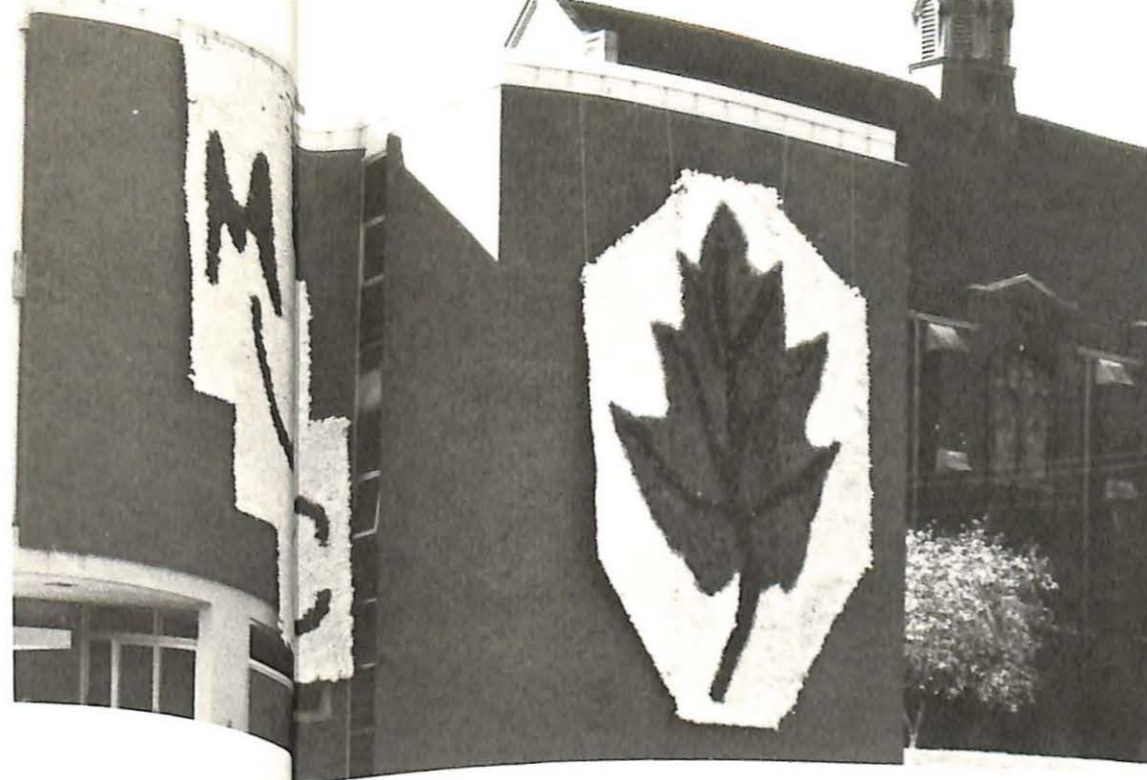

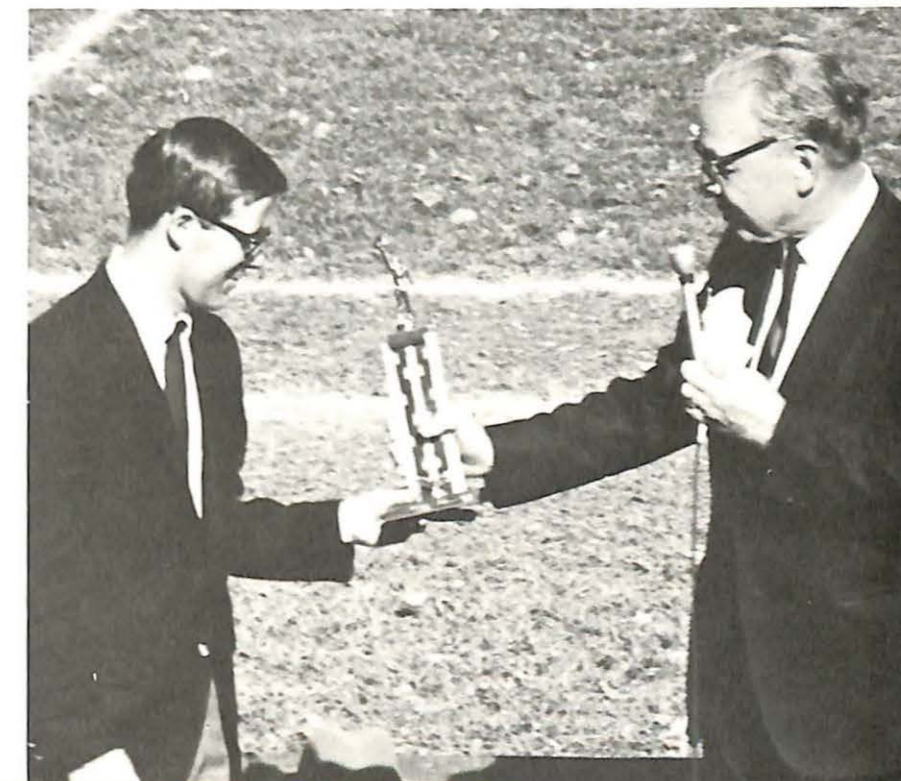

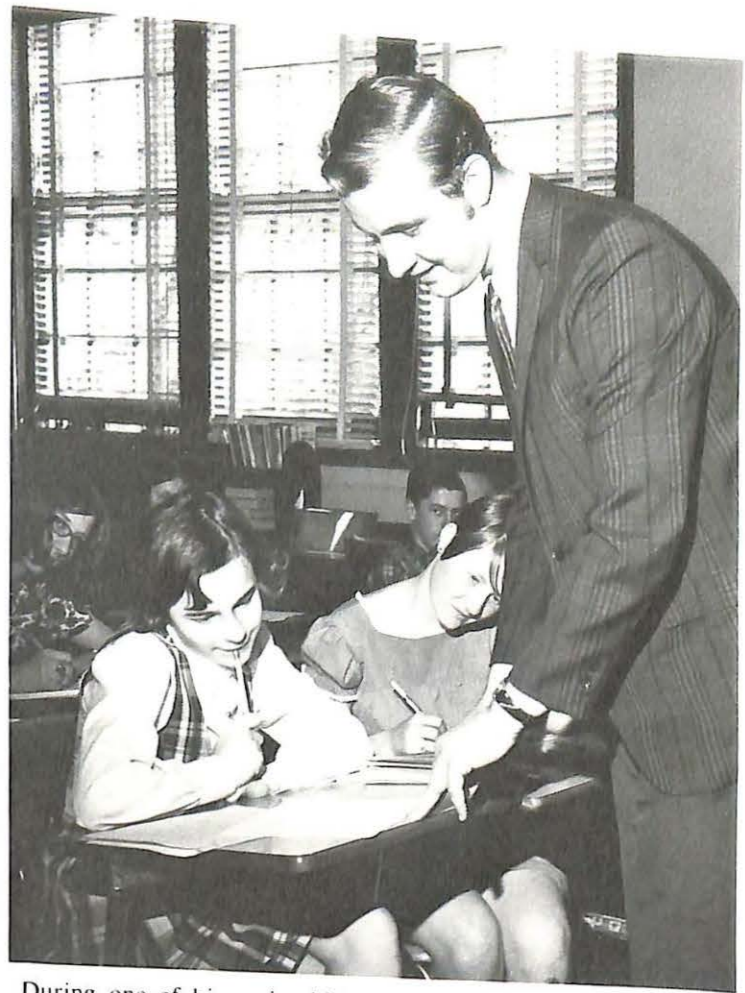

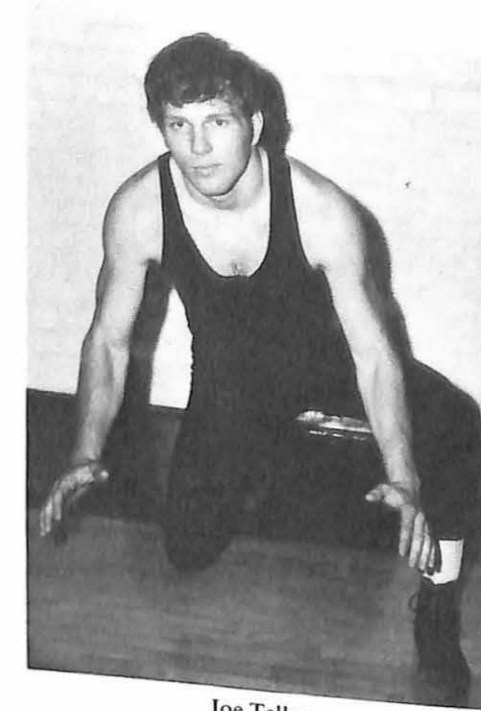


## VIKES HAVE WINNING SEASON

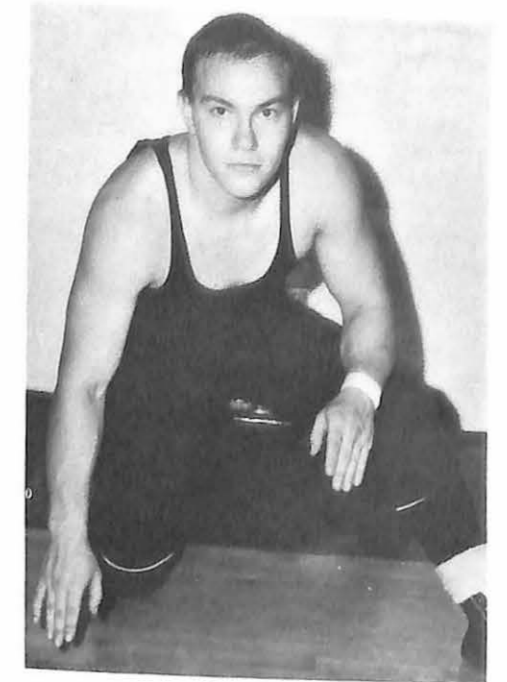

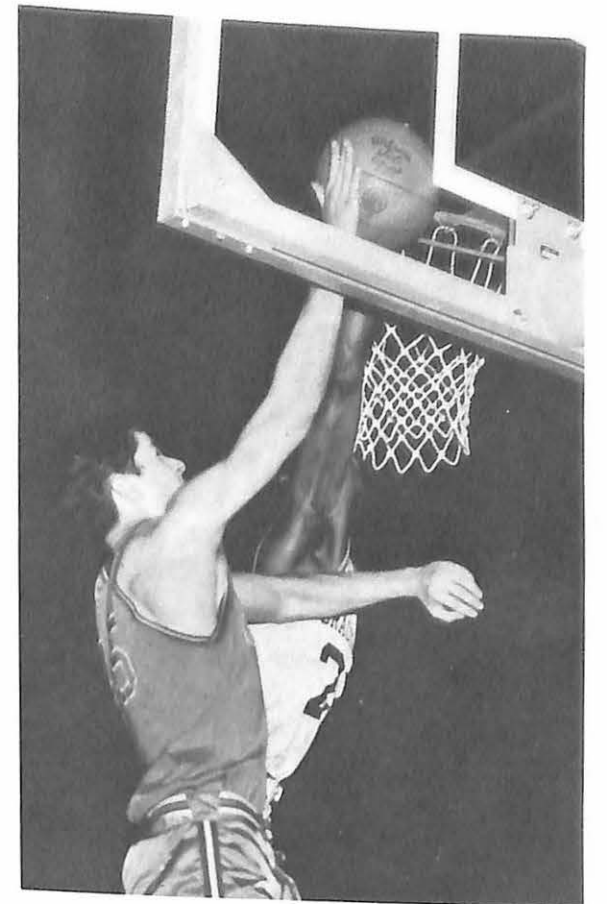
## VARSITY BASKETBALL

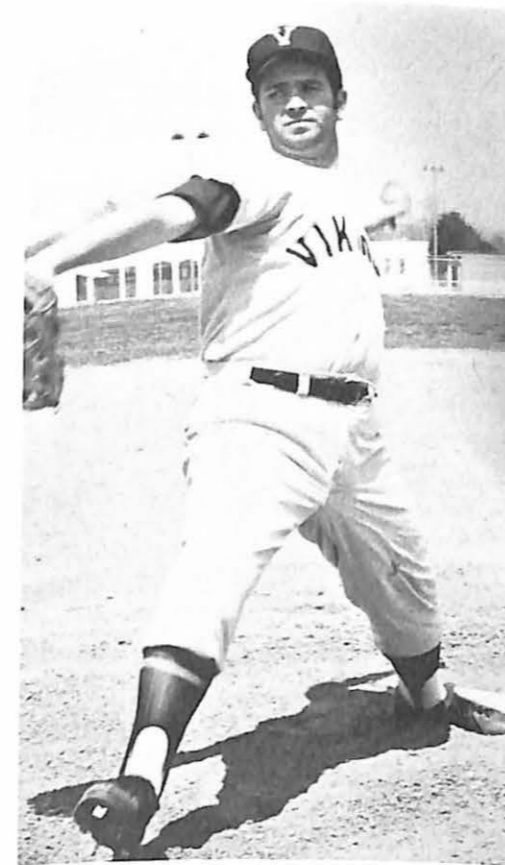


## 1969 VARSITY BASEBALL SQUAD

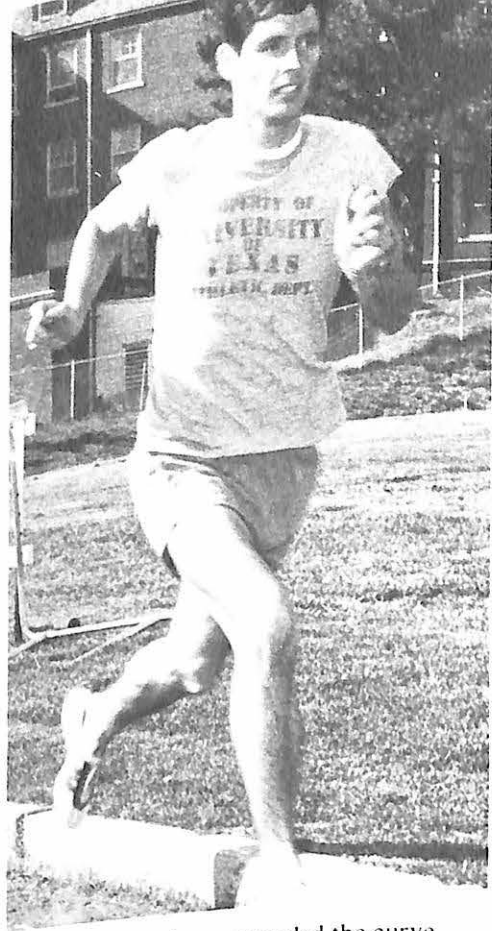

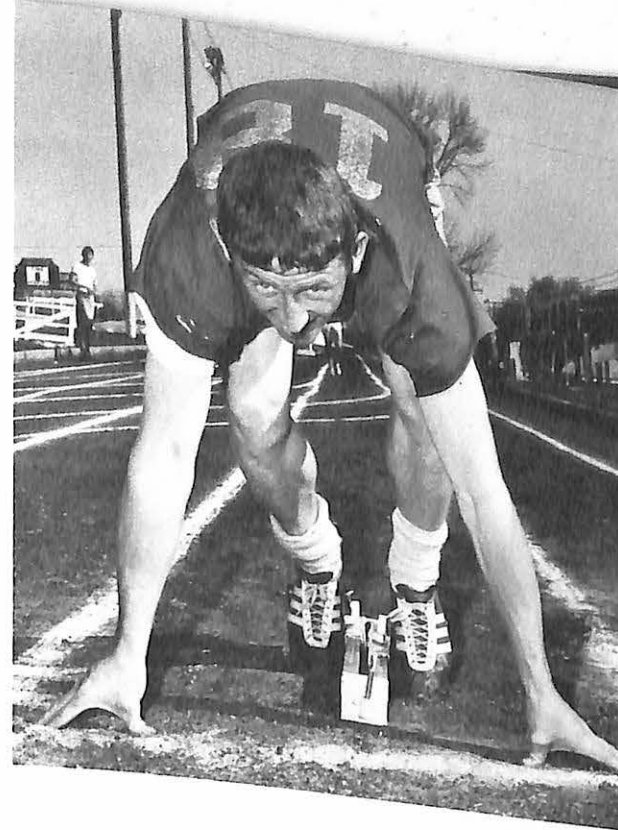

## A Hope for M.C.A.U. Champs

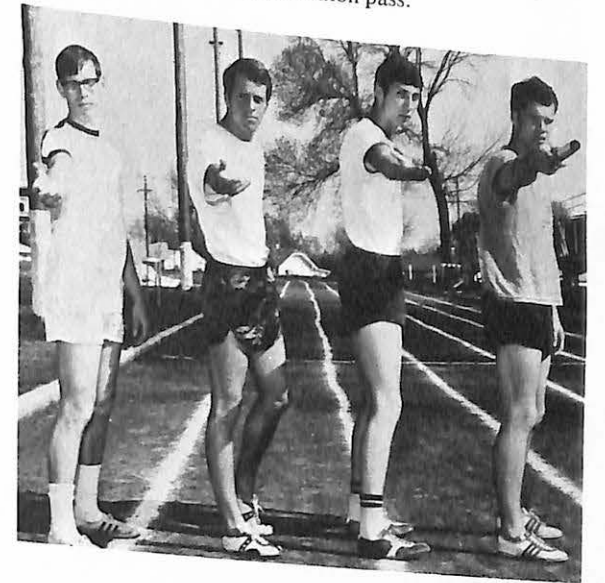
