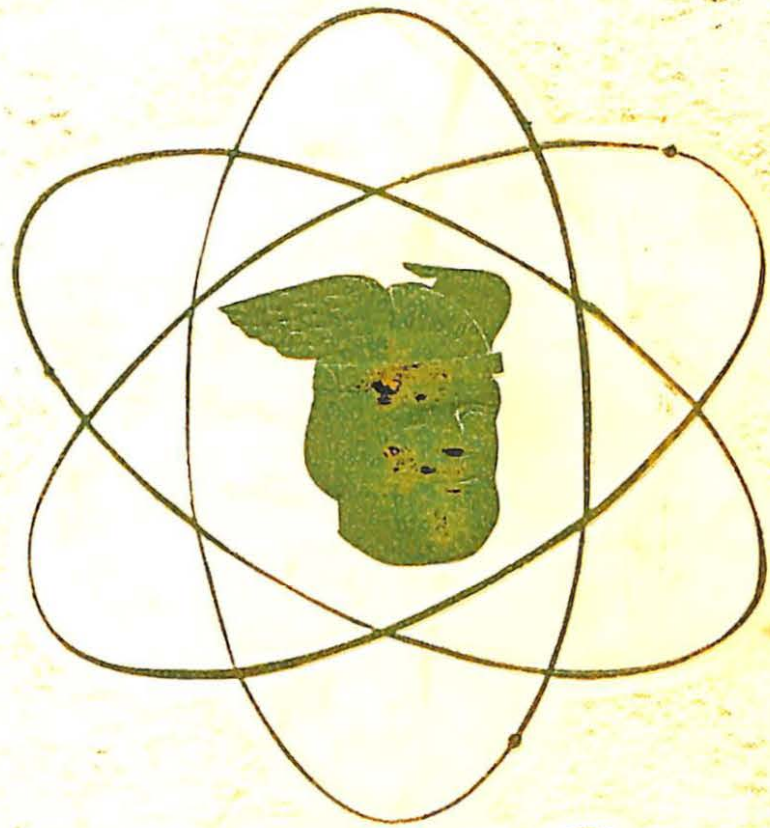

Sabiduria Celebrates Its Fiftieth Anniversary

This year as we celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of the Sabiduria we pay tribute to those students of the class of 1908 who published the first edition of our present annual in the year 1907. Sabiduria comes from a Spanish word meaning "wisdom," but in 1907 it was given new meaning by the Junior Class of Missouri Valley College. It was now to become a receptacle for the surplus funds and energy of the Junior Class, something no other class had ever produced. This edition was to become one of the best college annuals published in the middle west.

Miss Helen Campbell was the first Editor in Chief of the Sabiduria. This is not, however, the woman after whom Campbell Hall was named. When the book was first published, the greatest honor that one could have bestowed upon him was the dedication of the Sabiduria. The 1907 edition was dedicated to Alfonso Chase Steward after whom Stewart Chapel was named.

When first published, these early editions contained more of a literary flavor. There was always an article written about each class, telling what they had done during the previous school year. There were also many poems and short stories contained in these copies, school traditions and outstanding occurrences being the most popular topic. The story of the large skeleton now standing on the third floor of Baity Hall was one of the most fascinating tales. Even today "Maud" remains an unsolved mystery.

"No one knows what Maud really was. Some say she was a mule of extraordinary intelligence and humor, who featured in Sunday stunts for the benefit of the comic papers. Others say that she was a horse who passed a life of quiet and sedate dignity, drawing about the milk cart of Dr. Black, first President of Missouri Valley College. The facts will probably never be known--nor will we ever know what master hand, skillful and capricious, in the still watches of last Halloween night, carved and fashioned this statue and left it on the stage of the old Chapel of M.V.C.

Of the boys who viewed the wonder next morning, some looked surprised, others amused, a few self-conscious, and quite a number, guilty!"

Many other such mysteries and tales of tradition are found in these early editions of the Sabiduria. Yearbooks are today a pictorial record of each passing school year. Now, as we present the fiftieth edition of the Sabiduria we hope that we have laid before you a vivid picture of the 1961-62 school year here at Missouri Valley College. May it be a remembrance of the many moments, both happy and sad, that we have shared here on the campus of our Alma Mater.

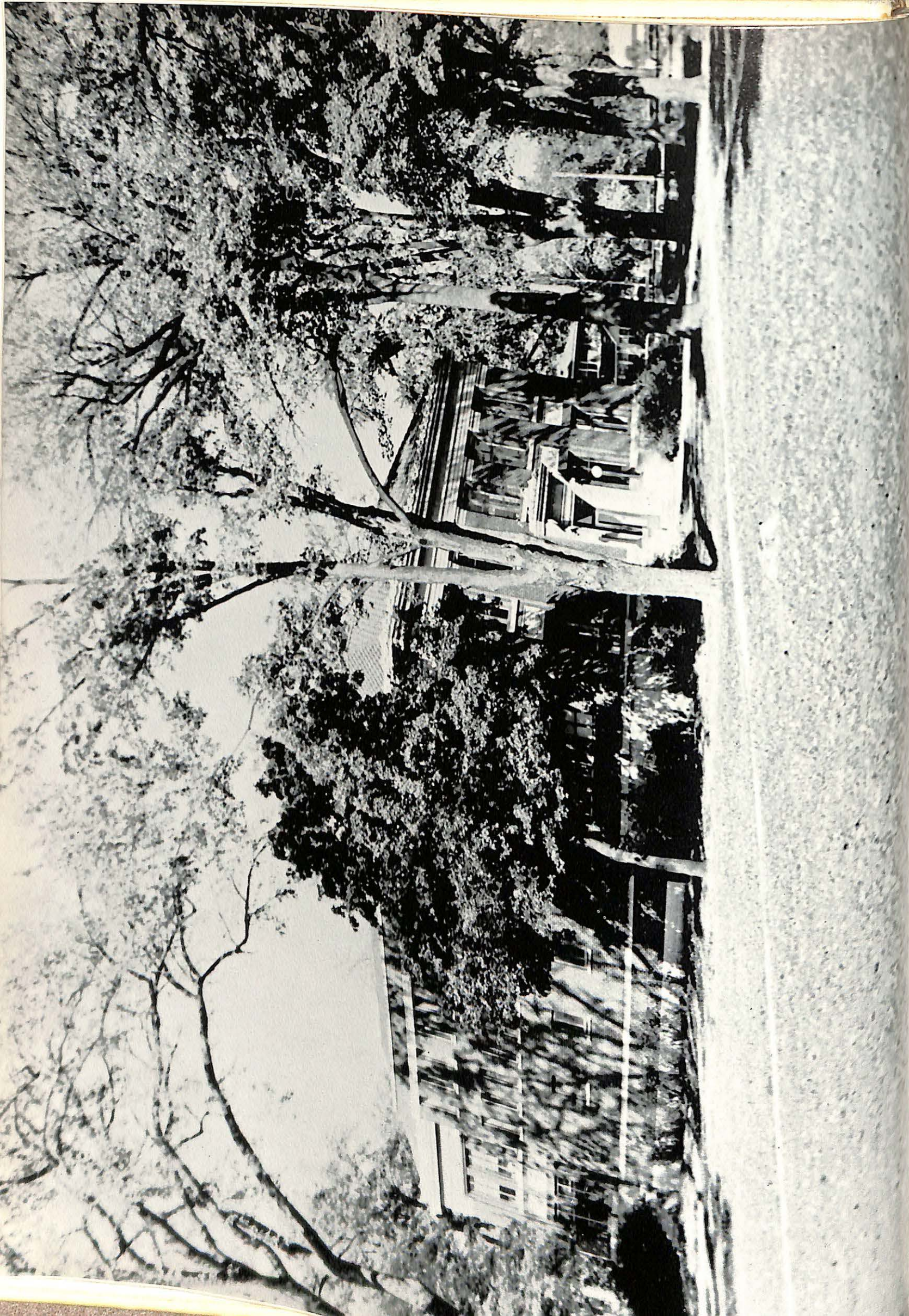

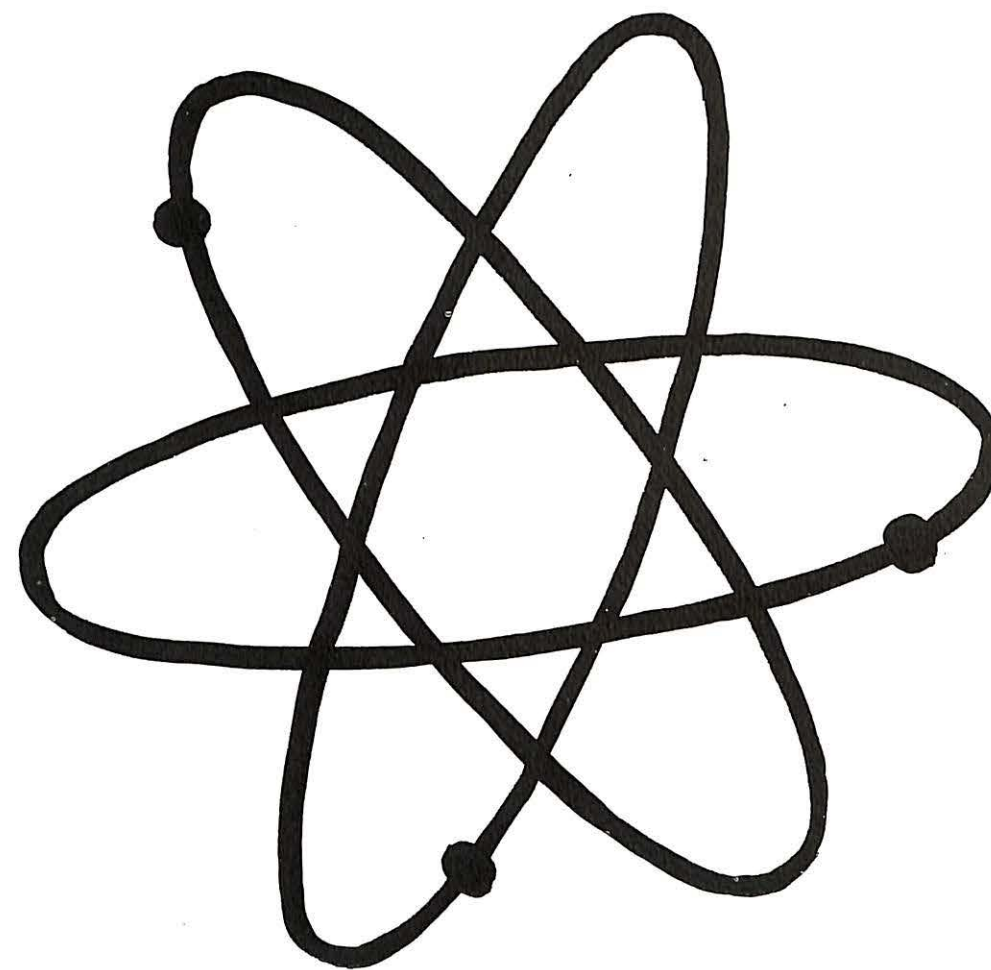

The record of this year will soon be history. History is always fascinating. To have a part in making history makes life real and challenging.

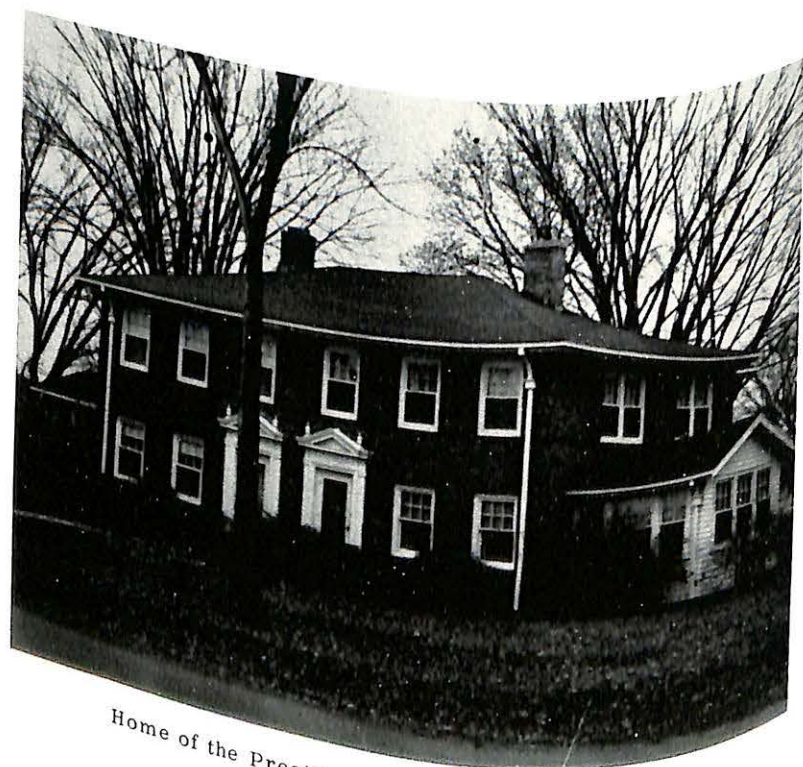
This has been a year of planning and growth. It has been a year of fine cooperative spirit evidenced by the fine work which the Sabiduria staff has done in this publication.

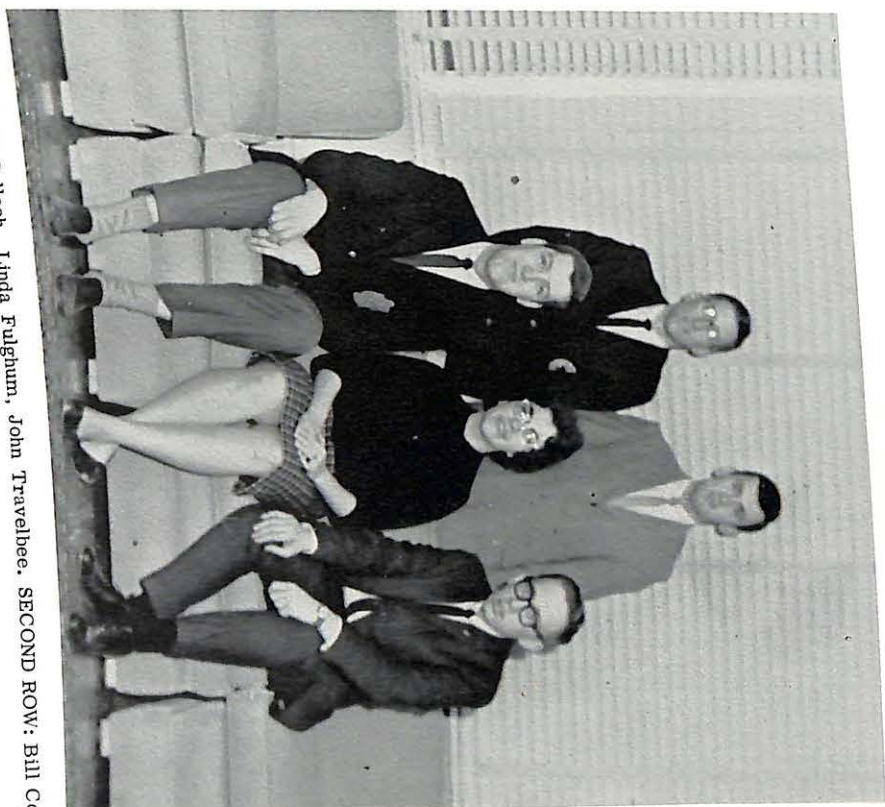

Vikings Win M.C.A.U. Conference Championship

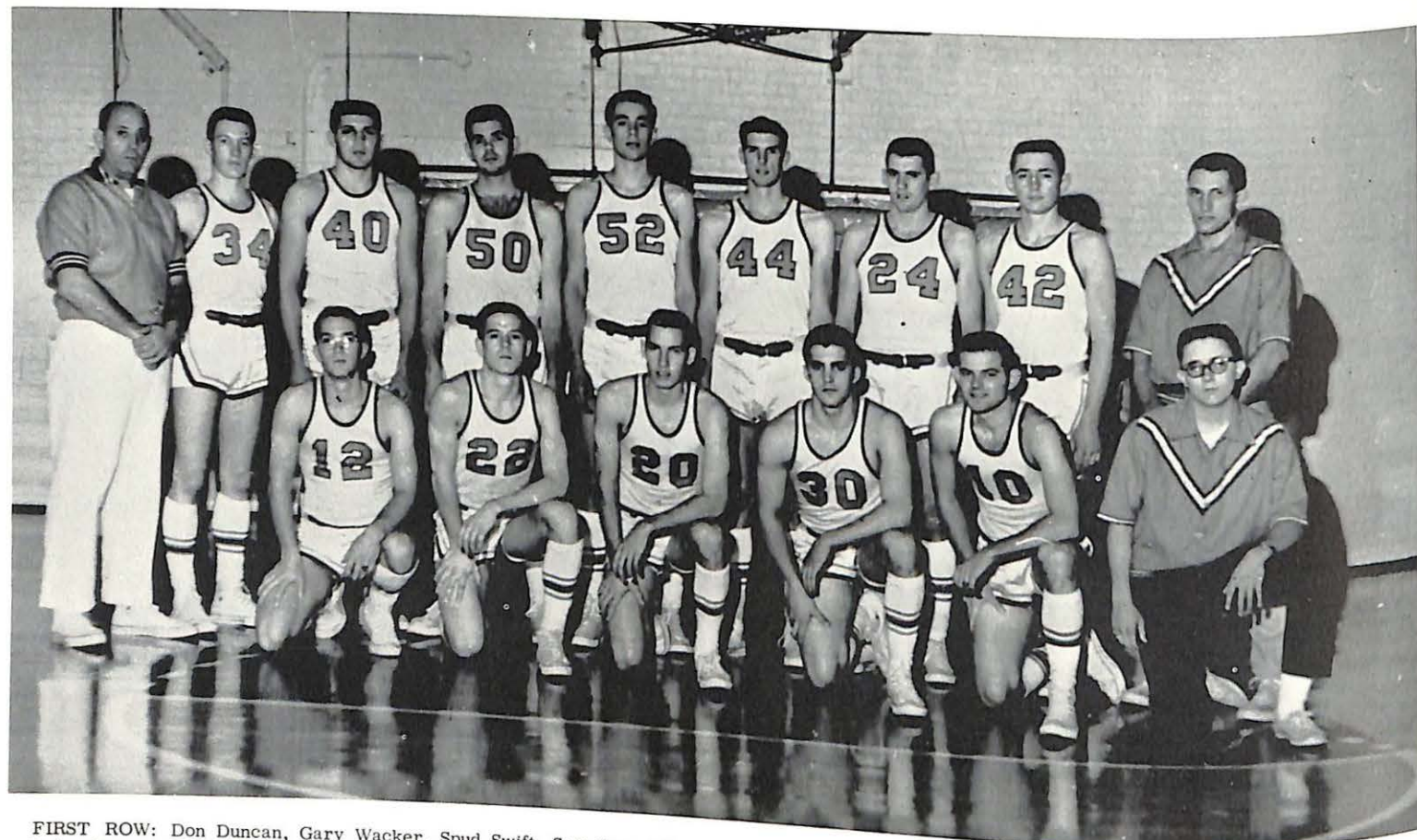
