# 1969 Football

The 1969 football season opened at Fayette, Missouri, against Central Methodist College with Missouri Valley College fielding a young and relatively inexperienced football team. Sophomore Lex Balazik threw two touchdowns passes to newcomer Dan Kratzer, and Herschel Owen kicked the two conversions to make the score MVC 14 and CMC 0. The "Viking" defense did a magnificent job all afternoon of stopping the veteran CMC offensive machine.

The "Big Orange" was anxious to show the home crowd what it could do, and opened before the home stands against College of Emporia in the second game. The defense held C of E to only 6 points while the "Viking offense" was busy scoring 49. Several Vikings got into the scoring act.

The following week MVC made the trip to Rolla, leaving Lex Balazik, Sam Kornhauser, Greg Wallace, and Alan Theofilis at home because of illness or injuries. The game was hard fought, and with 1:52 left in the game Rolla led with Rolla 33 and MVC 14.

Valley's third victory was very costly, as Mel Willard and Fred Clinch were both lost for the remainder of the season. Fred broke his ankle in the second quarter and Mel, who plays linebacker right behind Fred, severely injured his knee.

Valley's next opponent was Tarkio, and the loss of Mel and Fred was severely felt in that rain-soaked game as Valley was not able to stop Tarkio off-tackle, and wound up losing 6-22.

The trip to Nebraska proved to be one of frustration from the outset as the Viking bus broke down enroute to Lincoln, and the team continued by chartered Greyhound. The game was a tough one to lose as the Vikings fought hard and were ahead in the fourth quarter only to have several untimely penalties aid Nebraska to the score, and with 36 seconds on the clock to score a winning T.D. from 24 yards out and the final score was MVC 19 — Nebraska 26.

Valley met University of Illinois of Chicago Circle for the homecoming game, and it proved to be very exciting for the spectators. The Vikings started the scoring by Lex Balazik throwing to Dan Kratzer for a 55-yard touchdown on the first play of the game. There were several long runs and long passes throughout the game, and the Vikings had to come from behind three times to win the game 28-24.

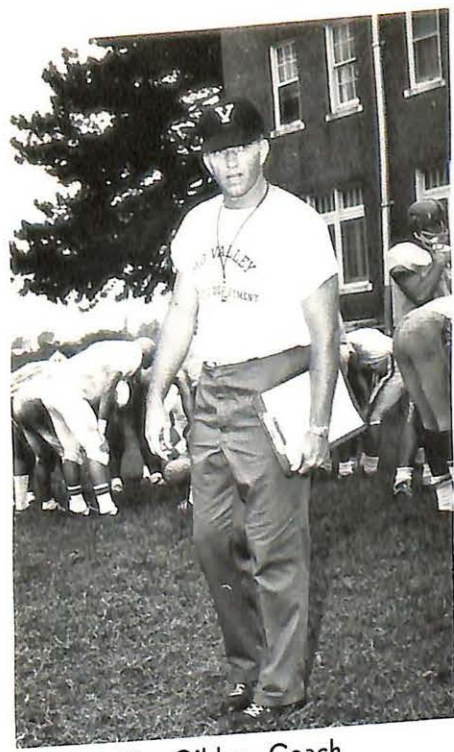
The next game was with Missouri Southern, and Valley was behind 24-0 early in the third quarter, and under the direction of freshman quarterback Eric Norman was able to generate enough offense to score 20 points, but still lost by a score of 24-20. Lex Balazik, John Morris, Greg Wallace, Bill Schuchardt, and Tom Thomas did not make the trip because of illness and injuries.

Our final home game was with Graceland College, and the Vikings were behind 17-7 when Lex Balazik, still hampered by an ankle injury, came off the bench late in the third quarter and directed the Vikings to two touchdowns and the game ended with Valley winning 22-17 and on Graceland's 15-yard line ready to score again.

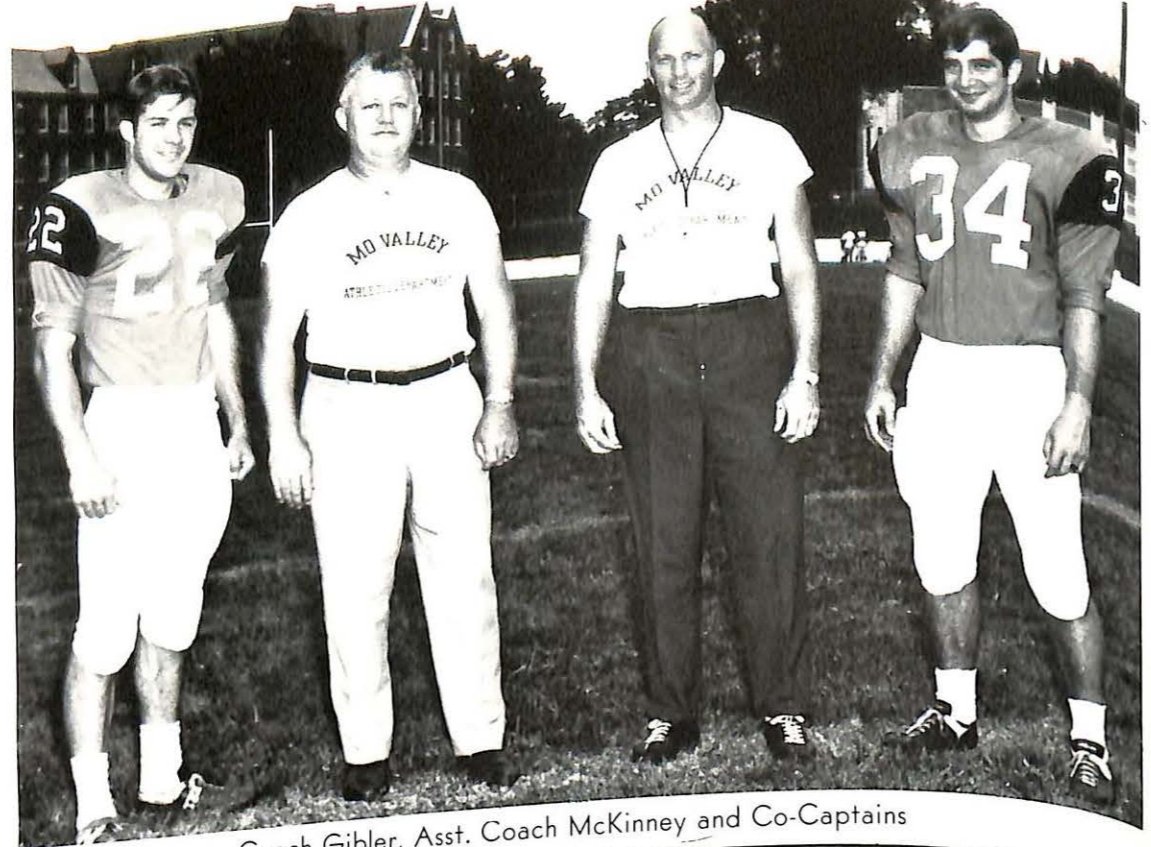
The final game of the season was with Valley's traditional rival, William Jewell, who had a highly successful veteran team. The Vikings started seven freshmen on defense and six on offense. William Jewell won the game 15 to 7.

The 1969 season was an exciting one. The Vikings averaged 20.8 points per game, but allowed their opponents 17.4 points per game.

The squad voted junior Kile Guthrey as the outstanding football player. Freshman Phil Willard was voted the most valuable defensive back, Tony Chandler the most valuable offensive back, junior Sam Kornhauser the most valuable offensive lineman, and Kile Guthrey the most valuable defensive lineman.

# Viking Wrestlers

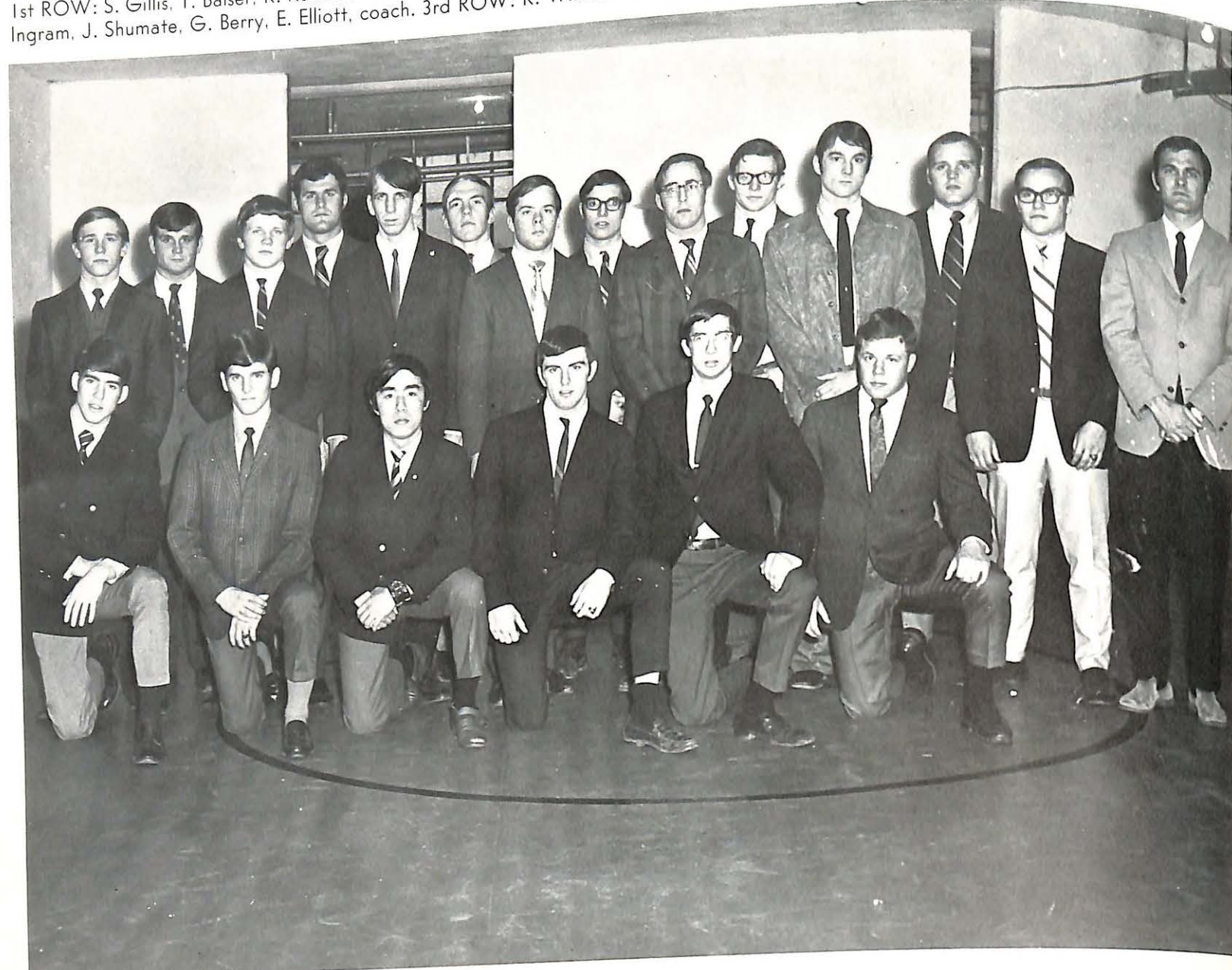

# 1970 Track

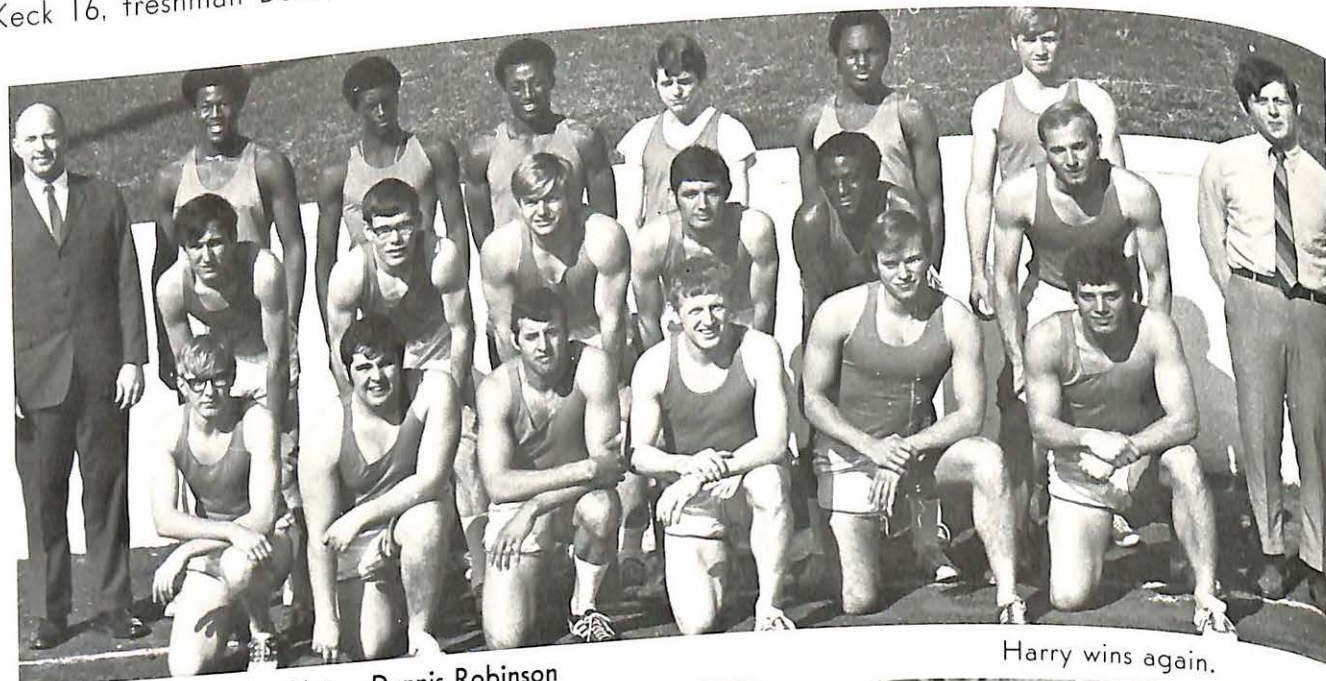
The 1970 track team realized a highly successful season, competing against 31 teams in conference, invitational, triangular, and dual meets. The Vikings competed against some teams more than once, and were unsuccessful in competition with only four opponents.

The Vikings were runners-up to Graceland in the conference indoor meet, runners-up to Rolla in the Principia invitational, second in a triangular with Baker and William Penn, and lost one dual meet to Rolla.

The Vikings were victorious in a triangular with Central Methodist and Evangel, in dual meets with William Jewell, Washington University, and Southwest Baptist. The climax of a highly successful season was when the Vikings won the Conference Outdoor Track and Field championship, the first for Missouri Valley since 1960.

Dennis Robinson, a sophomore from St. Louis, was the high-point winner for the Vikings with 104 $\frac{3}{4}$  points and was voted by his teammates as the outstanding track athlete for the Vikings. 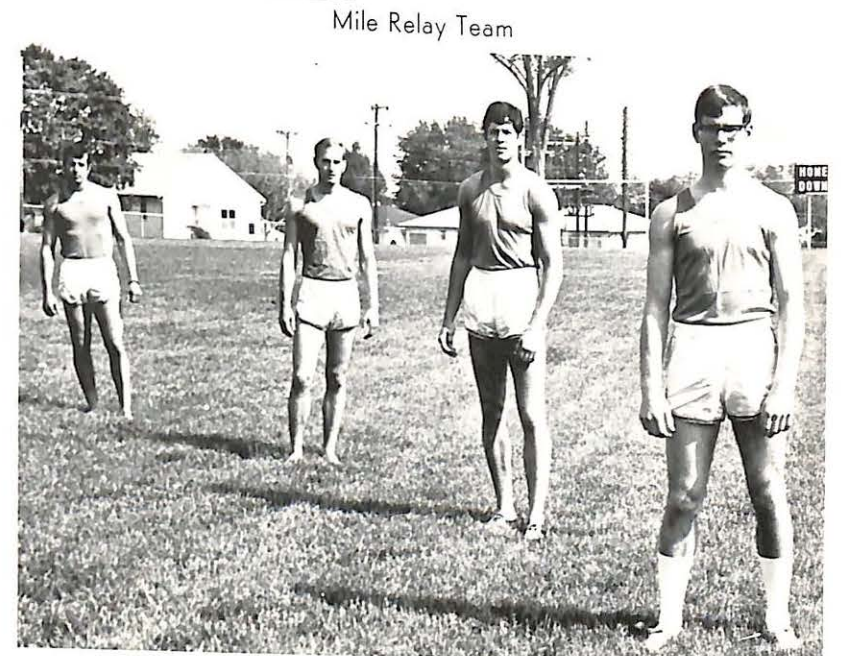

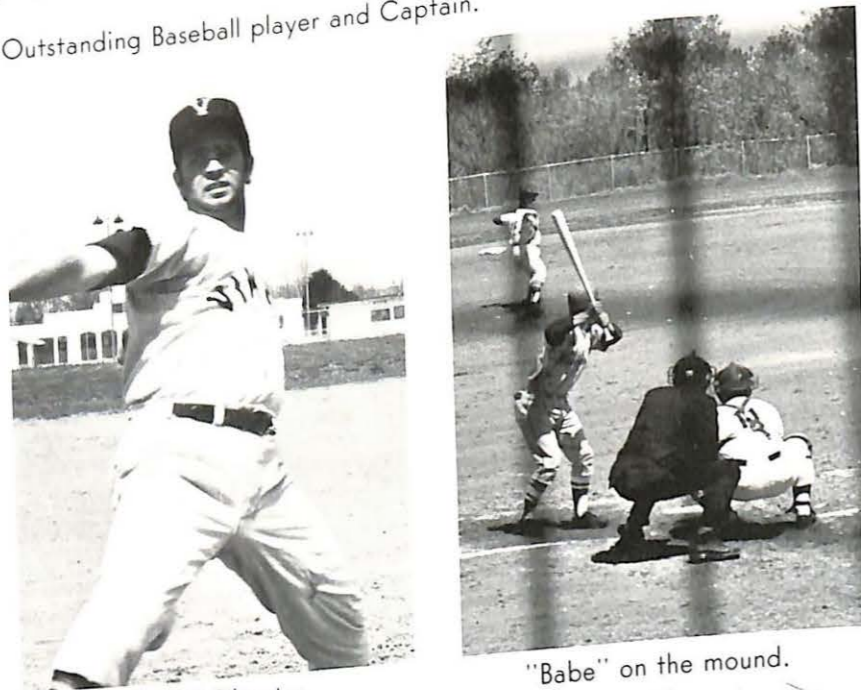
# 1970 Baseball

The Vikings won 17 games and lost 6; probably had the best won and lost record of any team in the state. William Jewell finished first in the conference with the record of 11 games won and 1 lost. Missouri Valley finished second with a record of 8 games won and 2 lost. The Vikings had to win two games from William Jewell College in order to win the championship. The last one game to William Jewell 3-2 in 12 innings, and won the other game 3-2 in 10 innings. The leading pitcher for the Vikings was Captain Babe Silvestro, who won 4 games and lost 0. Eric Norman, a freshman right-hander, won 4 games and lost 2. Marty Riggs, freshman right-hander, won 2 and lost 2. 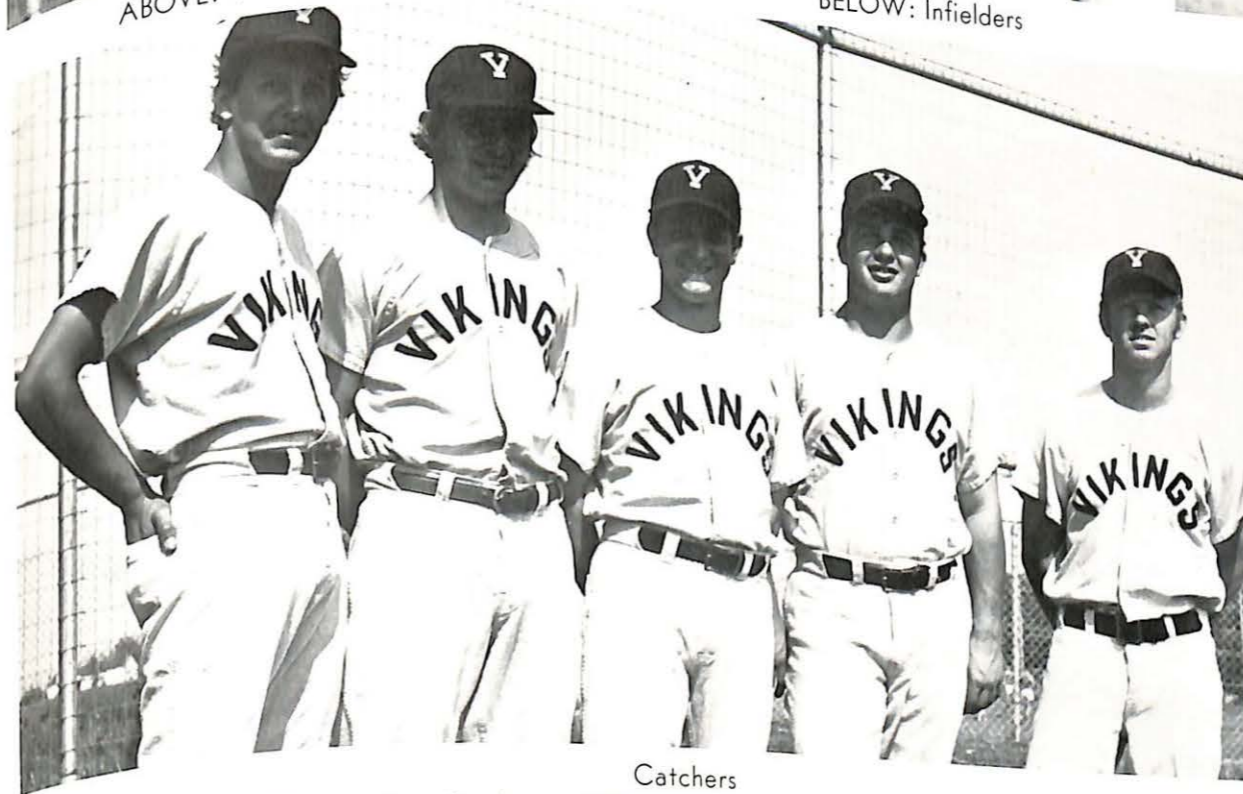

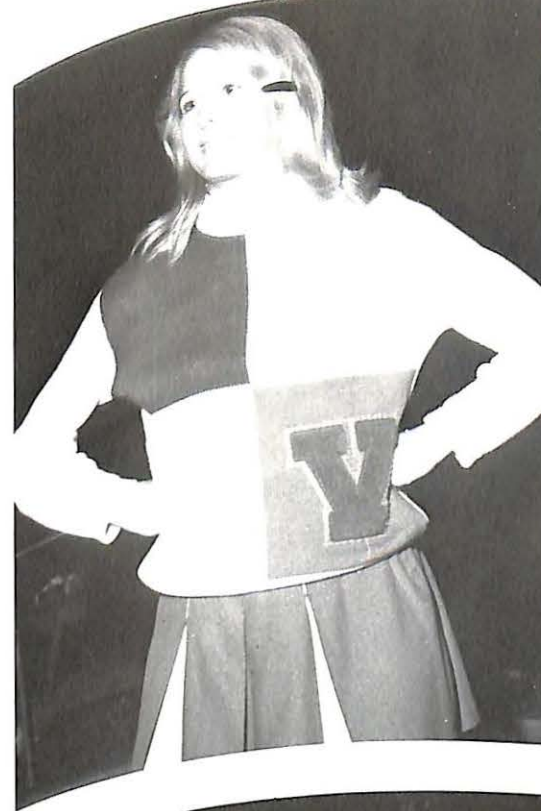
# 1969-70 Vikettes
