## FASHIONS BIG DAY

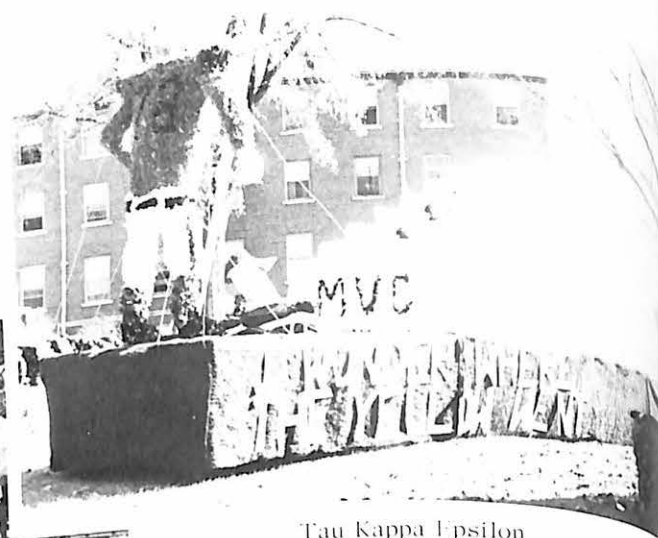

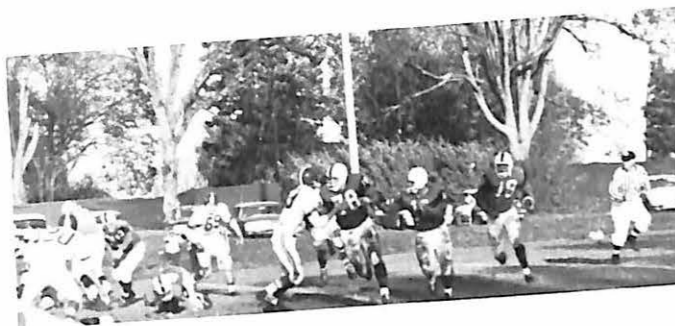

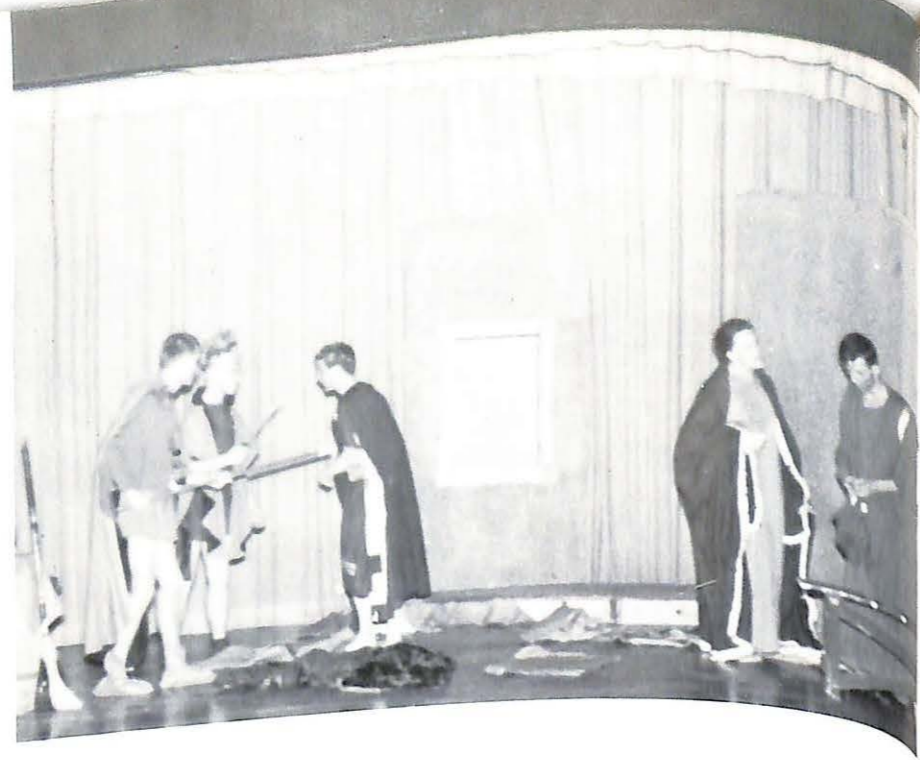


**"Star Song" Review**

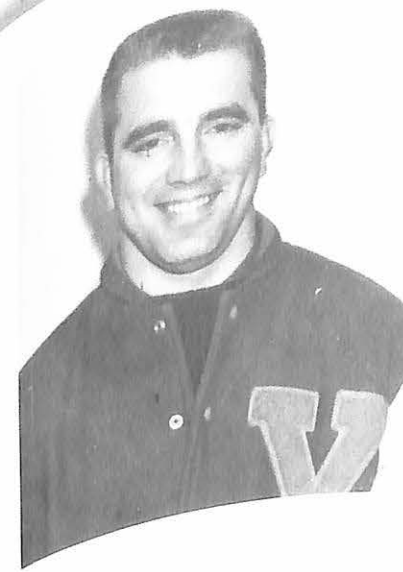


## Vikes Win Season Final

The Vikings, who came up on the short end of the long trip in the won-lost, however, gained valuable experience which proved to be an asset as the season progressed.



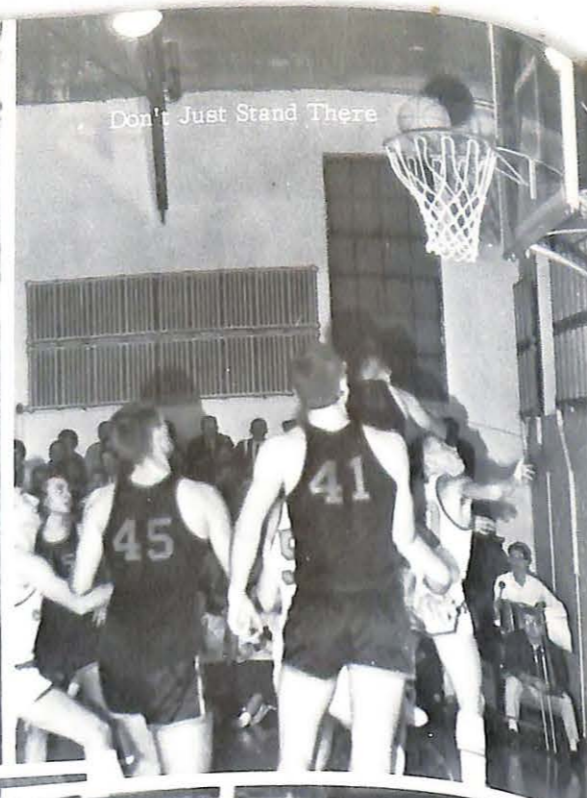

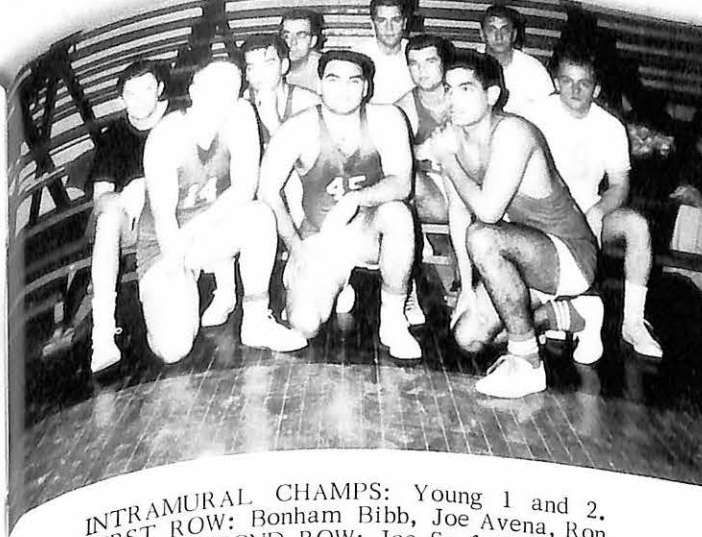

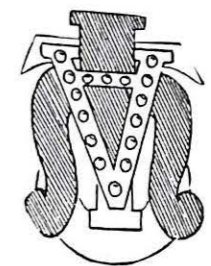
## Pi Kappa Delta

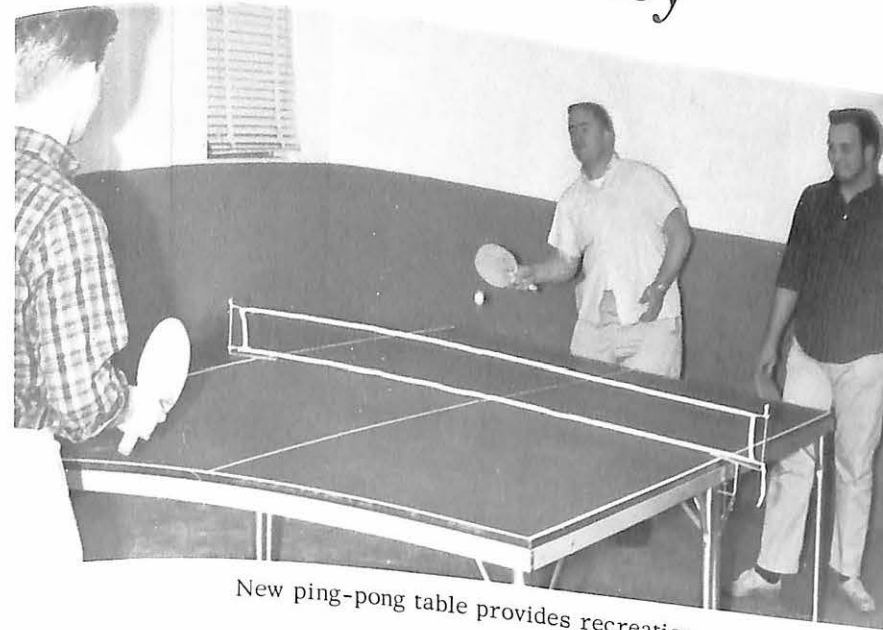

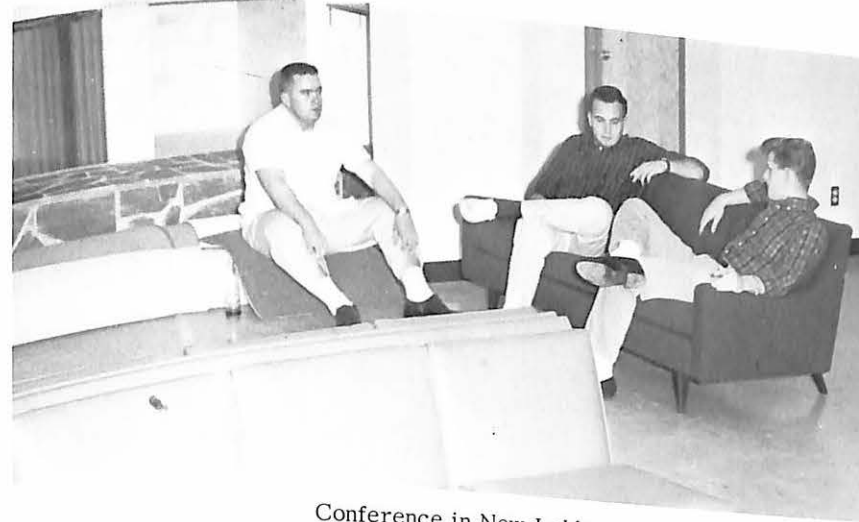

The new men's dormitory at Valley was opened for use at the start of the second semester in February. Approximately 90 new students moved to their new quarters in the school's latest building accomplishment.

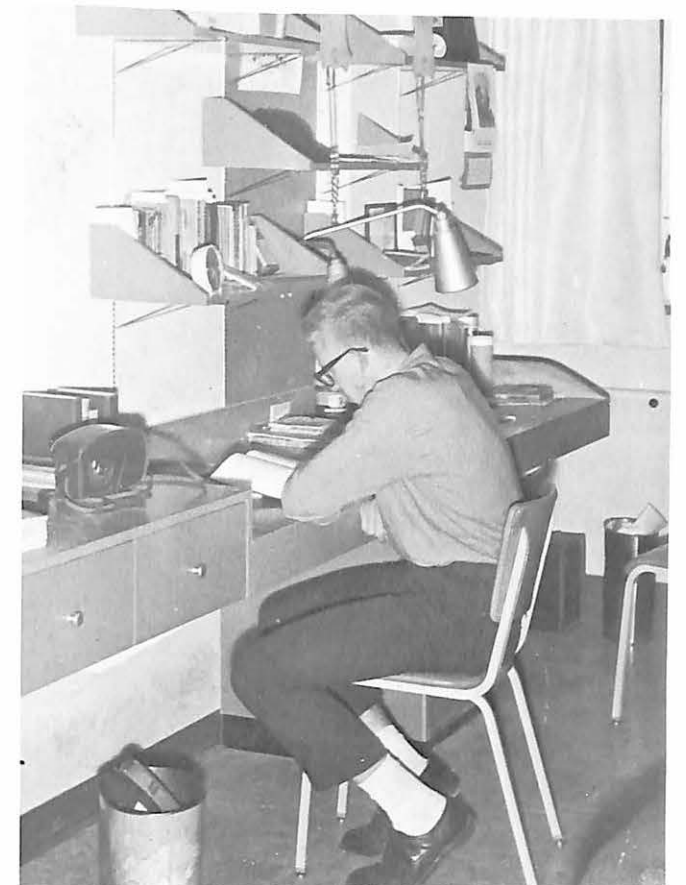

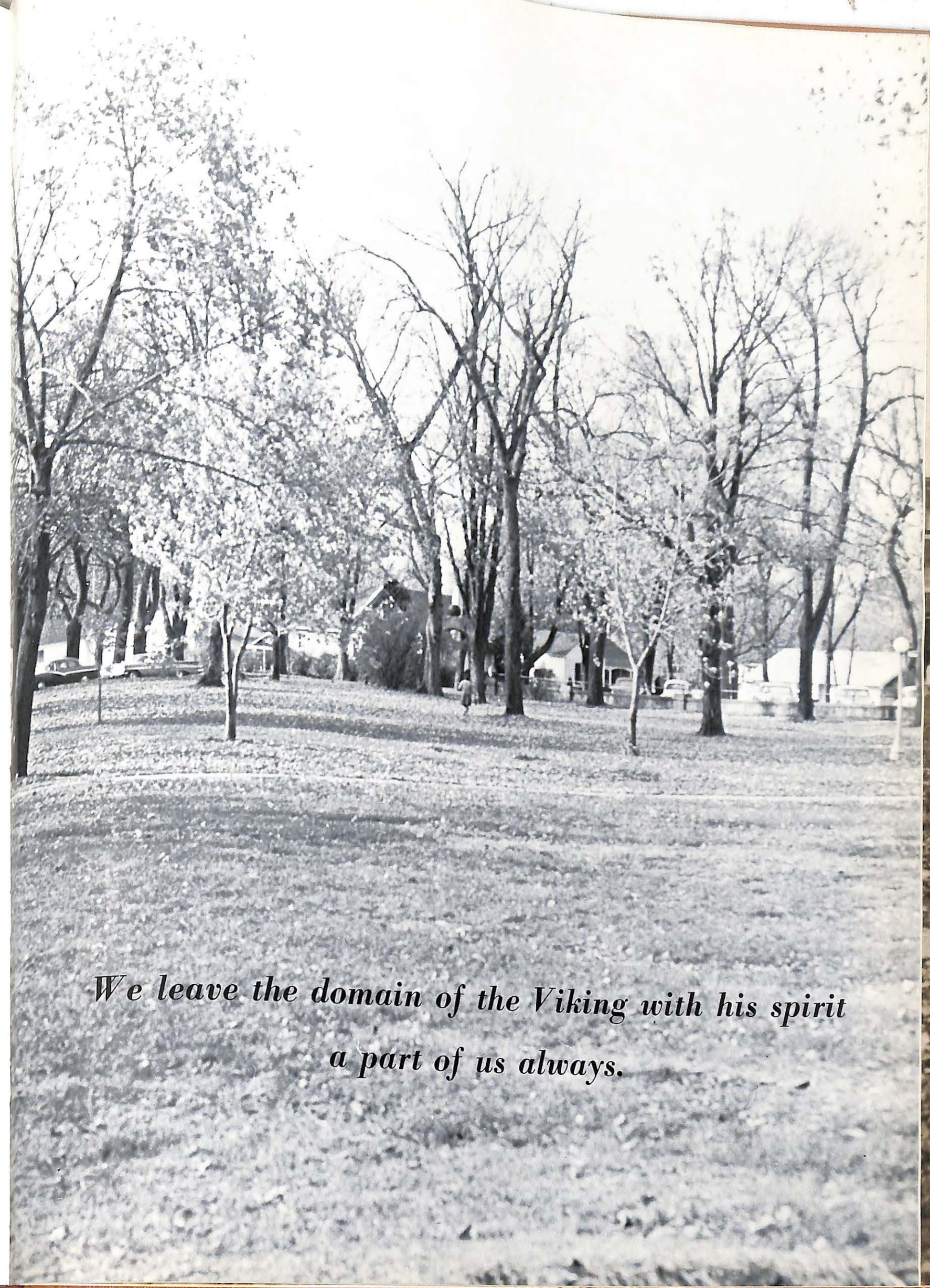
