Missouri Valley Celebrates Seventy-five Years

Missouri Valley College was chartered in 1888 and opened its first session September 17, 1889. It was the Cumberland Presbyterian College of the Synods of Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska and Colorado, and was regarded as the successor of two earlier colleges of the Church.

In 1874 a movement was started to establish a Synodical College, but only after a minimum of \$100,000 had been made available. An educational commission, headed by the Rev. James Henry Houx of Warrensburg, undertook to raise this sum, and after several years of effort did secure \$54,000. Thereafter the movement lagged until James E. Ritchey, of Sedalia, and others interested in the proposed college invited various towns to offer bids for its location. Marshall offered \$100,000 and the Educational Commission then under the leadership of the Rev. J. B. Mitchell, voted to accept it.

When the College opened, the Rev. Erasmus D. Pearson was president of the Board of Trustees, and A. J. McGlumphy, Chairman of the Faculty. Dr. McGlumphy administered the affairs of the infant college until April 1, 1890, when Rev. William Henry Black became its first president.

For thirty-seven years, Dr. Black served the College in a distinguished way. In 1926, Samuel R. Braden, Ph.D., became Acting President for one year until the election of George H. Mack, D.D. Dr. Mack remained in office eleven years. In the year 1937-38, the total attendance was 344. Thomas W. Bibb, Ph.D., of Albany College, Oregon, became President in 1938 and served until 1943, when the Rev. George P. Baity, D.D., President of the Board of Trustees, assumed direction of the College until a president could be secured. J. Ray Cable, Ph.D., of Washington University, became President in February, 1944. During World War II the facilities of the college were largely devoted to the support of a Navy V-12 unit. In June, 1948, following the resignation of President Cable, Dean Frederick Doering, Ph.D., was appointed Interim Chief Administrator. On August 1, 1949, Dr. H. Roe Bartle, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, was elected President of the College and G. Dewey Smith, Ed.D., was appointed Vice-President and Resident Administrator. Dr. Bartle and Dr. Smith served until January, 1951, when M. Earle Collins, Ph.D., became President.

Now, seventy-five years have passed and the enrollment has grown along with the campus, but the personal emphasis of its beginning still holds true.

The Foundation maintains a Humanics Department at Missouri Valley College to

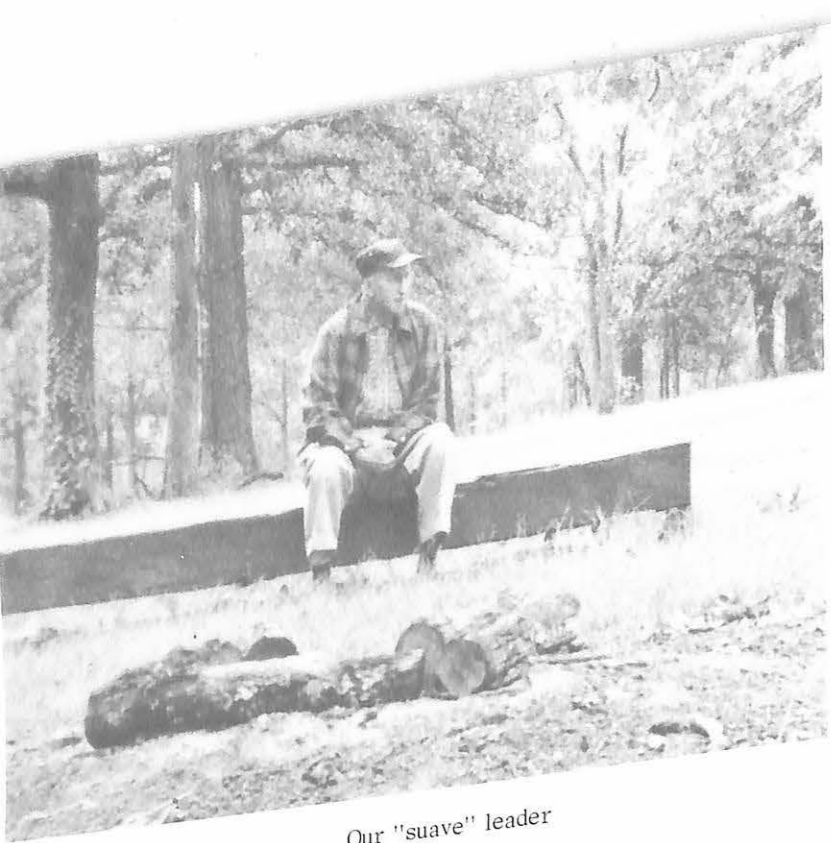

by the statistics.

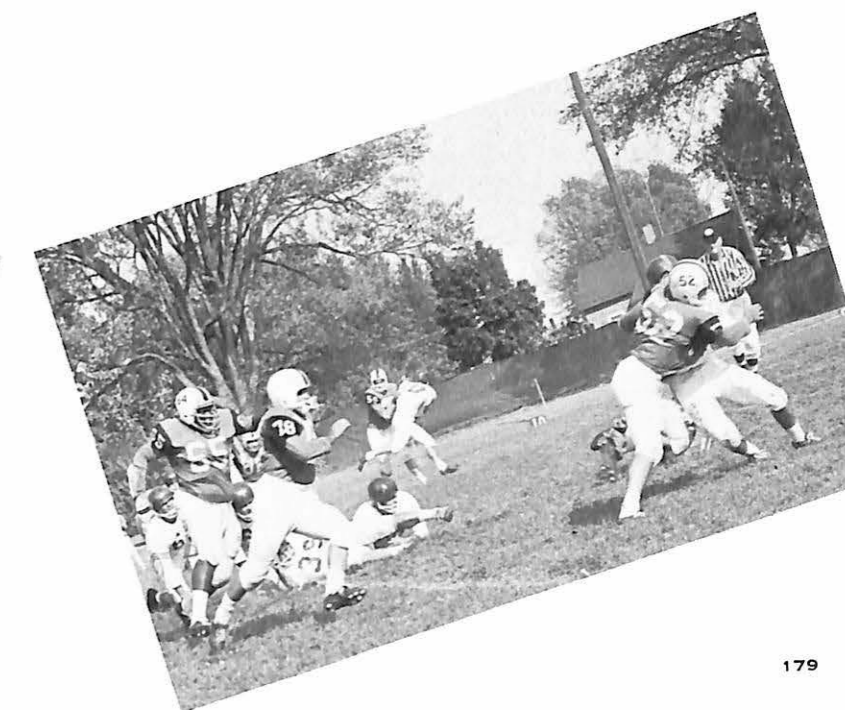
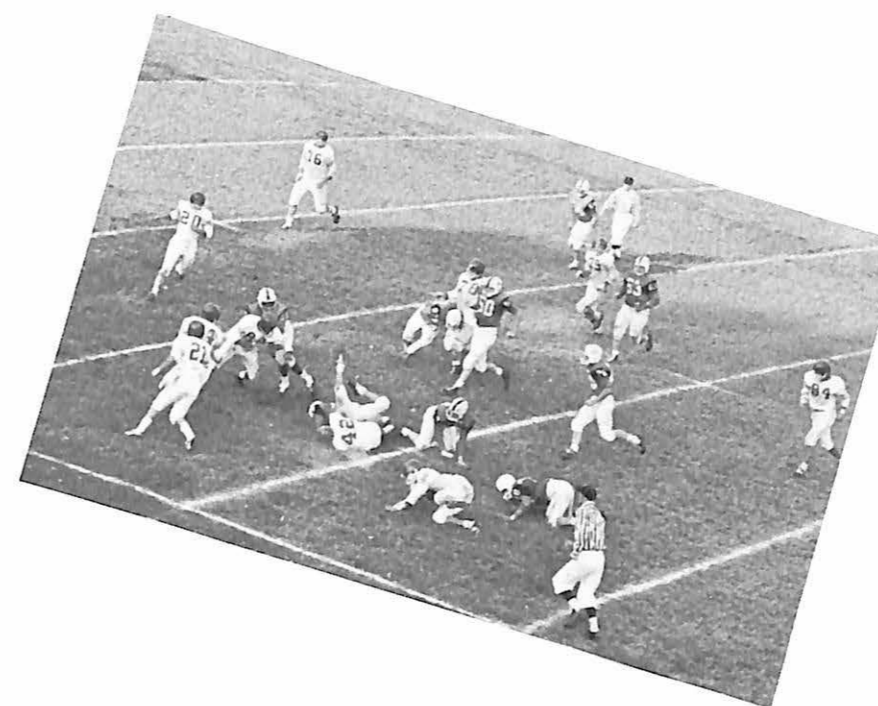
