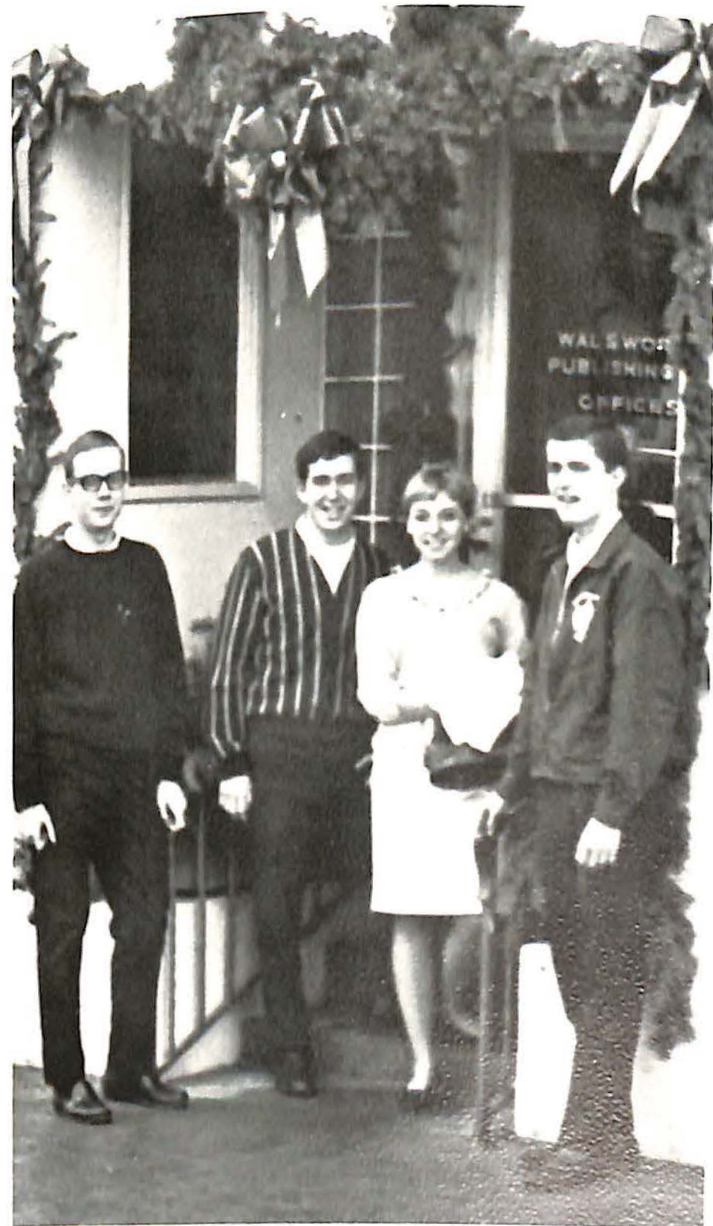

Administration and Faculty



M. Earle Collins, Ph.D. President

Dr. Collins was born in Cedarville, Ohio; received the Bachelor of Arts degree with cum laude distinction from Cedarville College in 1923; the Master of Arts degree from Ohio State University in 1930; the Doctor of Philosophy degree from the same university in 1933; and the honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Cedarville College in 1948.

He was superintendent of schools in Green County, Ohio, from 1923 to 1925; professor at Assiut College in Egypt from 1925 to 1931; and was president of Tarkio College from 1932 until January, 1951, when he became president of Missouri Valley College.

He is a Phi Beta Kappa, a member of Phi Delta Kappa, and has long been active in the United Presbyterian Church, U. S. A., Rotary, Chamber of Commerce, Boy Scouts of America, Missouri College Union, Missouri College Joint Fund Committee, and the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics.

Dr. Collins is presently fulfilling his position at Missouri Valley College through varied lectures and campaigns throughout the United States. This is being done so that the name-- Missouri Valley College, and what it means can be brought more predominantly before the public.

College Administrators

Thomas H. Johns, Ed.D. Executive Vice President

The Missouri Valley College Board of Trustees authorized the addition of an Executive Vice President to the administrative staff at its May 28 meeting, and Dr. Thomas H. Johns was selected for this position.

Dr. Johns came to Missouri Valley College September 1, 1965, from the University of Dubuque where he had been vice president in charge of planning and development for five years. From 1957 through 1961 he served as chaplain, dean of men, and assistant football coach at Hanover College.

He is a native of Kalamazoo, Michigan, but spent most of his early years in Indianapolis, Indiana.

He graduated from Hanover College in 1953. He attended the Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary and was ordained to the ministry of the United Presbyterian Church, U. S. A., in 1956. In 1960 he received the Master of Science degree from Indiana University and the following year received the Doctor of Education degree from the same university.

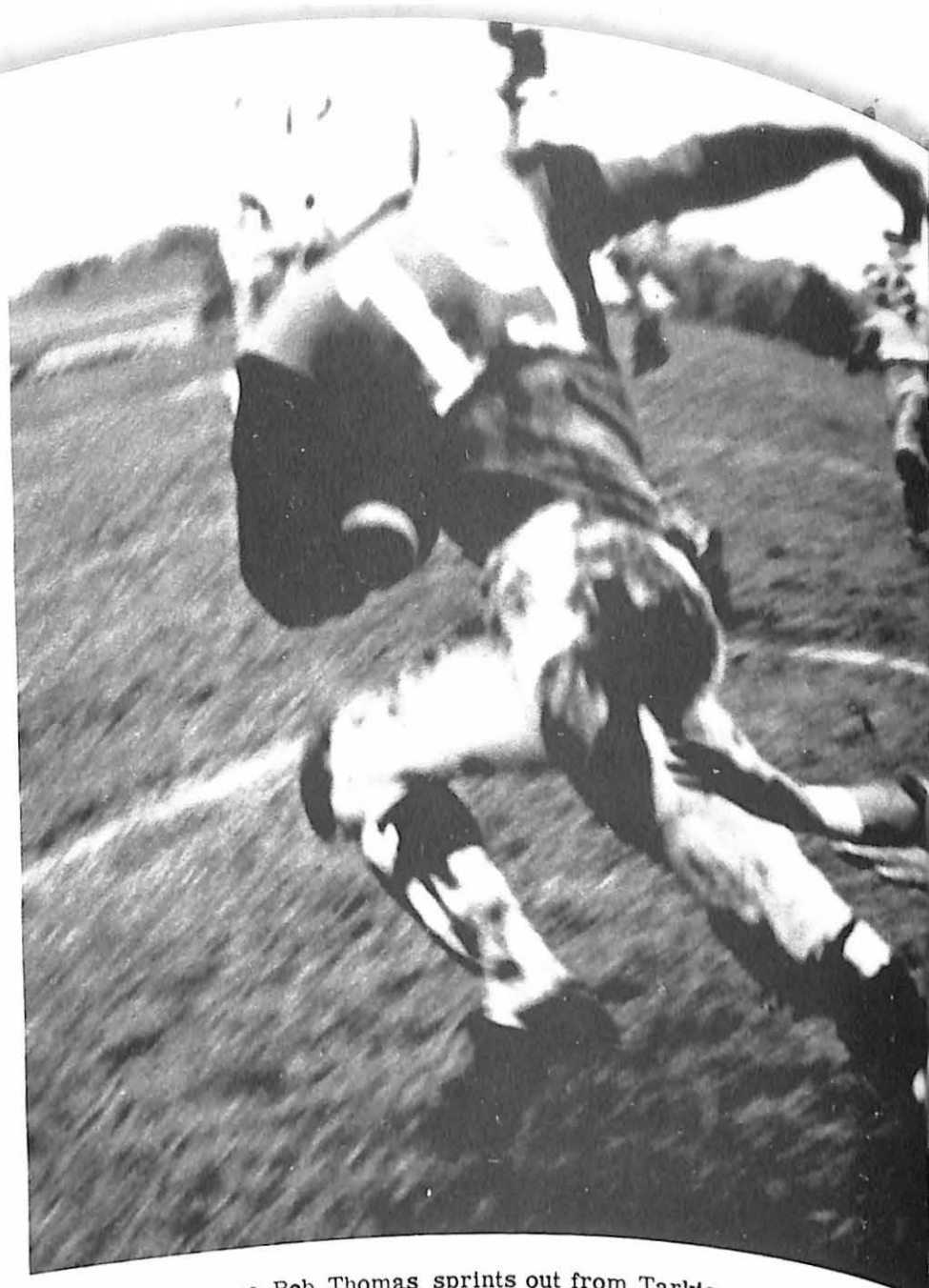

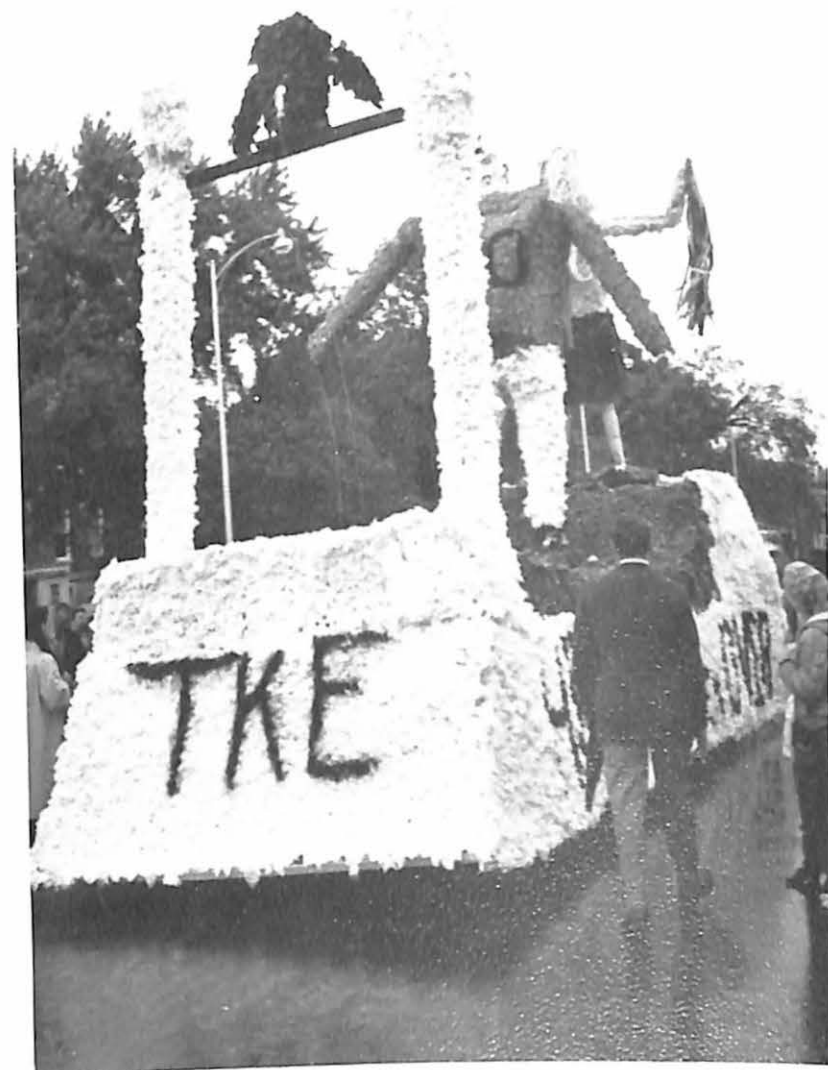

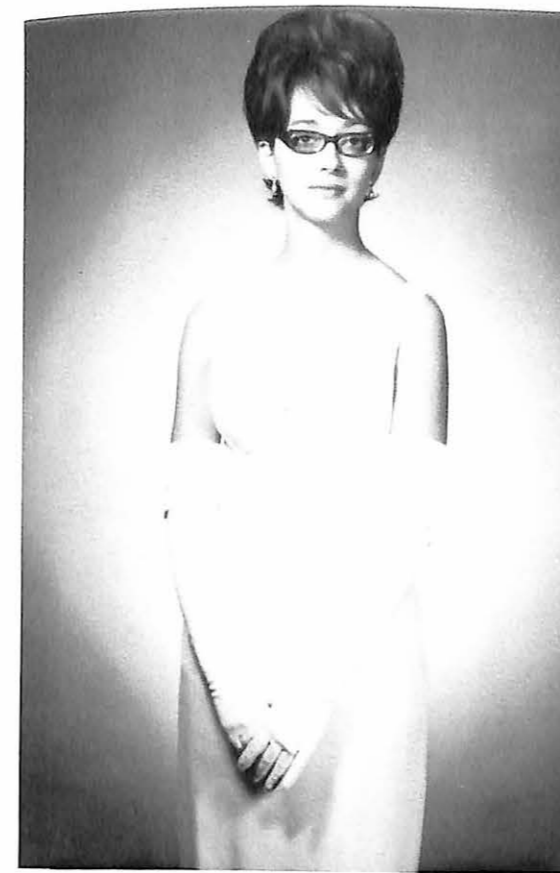

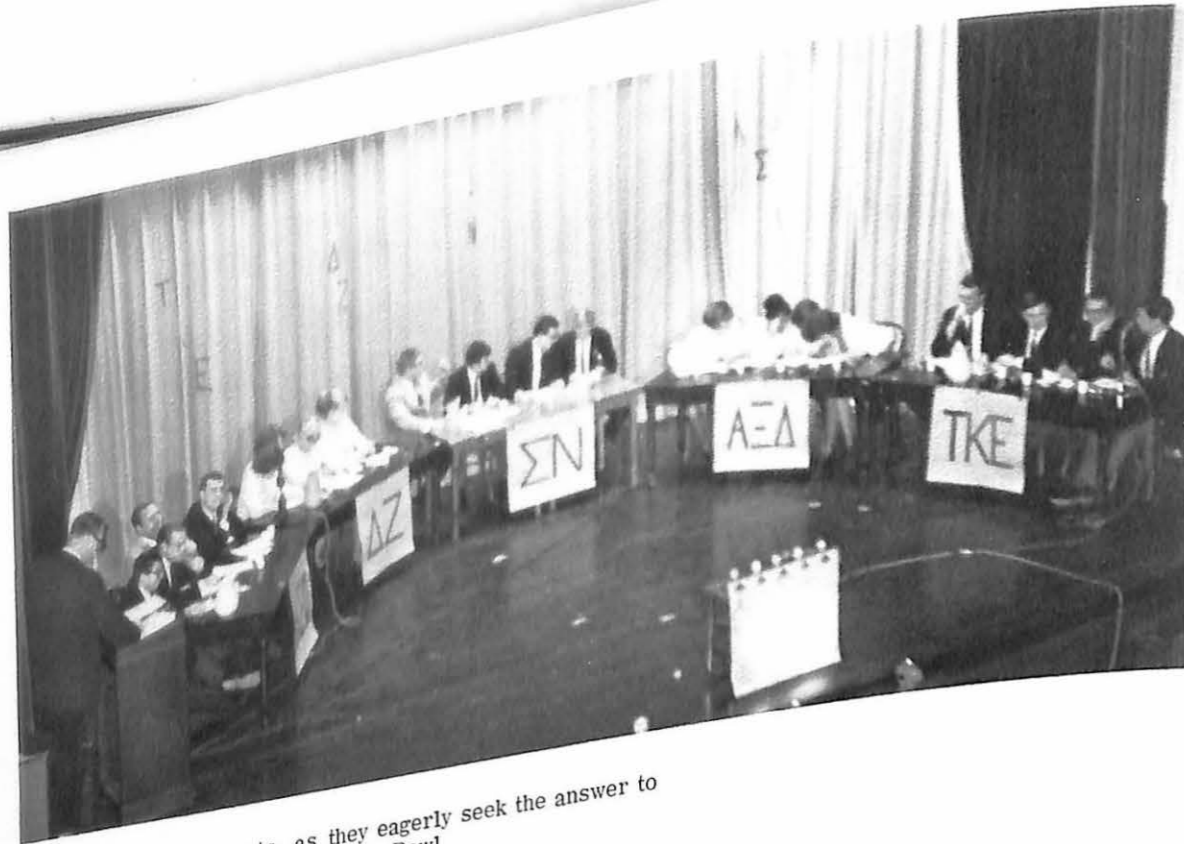

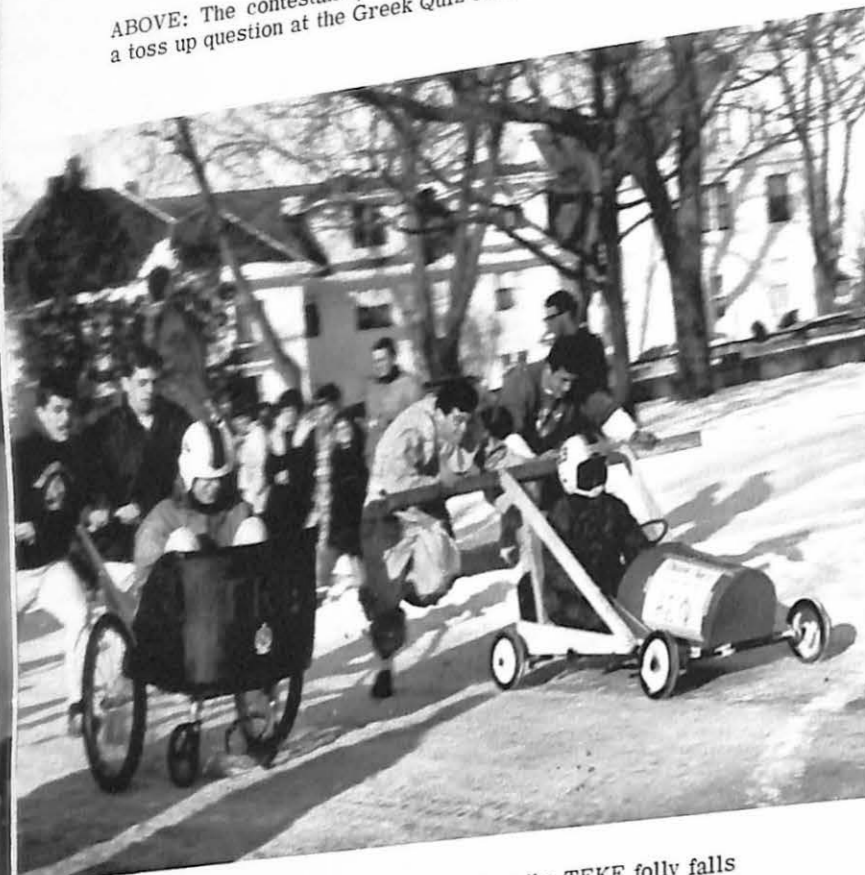

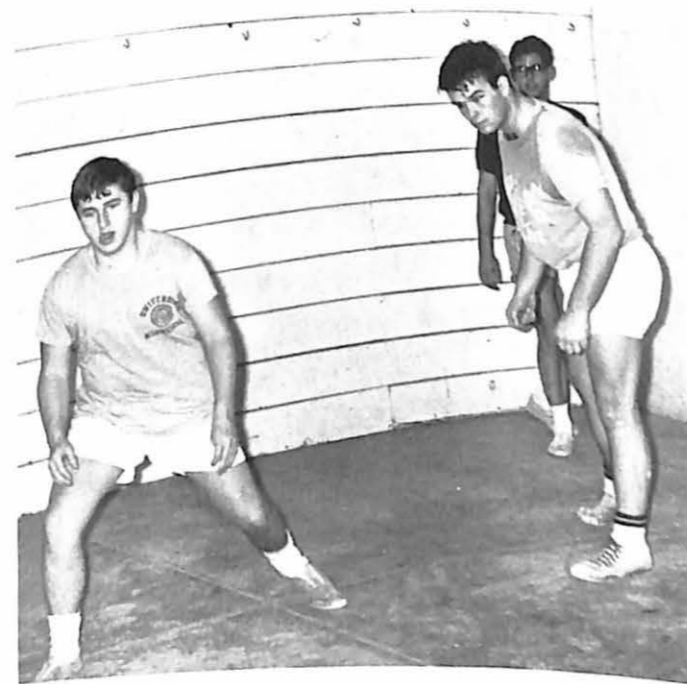

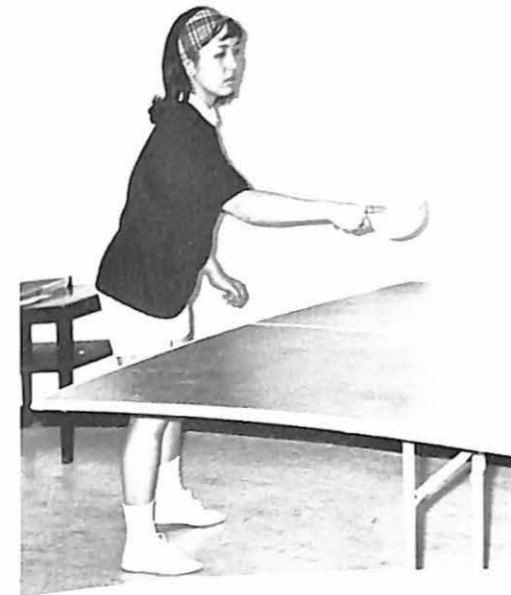

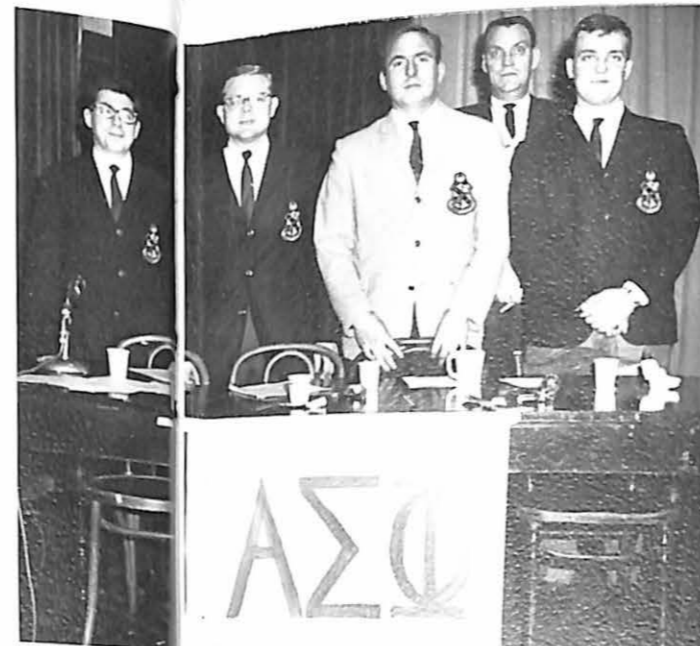


Greek Week 1966

THE GLASS MENAGERIE

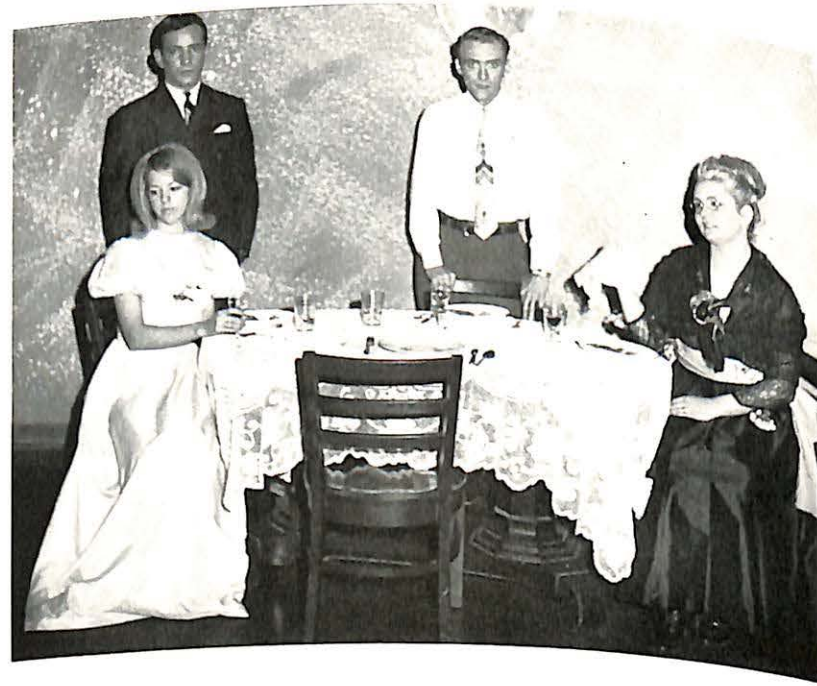

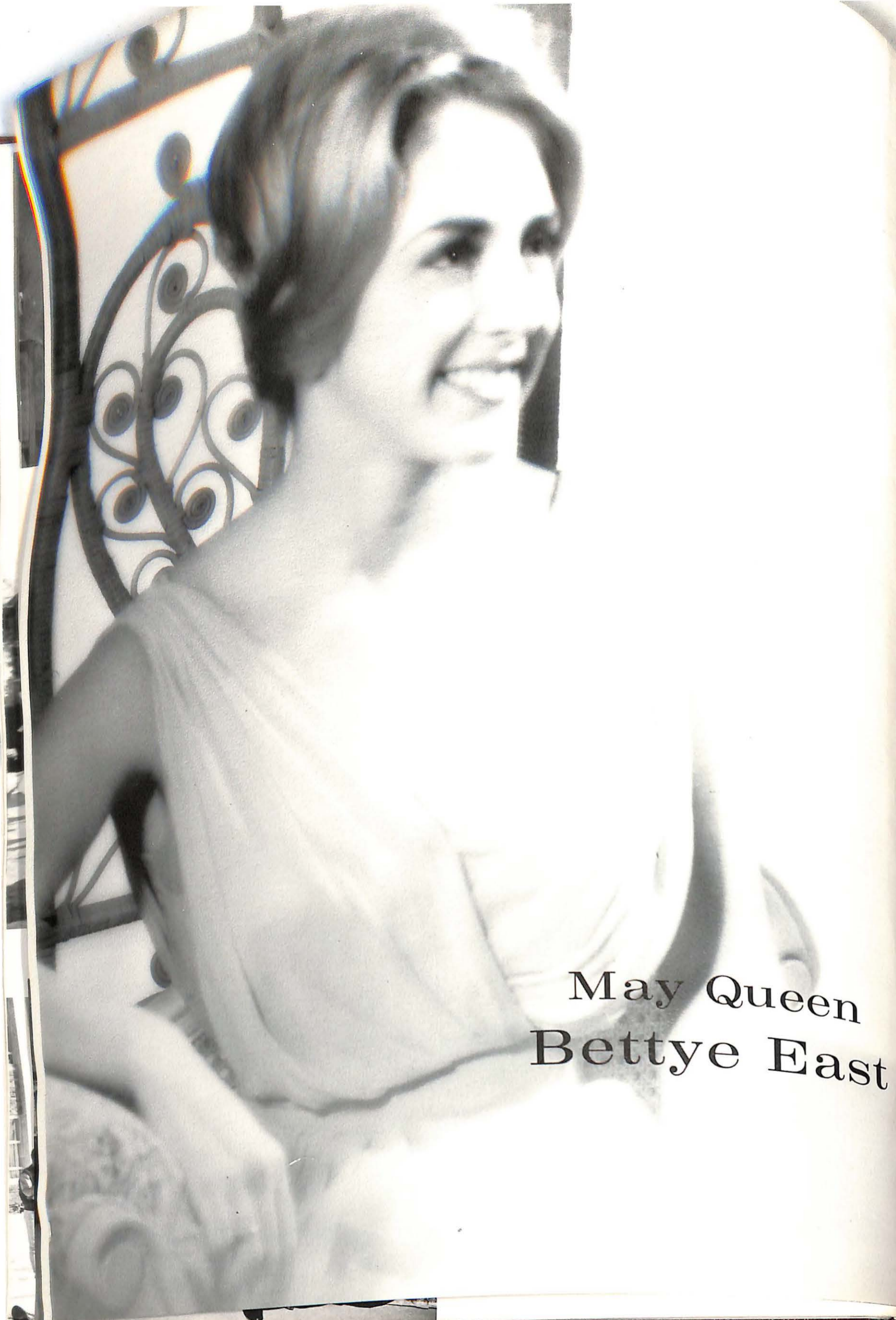

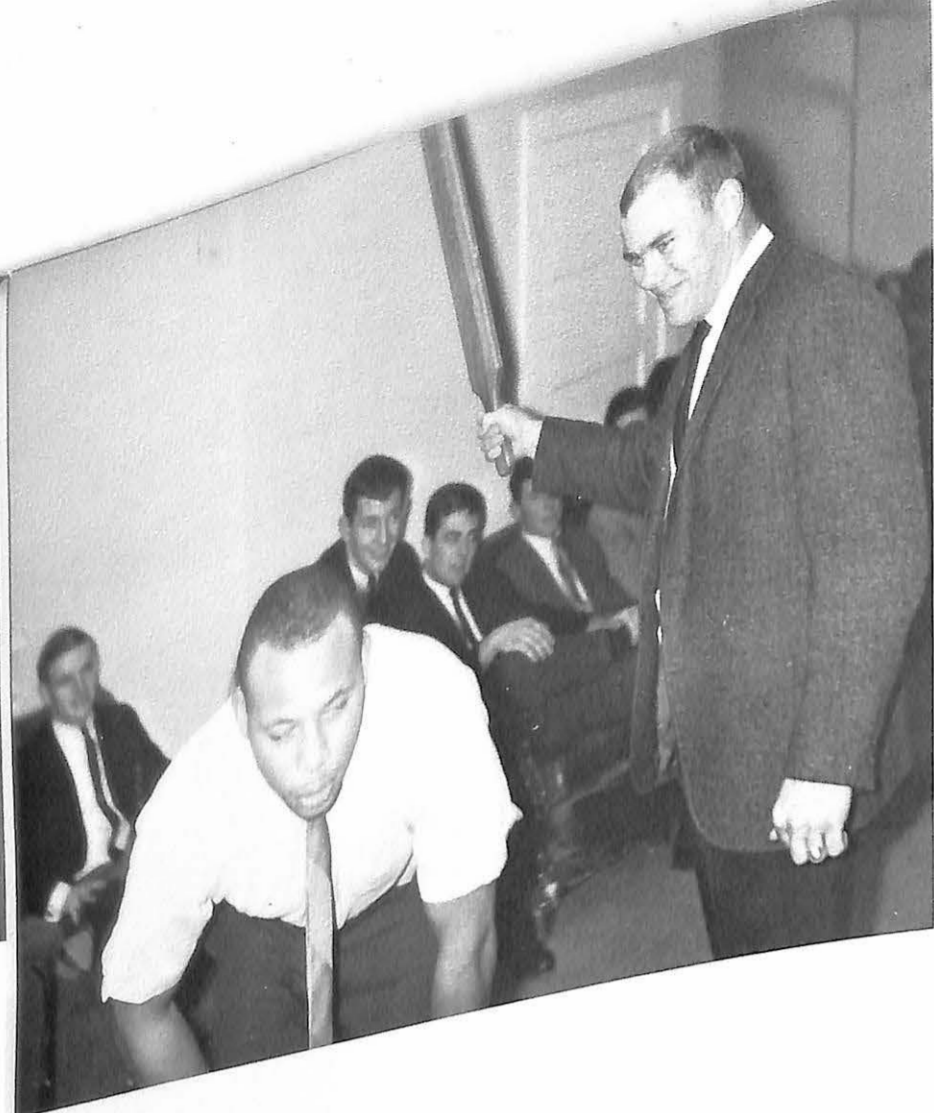

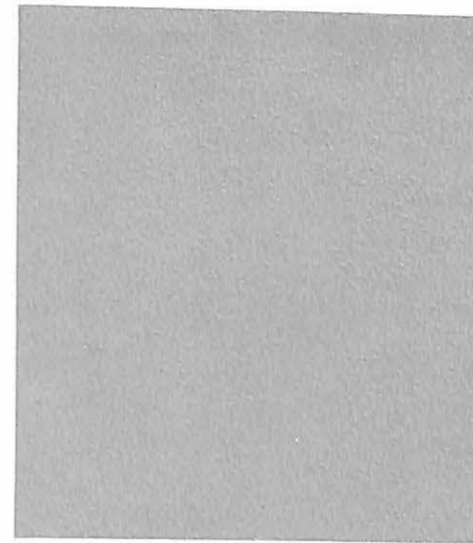

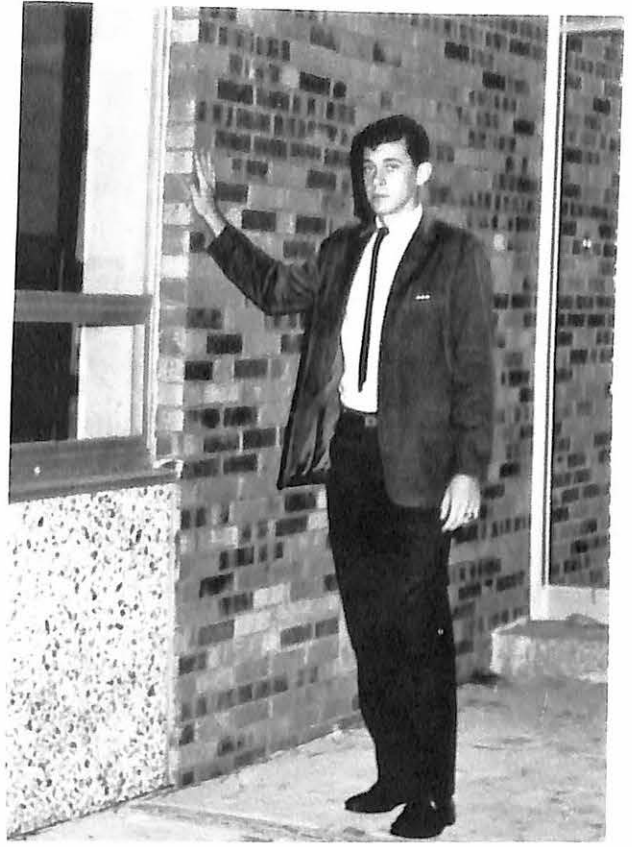
This year the Student Senate was active in the planning of the Homecoming festivities, re-establishing the Delta as a student run publication, giving appointments of committees, writing of the first Student Handbook, and the arbitration of student ideals.

Through arbitration with the faculty and administration of the college the Student Senate received: its own accounting system, which led to the Delta's accounting system; the elimination of required Chapel for seniors due to a lack of space and a recommendation from Senate officers; a revision and return to consistency of class cuts and negative hours; an increase in our allotment from \$1.50 to \$2.00 per semester, and another promised increase next year to \$2.50 for Student Senate; the improving of the college's identification cards; the extra day of vacation during Thanksgiving; and the assemblies, the Sabiduria, and the Delta came entirely under the control of the Student Senate.

The Student Senate, realizing the need of internal reorganization, revised its Constitution and general structure of administration. It presented more union dances; paid tribute to the Manion-Albin administration for the two Special Events; presented the faculty with a proposal for the increasing of academic load to eighteen hours without extra costs; chartered the first political organization on campus, the Young Americans for Freedom; consolidated its committee system; produced the first STUDENT HANDBOOK; inaugurated the ideal of "Party Weekend" during Homecoming '65; and effectively produced and organized extra-curricular activities for the student body through the Student Social Life Committee.

It is only through representative government that effective legislation, organization, and arbitration can be done. The increasing of the Student Senate's power is a slow process and requires patients and a basic understanding of the structure of the organization and the problems related to the Student Senate. The Student Senate Officers and Senators did an outstanding job in bringing the Senate into the view of all for making the Student Senate a more student run organization than an administrative voice.

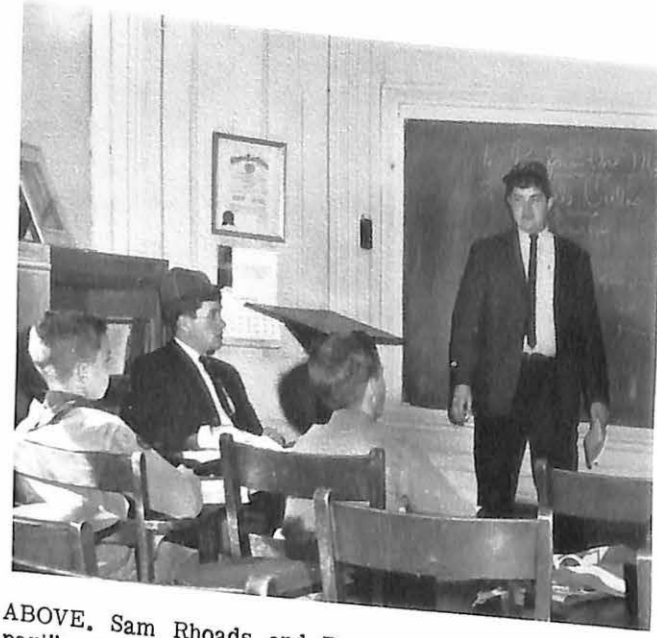

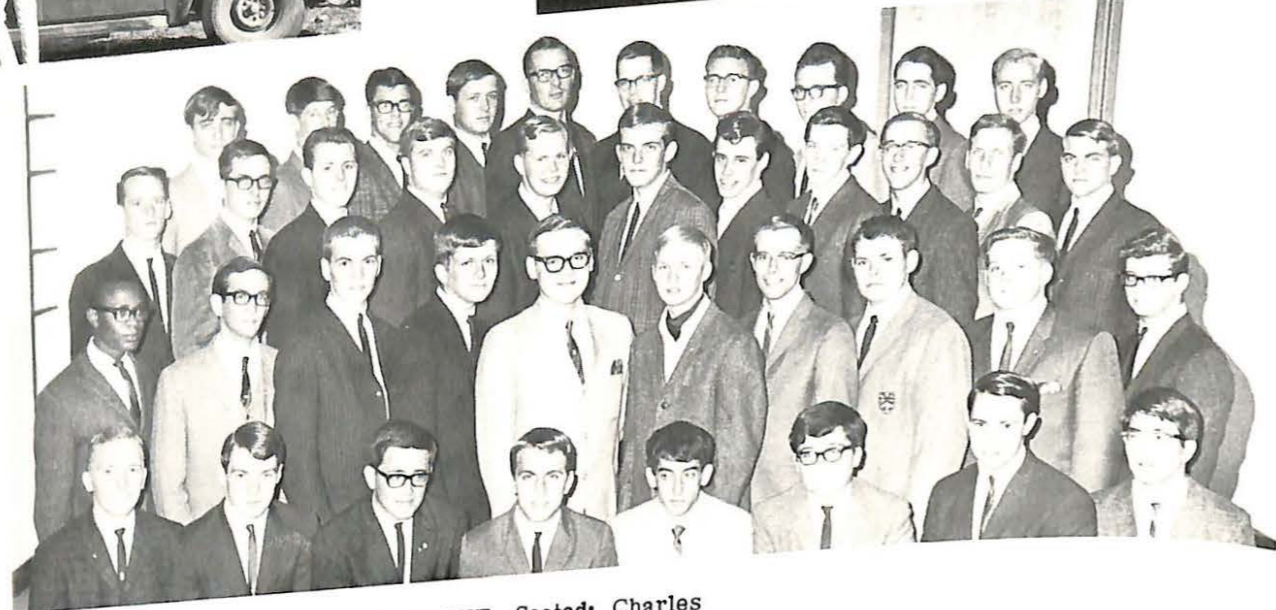

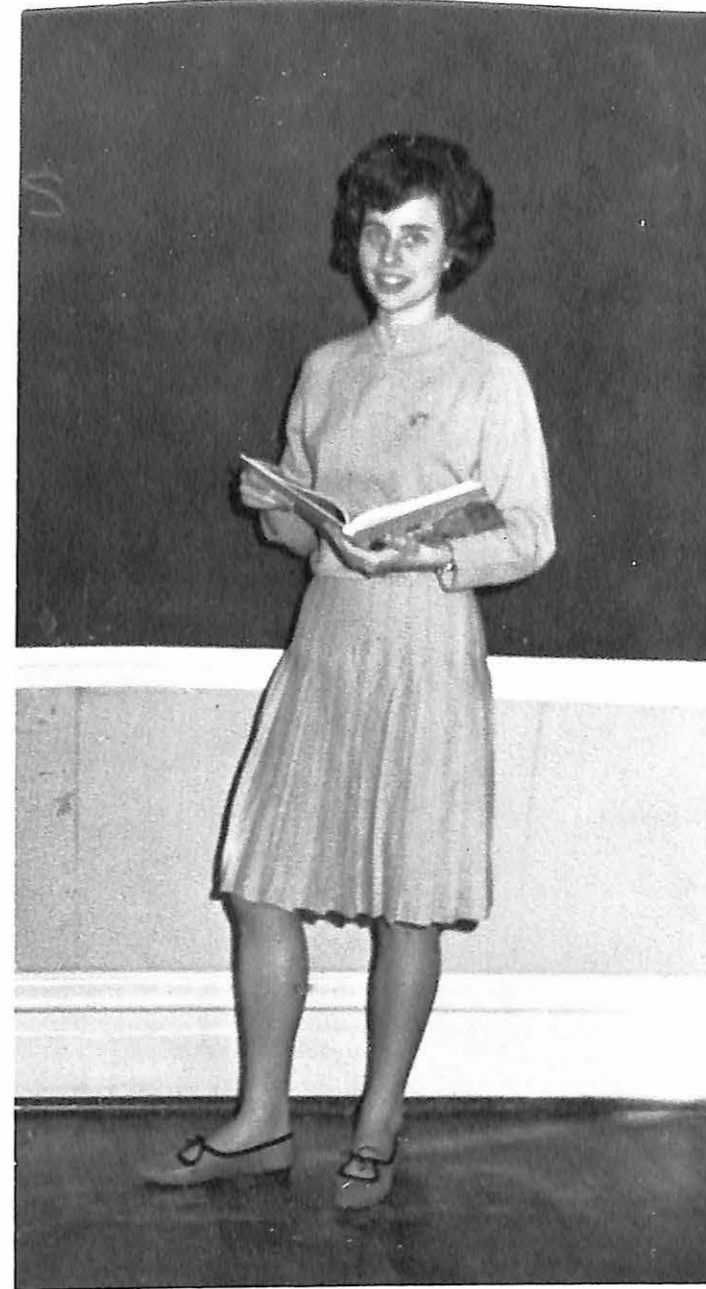

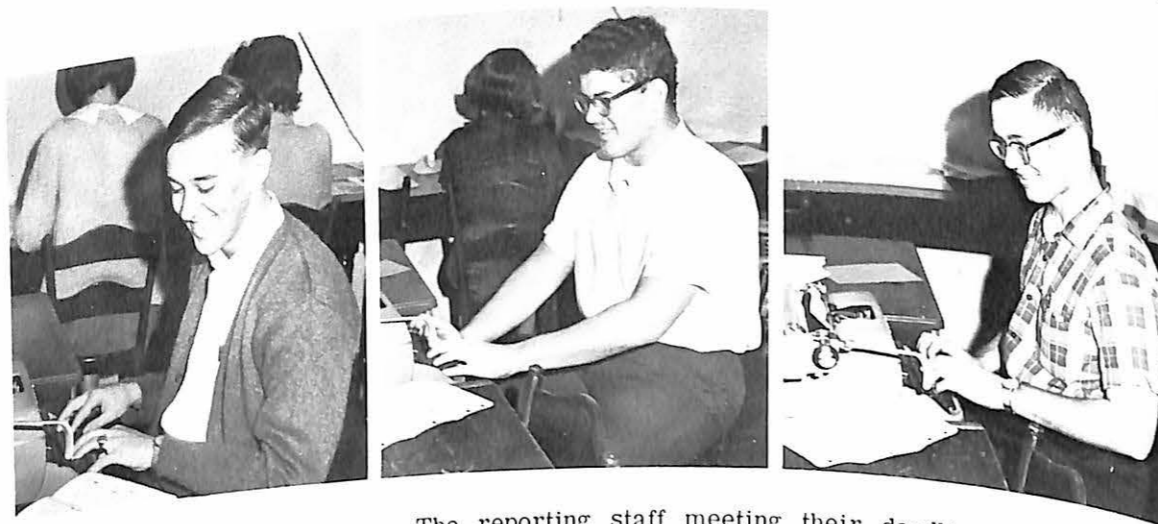
For the first time in this decade THE DELTA has not been a classroom project under a professor's jurisdiction. Rather it is the voice of the students.

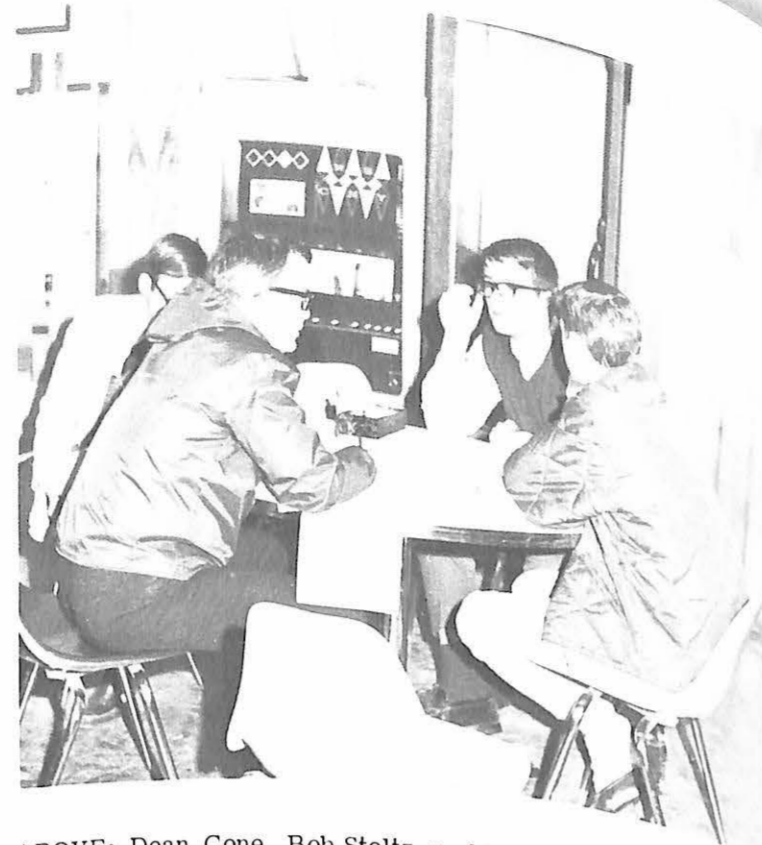

The Economics Club under the advisorship of Prof. Gerald K. Saunders, met twice a month to discuss recent national and international events that had significant economic importance. The semester's discussions were centered around the escalating war in Vietnam and the economic attributes of the Great Society.

The November raise in the rediscount rate of the member banks of the Federal Reserve System brought considerable discussion to the Club. President Johnson's attempt to raise steel prices to a compromise with the steel companies advanced which made Senators and Congressmen take ground. The labor situation in New York with the labor way strike, also brought attention to the Clubs concern about governmental policy and business. All of the semesters discussion touched highly on the works of John Maynard Keynes.

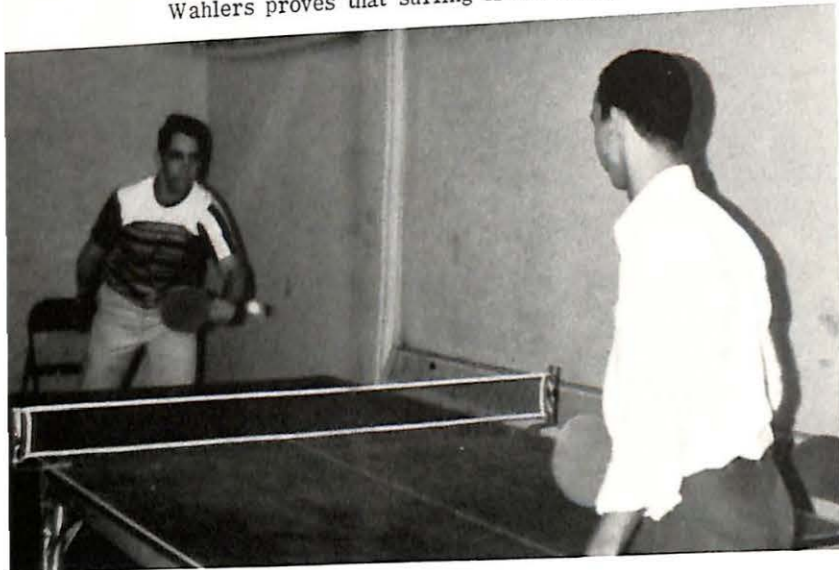

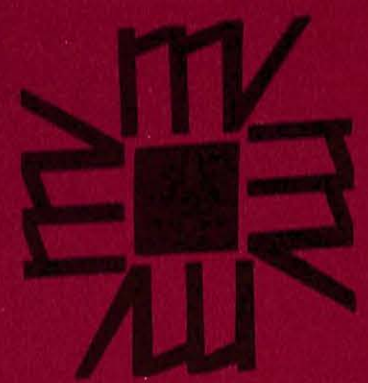

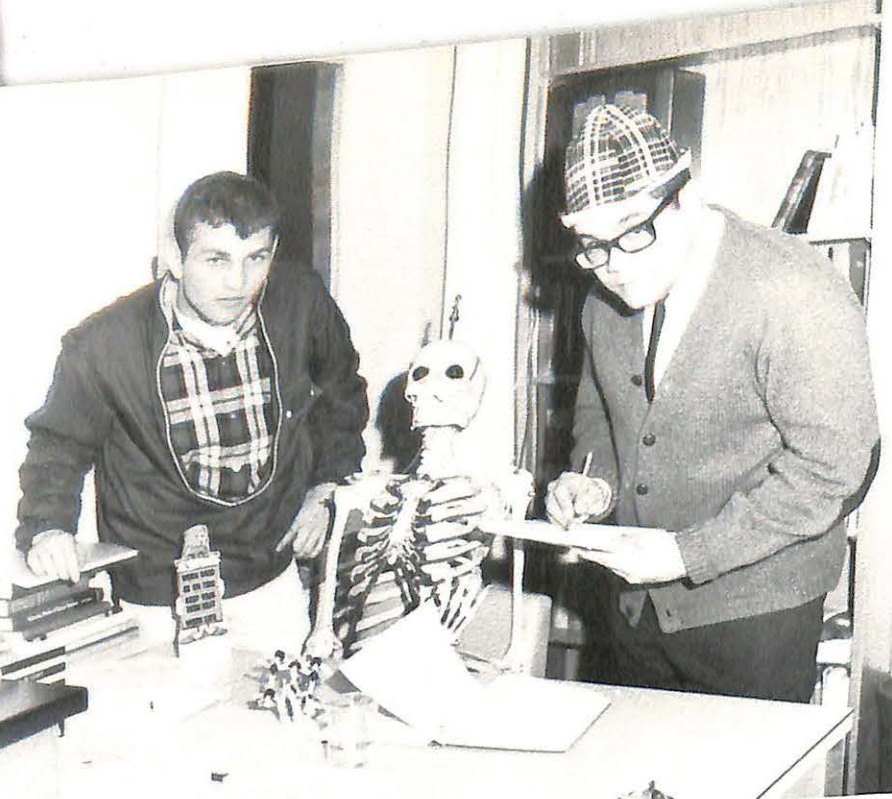

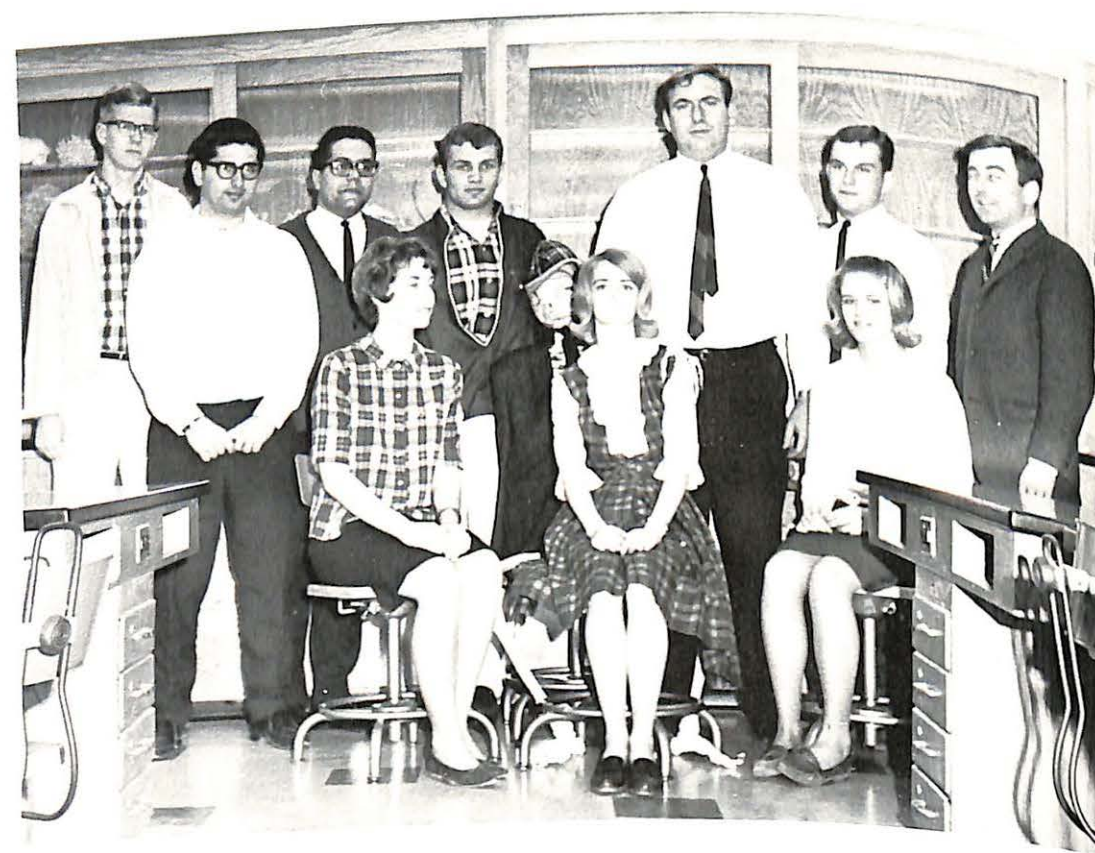
Alpha Psi Omega

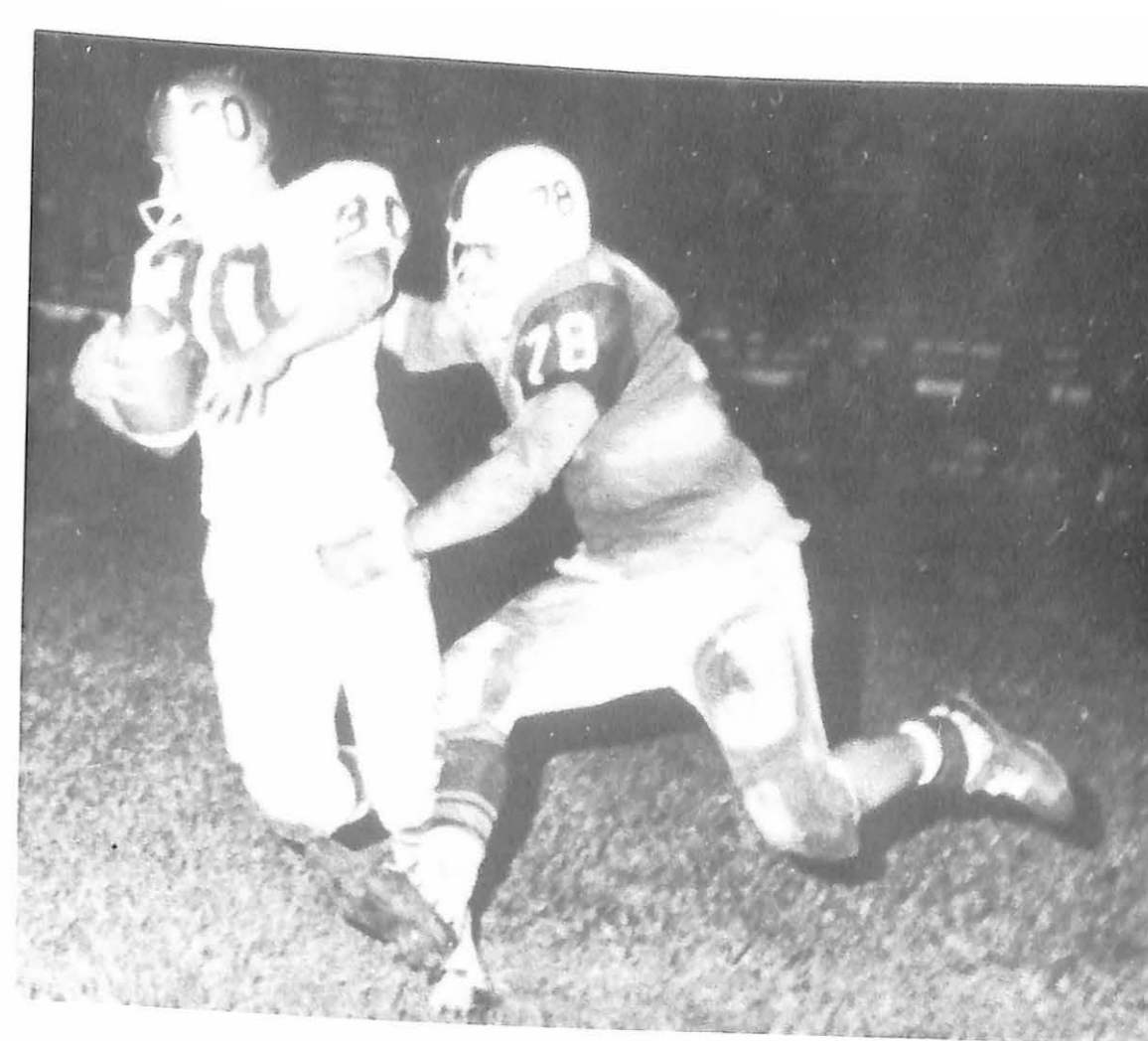

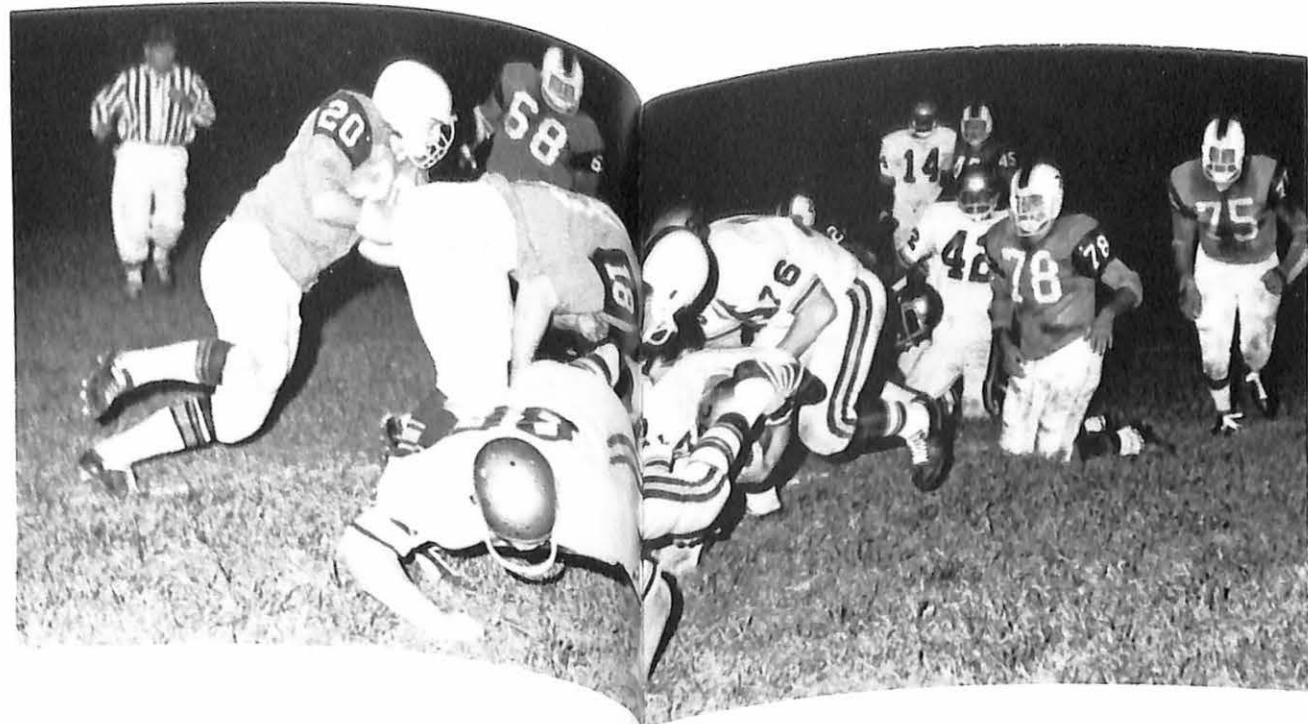
Vikings Cash In For 14-0 Win Over Penn On Two Late Touchdowns

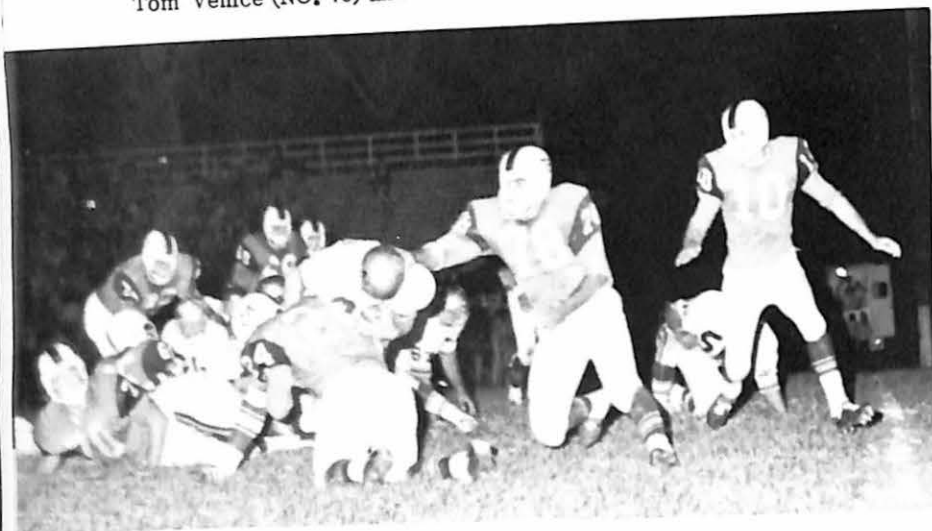

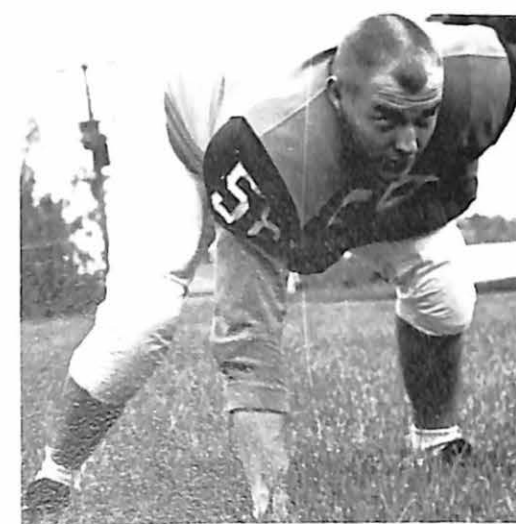

The Missouri Valley College Vikings overwhelmed their opponent by licking the Wildcats of Culver-Stockton College, 33-12, during the final home game of the season. The Vikes racked up three touchdowns and three extra points, in the first period before undergoing a cooling off period in a scoreless second quarter. The Valley gridgers added two more touchdowns on runbacks of pass interceptions during the second half.

The first MVC touchdown came on an 82 yard pass play, from Ed McDuffie to end Rich Bittle, on the first play of the game. That play seemed to set the trend for the entire game. Two other touchdowns were scored by Valley in the first quarter, one on another pass from McDuffie to Bittle that was good for 9 yards, and the other on a brilliant 27 yard run by wingback Bob Thomas. Two other touchdowns were scored by the offense but were called back because of penalties. One of those that were nullified, was a 43 yard run by freshman, Rayford Crowley. The Viking's scoring was rounded out by two pass interception returns, one by Jim Montague for 28 yards and the other by Dave Moore for 39 yards.

Bow In Opener To Scalpers Individuals Sparkle

The Missouri Valley College football team opened the season by meeting the Huron Scalpers of Huron, South Dakota, at Huron. The Vikings held a 7-6, half-time lead but were pinned back by a rallying Huron team during the second half. Valley was able to muster only 23 yards on the ground in the entire second half and were only able to score in the last few minutes.

Rick LaValley, who averaged better than 40 yards on 7 punts, kept the Scalpers away from the touchdown door with his boot returns. A fumble recovered by Henry Drummond led the Vikes to their first touchdown. A combination of plays, using Ed McDuffie and Vince Petrocelli, was responsible in scoring.

Tom Venice made some bone-crushing tackles as line-backer and the Interior defense of Henry Drummond, George Pulliam, Hiran Davis and Bob Thompson held the Scalpers in line for most of the game. Huron loaded up on the pressed Valley offensive line and the pulling guards and blocking backs were unable to stem the crush of tacklers that poured through the line. Valley's wide plays were stopped cold and the best gains were up the middle. Ed McDuffie was credited with completing 7 out of 17 passes for 68 yards. Jim Montague, Buz Extok, and Tom Whiteside were the signal-calling, blocking backs for the Vikes, with Buz Extok doing a fine job on Valley's offensive ground march.

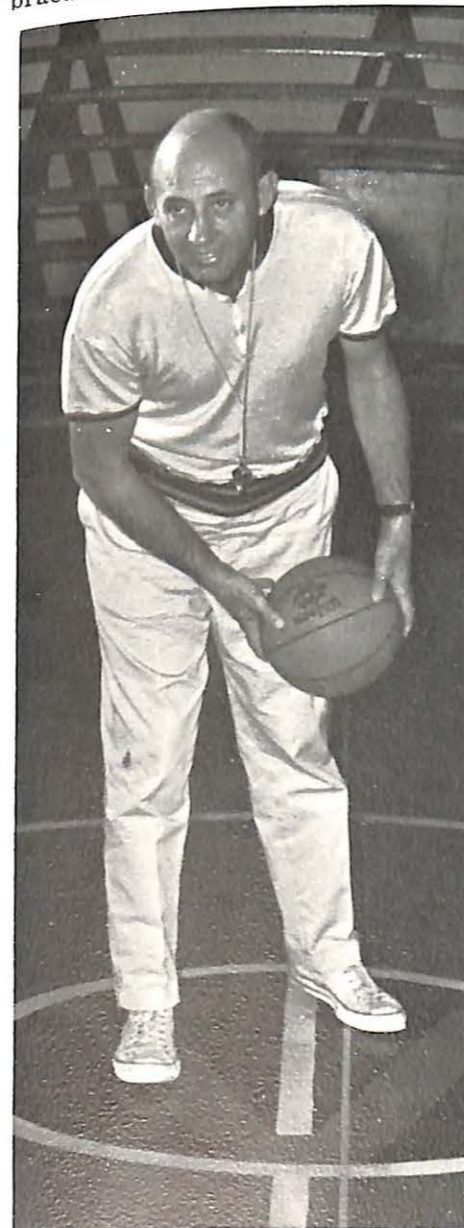

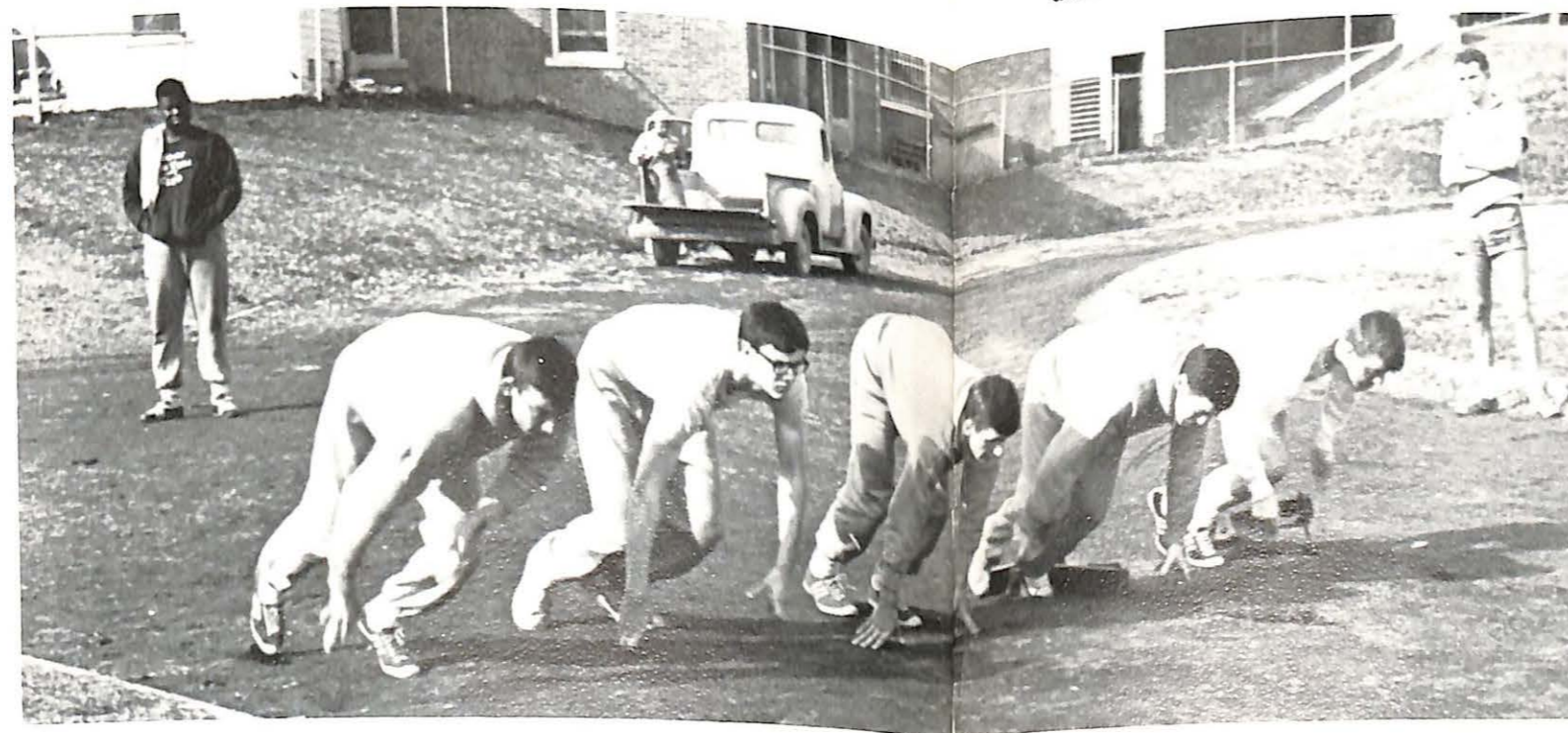

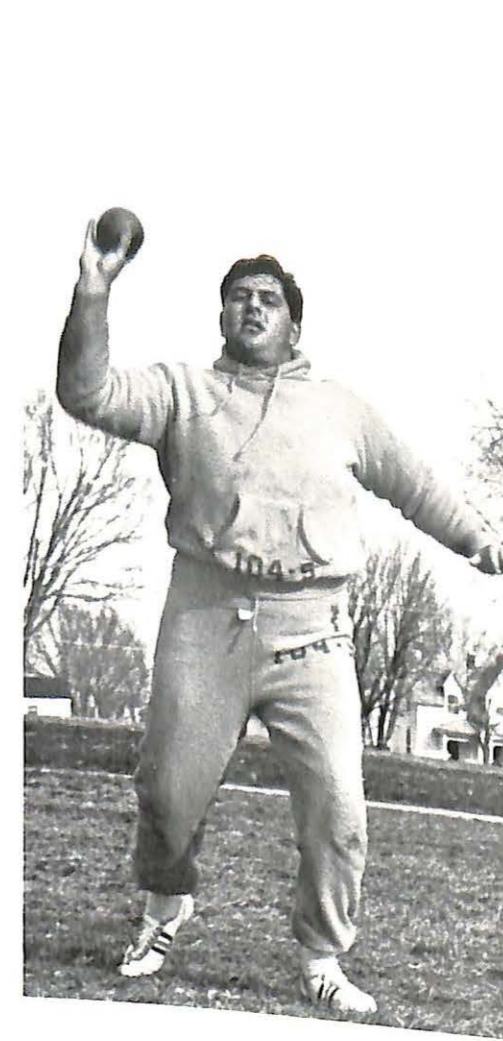

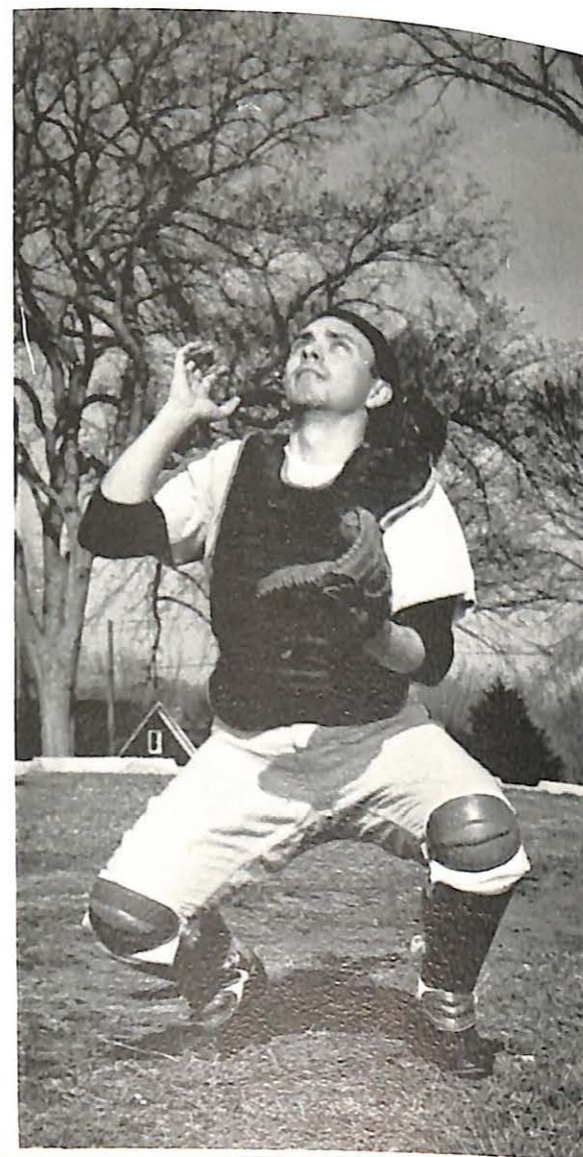

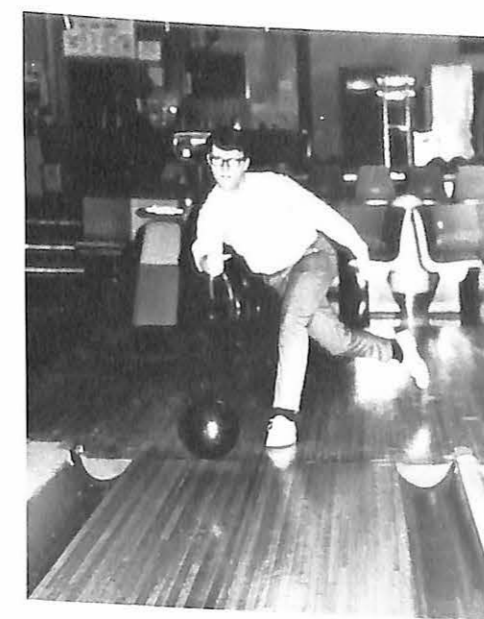

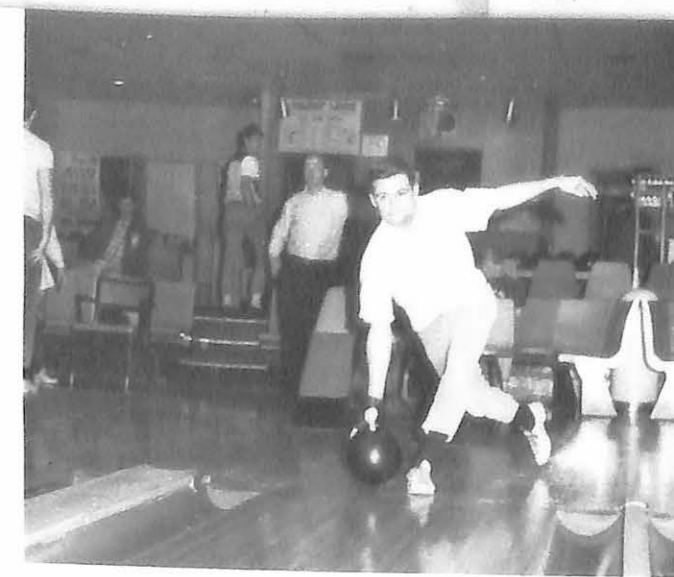

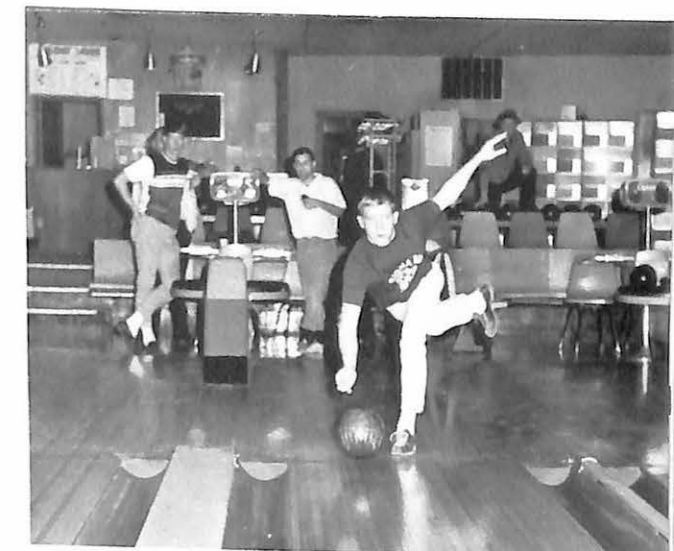

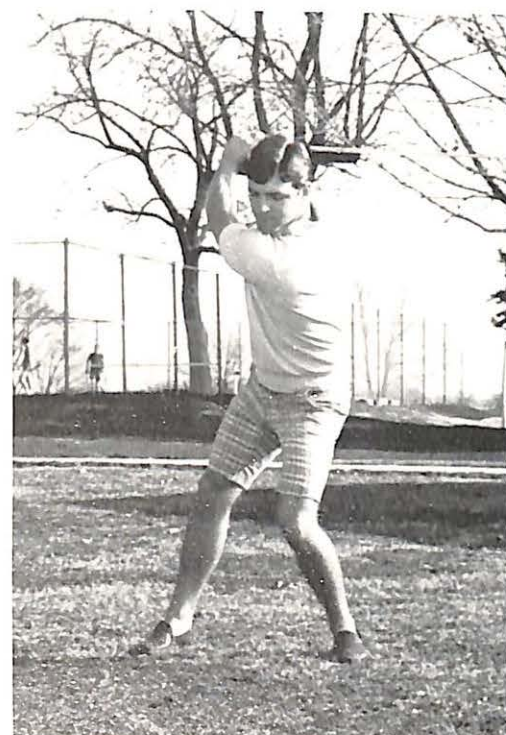
