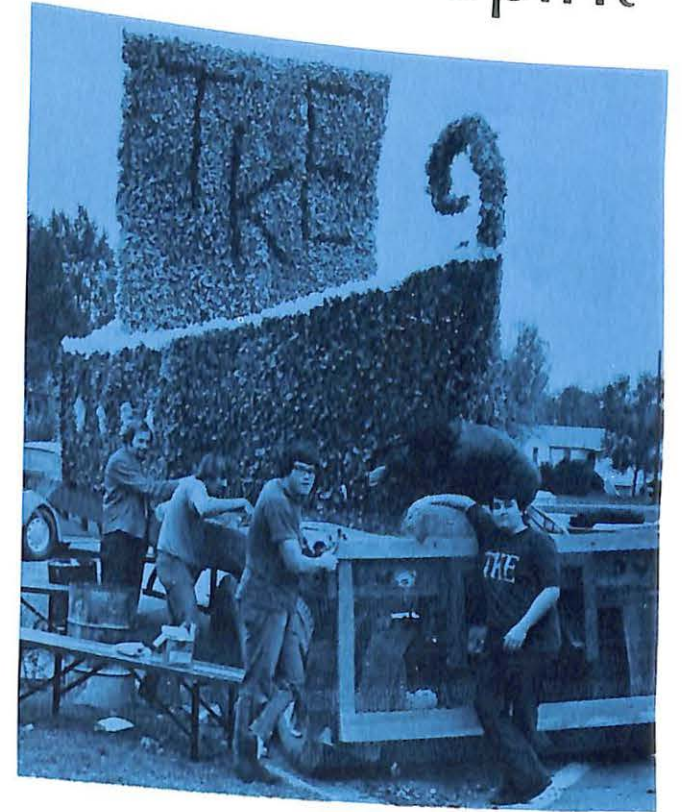

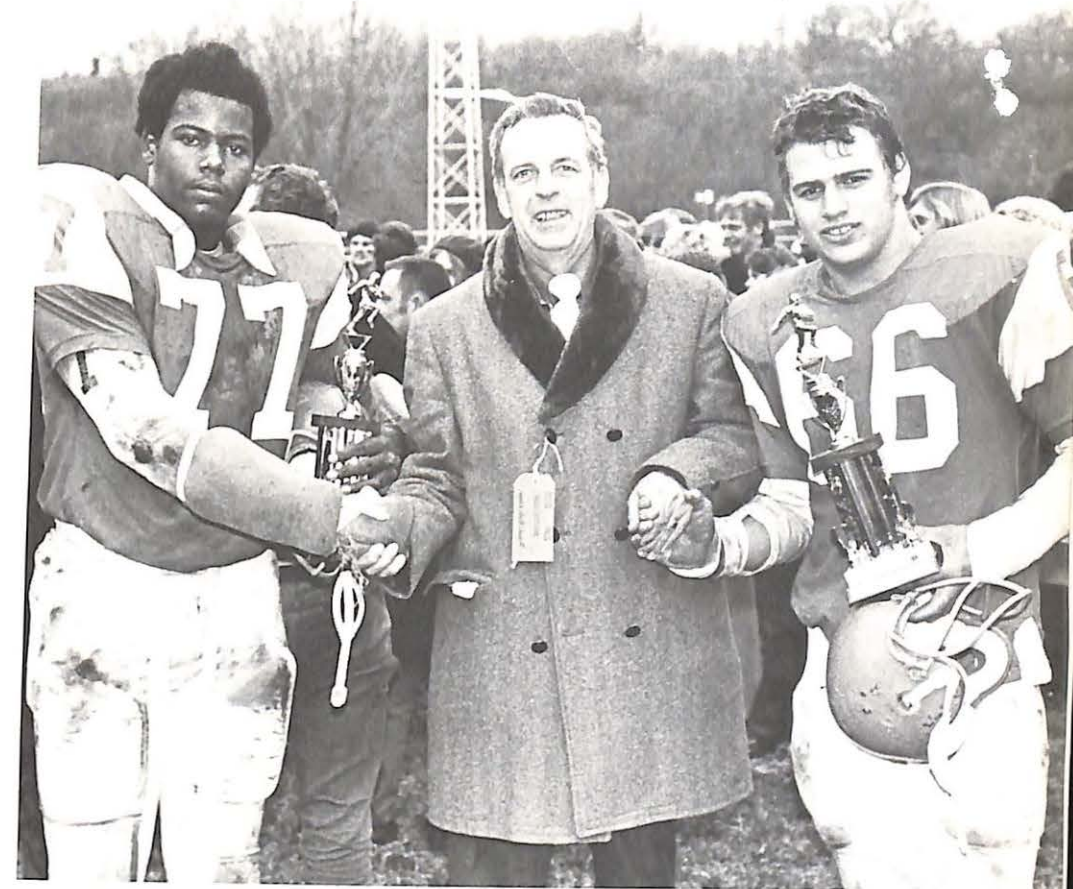


Bonfire and Torch Relay Incite Spirit
