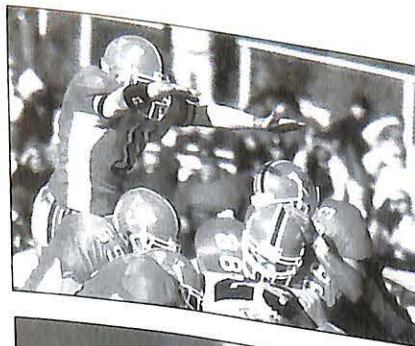
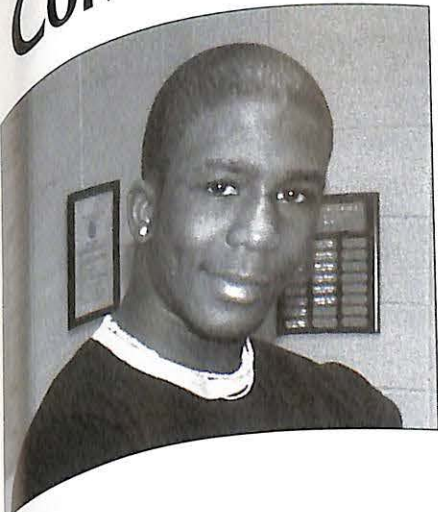

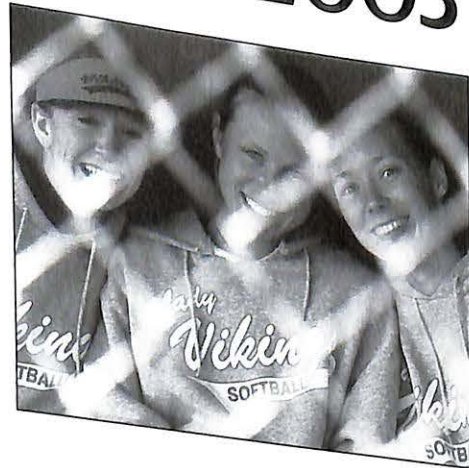

Welcome! Rise to the occasion

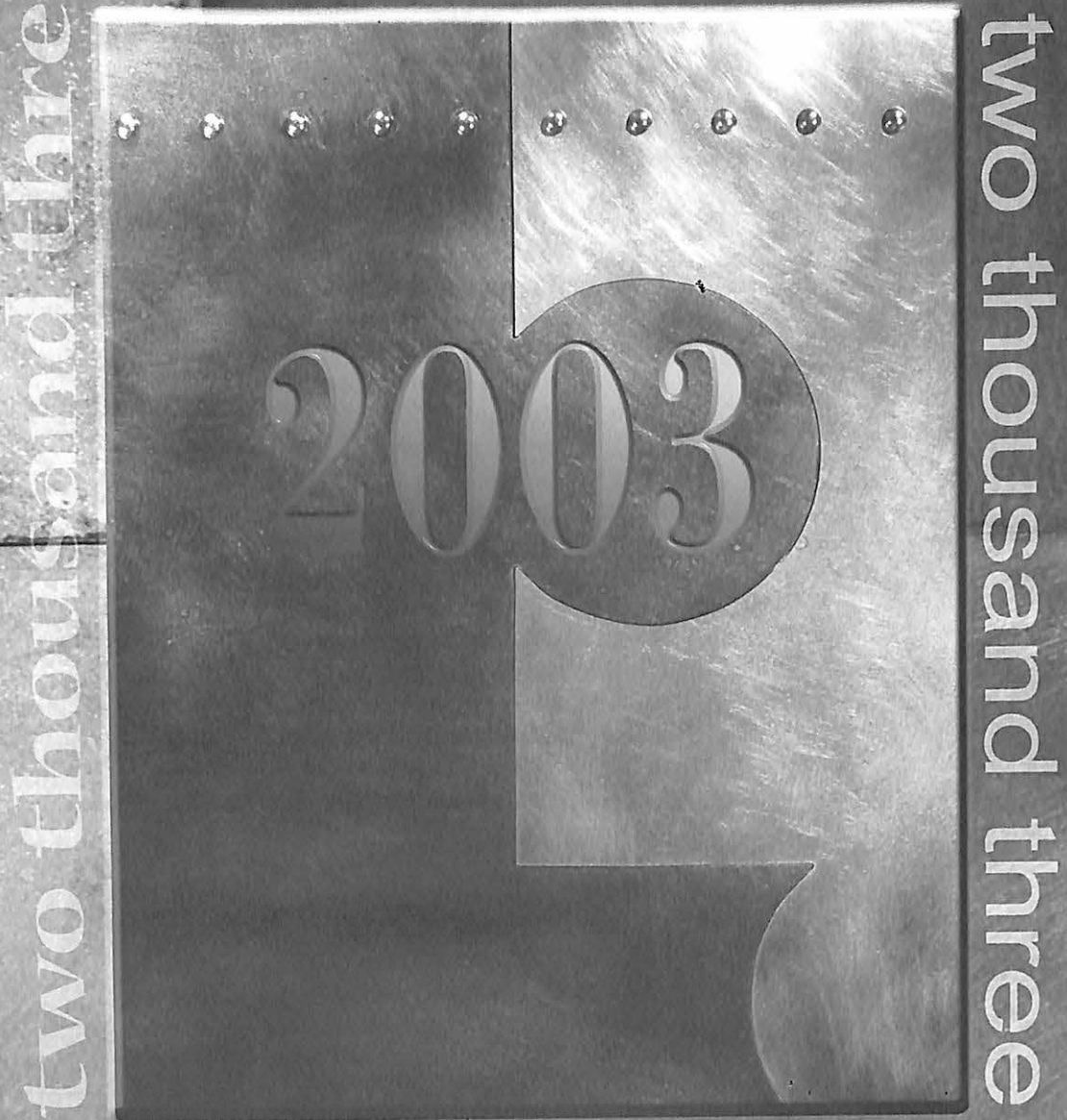
We began the 2002-2003 academic year in style. Improvements were made around every corner. The biggest addition for 2002-2003 was the new Technology Center, a two-story building with new classrooms, a computer lab, and an education library. The Technology Center was built around the Eckilson-Mabee Theatre which received several improvements, including a new state-of-the-art sound system, video equipment, new dressing rooms, seating renovations, and new paint on the walls. A new learning center was constructed on third-floor Baity Hall with the original cross shape of the room restored along with colorful stained-glass windows. This room was staffed with student tutors and overseen by Associate Professor Virginia Zank. There are three new apartment buildings along Redman and Belle Streets, housing 48 students. New sidewalks are everywhere! The west side of the tunnel by Ferguson Center was painted with a beige color to brighten up Ferguson Center. Mack Porter Stables received new pens and a new rodeo office building. The Student Fitness Center behind Mac Hall received a new floor. Changes are happening, so everyone needs to connect and rise to the occasion!

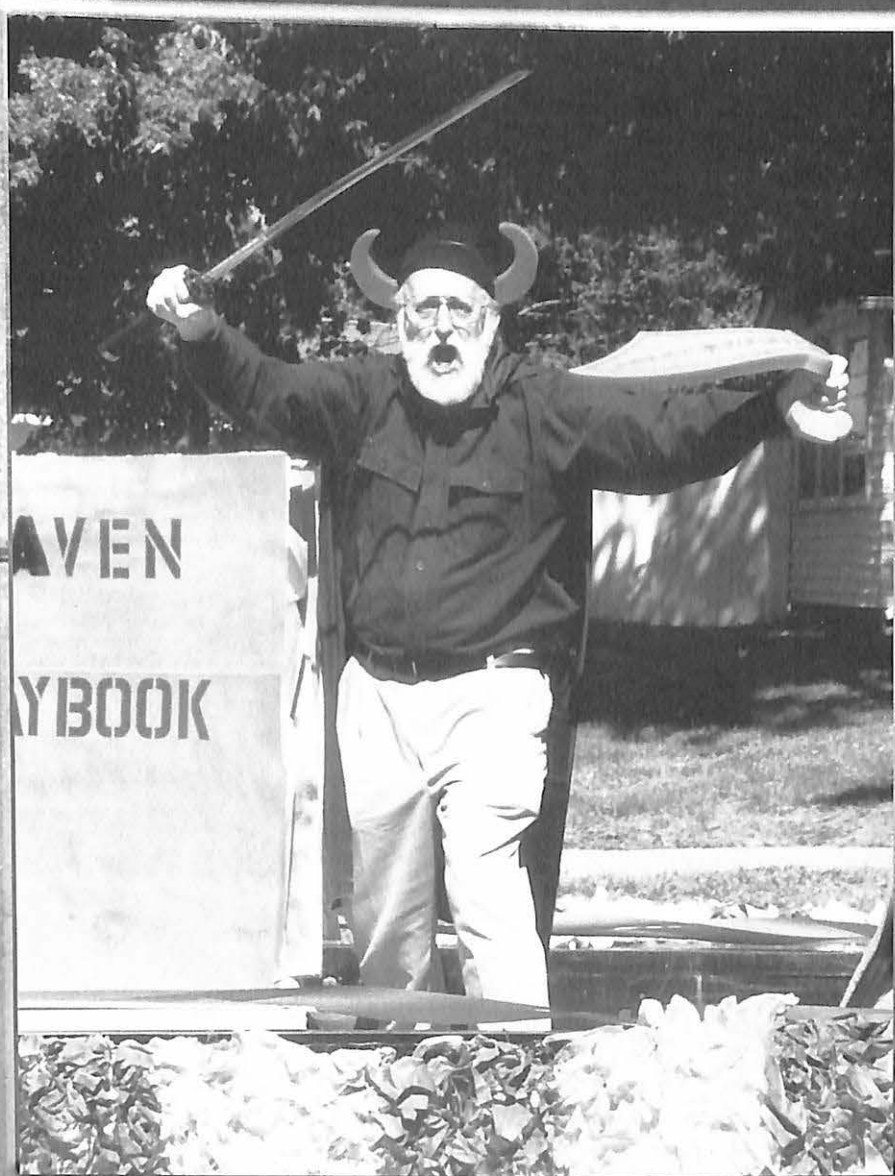

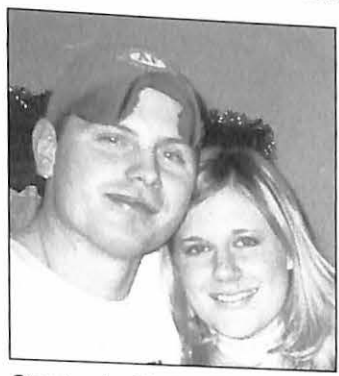

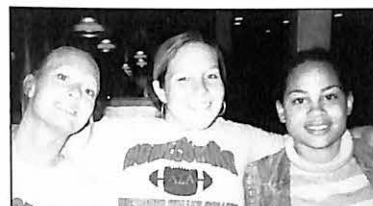

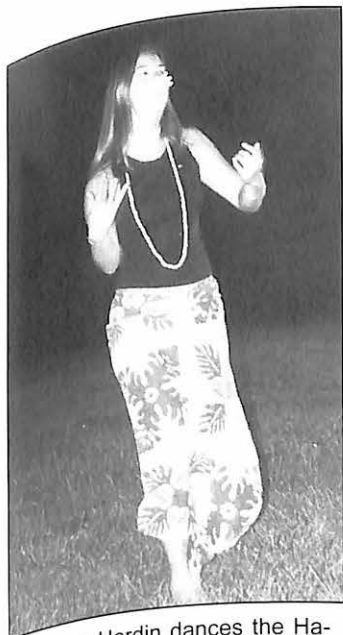

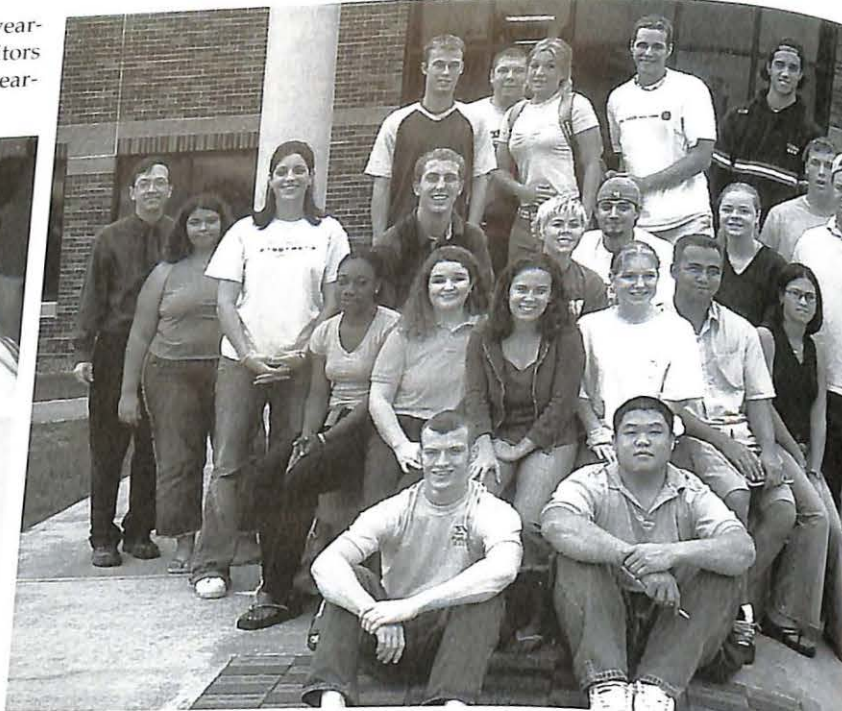

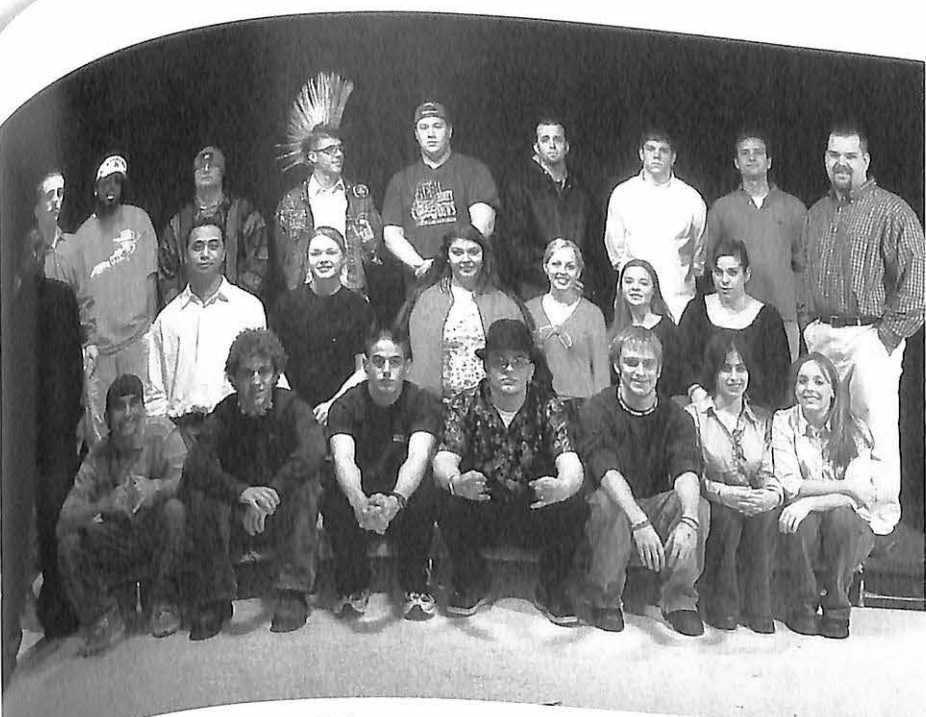

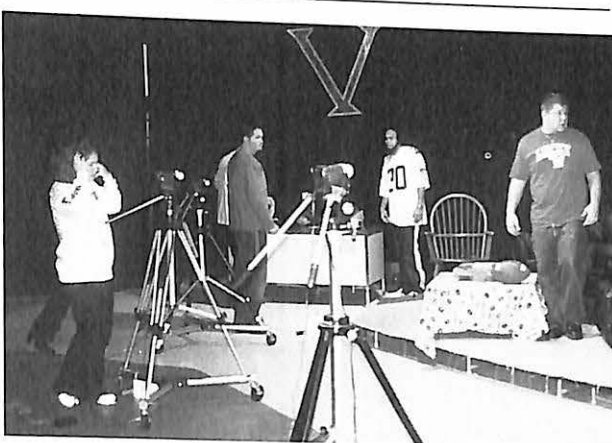

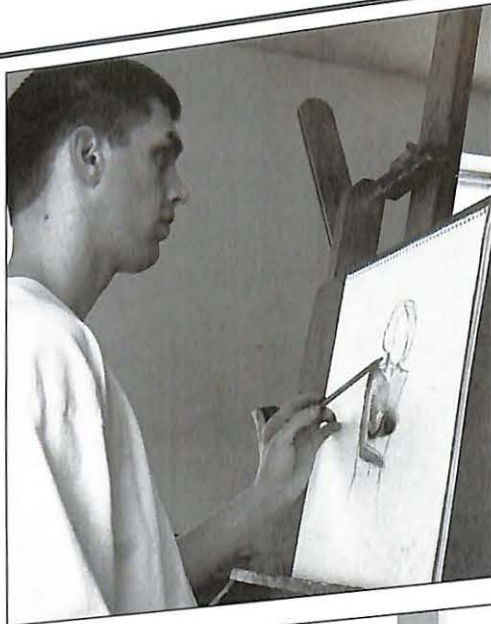

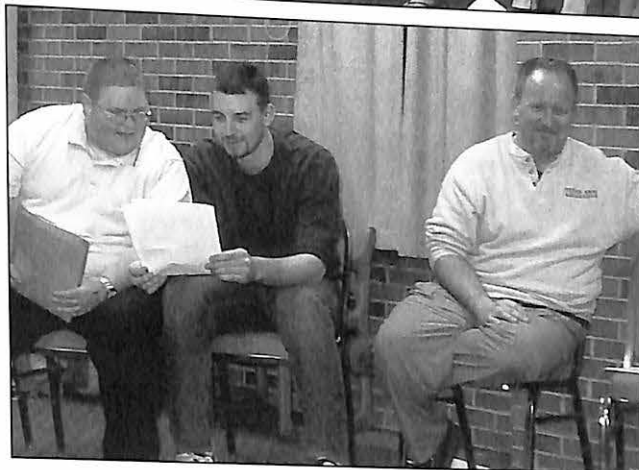

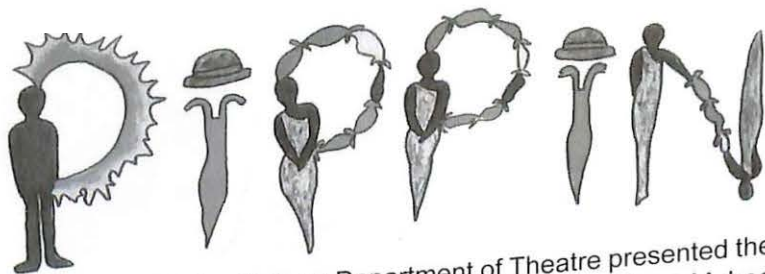

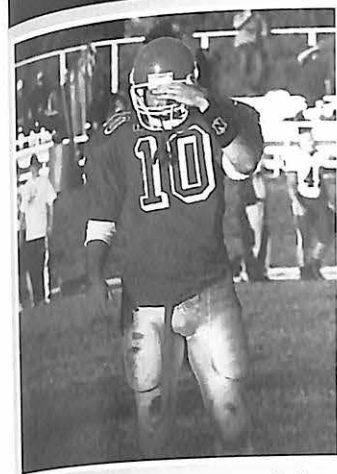

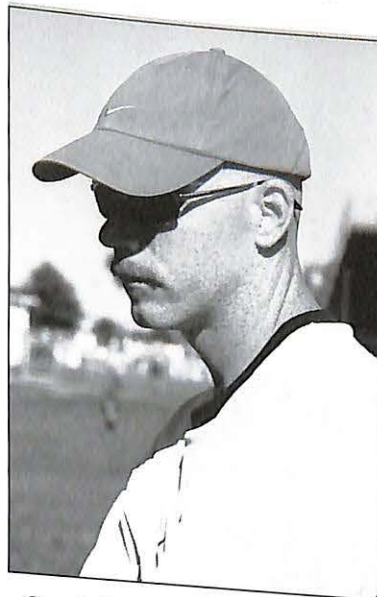

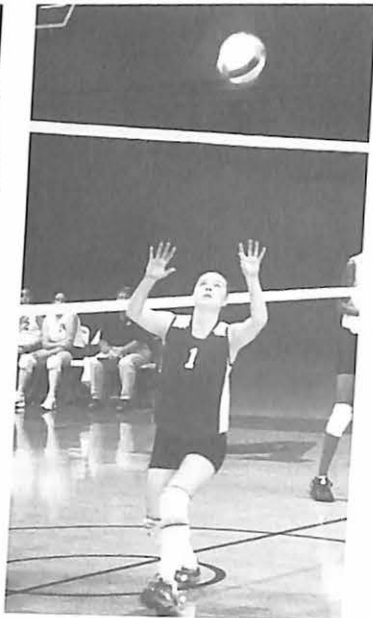

The men's team in 2003 was pre-season ranked at 6th and only had five returning All-Americans. The only people who thought they had a chance to finish in the top three were themselves and their coaching staff, and they proved their point by finishing not only first in their region, but first in the nation as well. Tying the current record for All-Americans in a single year, Mo-Val wrestlers placed 11 of the 12 national team members among the top eight in their weight class. Not only that but they only had one senior, two juniors, and nine under-classmen make up this group which means that they will be returning 10 All-Americans for the 2003-2004 season. So, they consequently have great potential for another run at the national title next year.

In Region V tournament play, the MVC Vikings defeated Benedictine to win the champi-

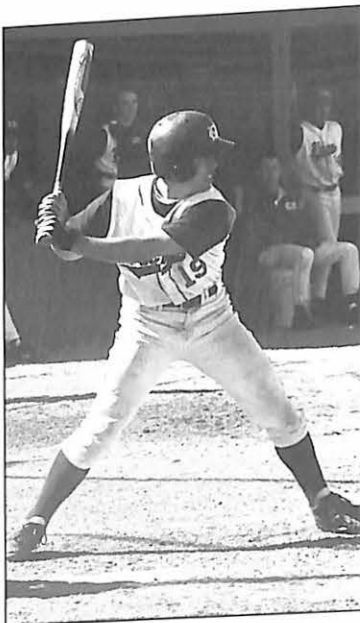

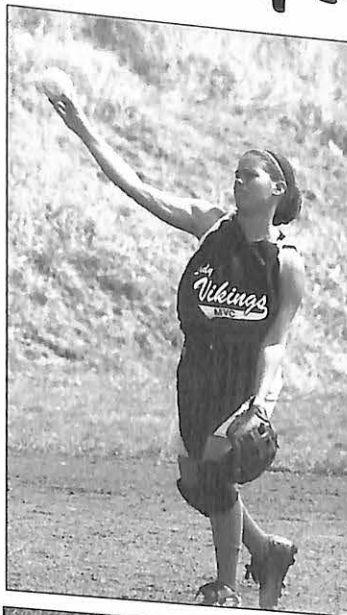

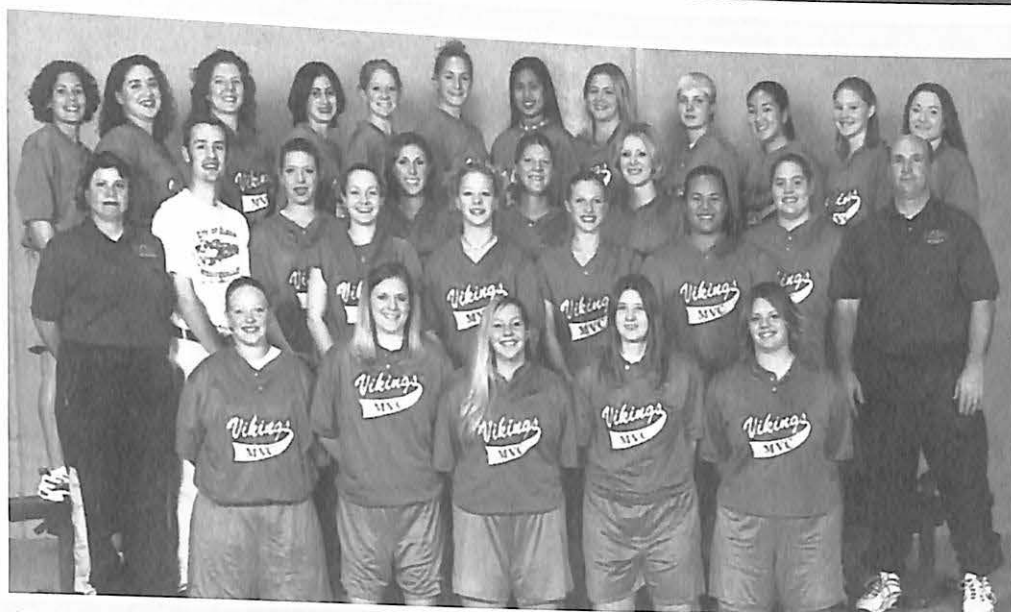

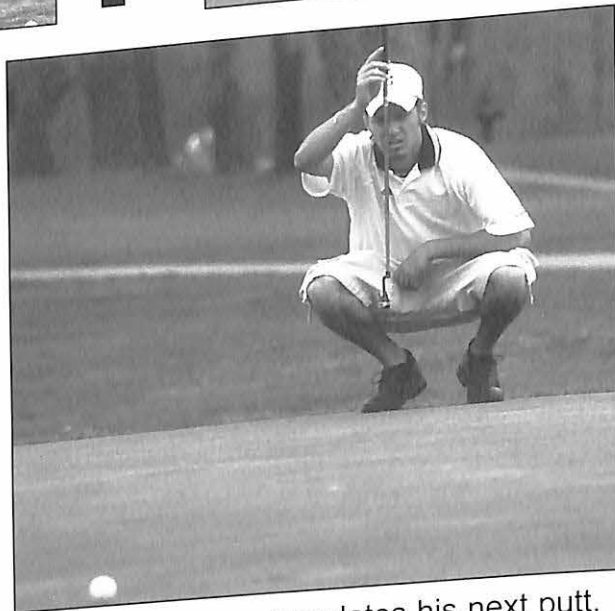

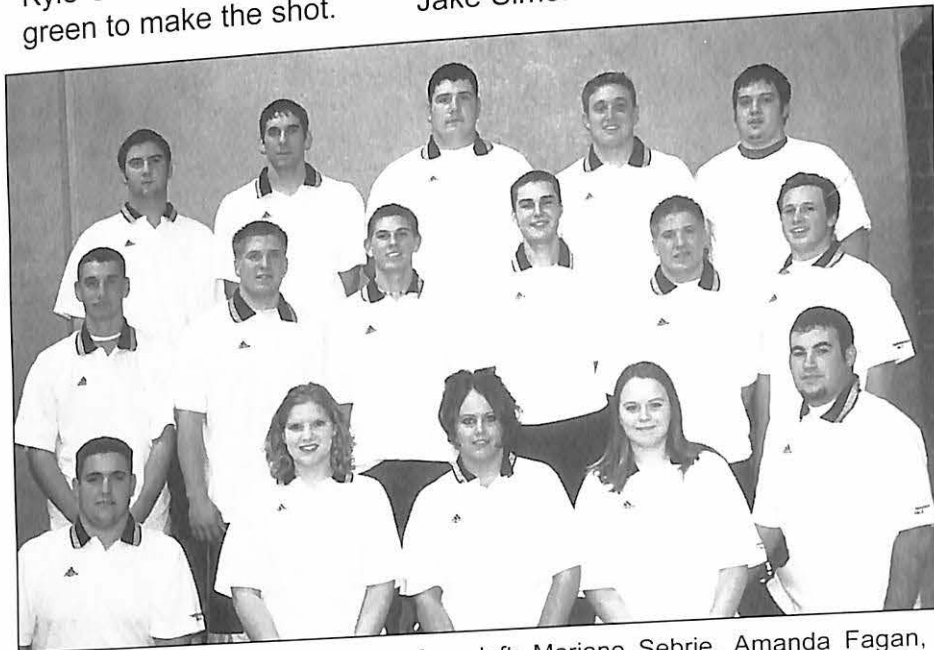

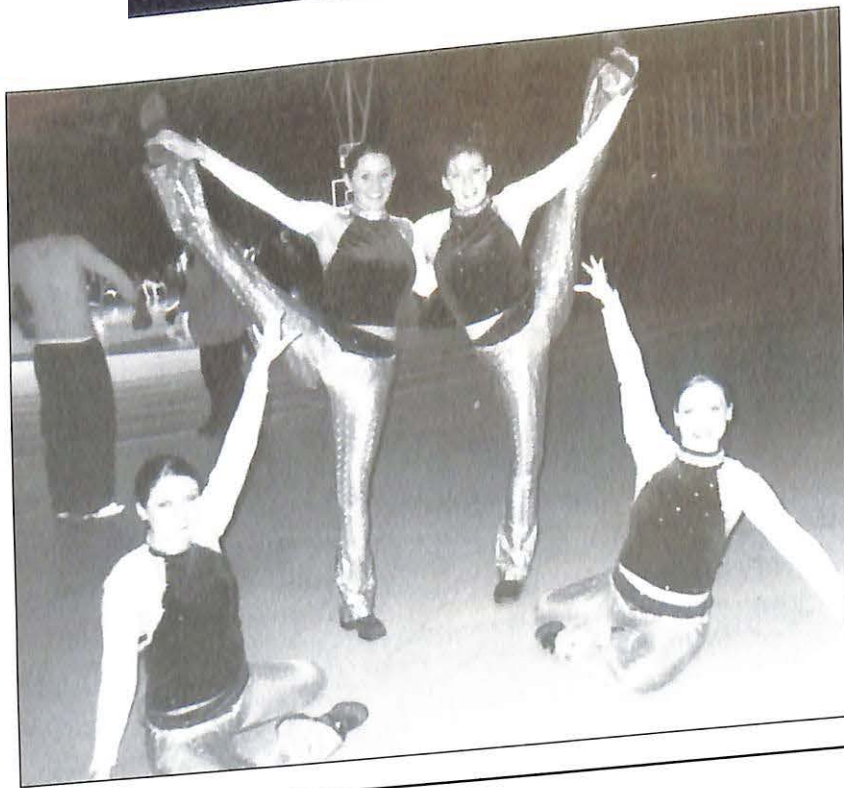

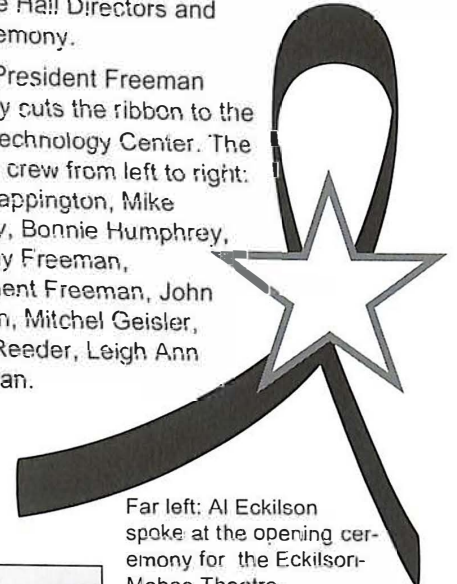

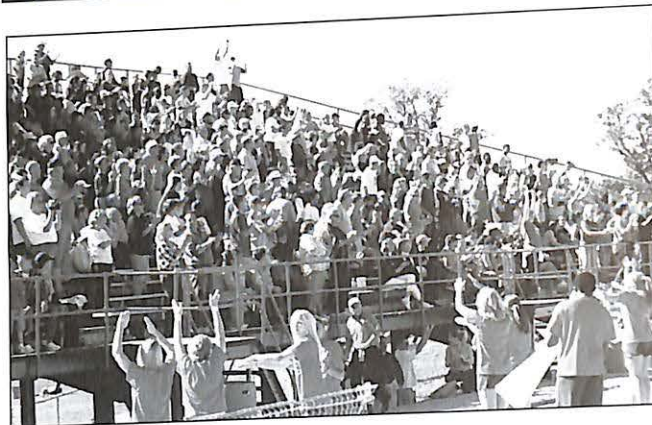

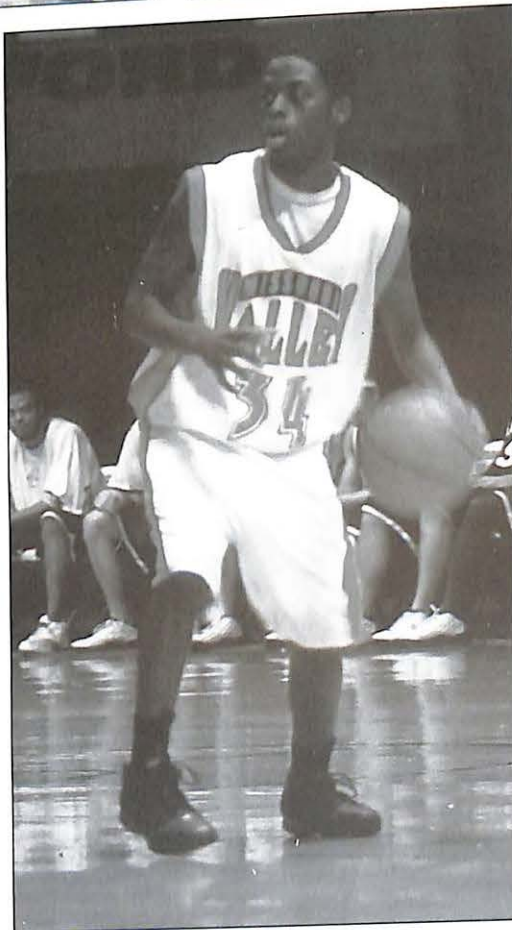

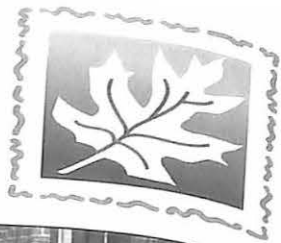

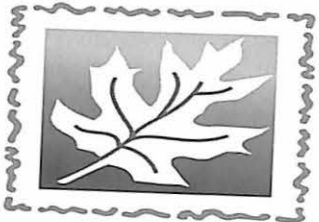

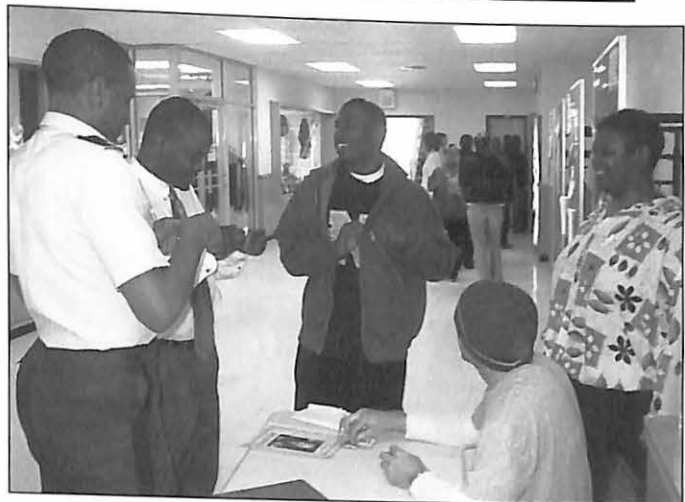

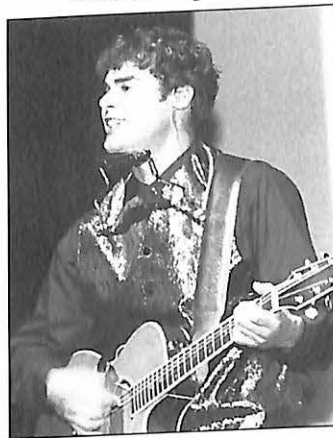

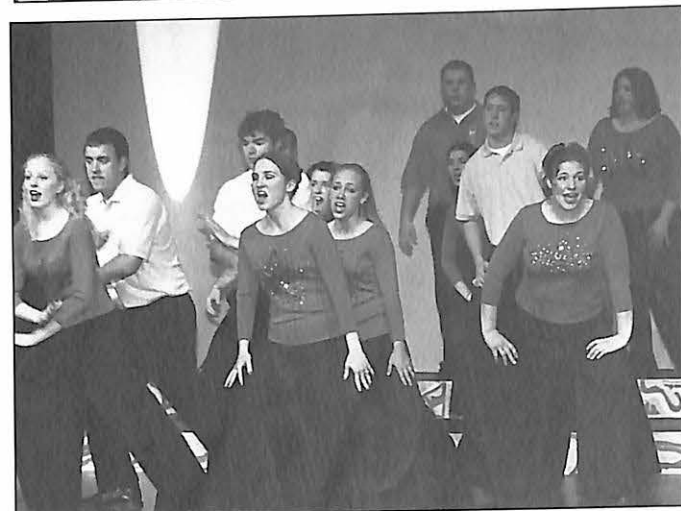
