DEDICATION

The 1990-91 Sabiduria yearbook is dedicated in memory of Coach Kenneth Gibler. After coaching 23 years at Missouri Valley College, Coach Gibler died on November 23, 1990.

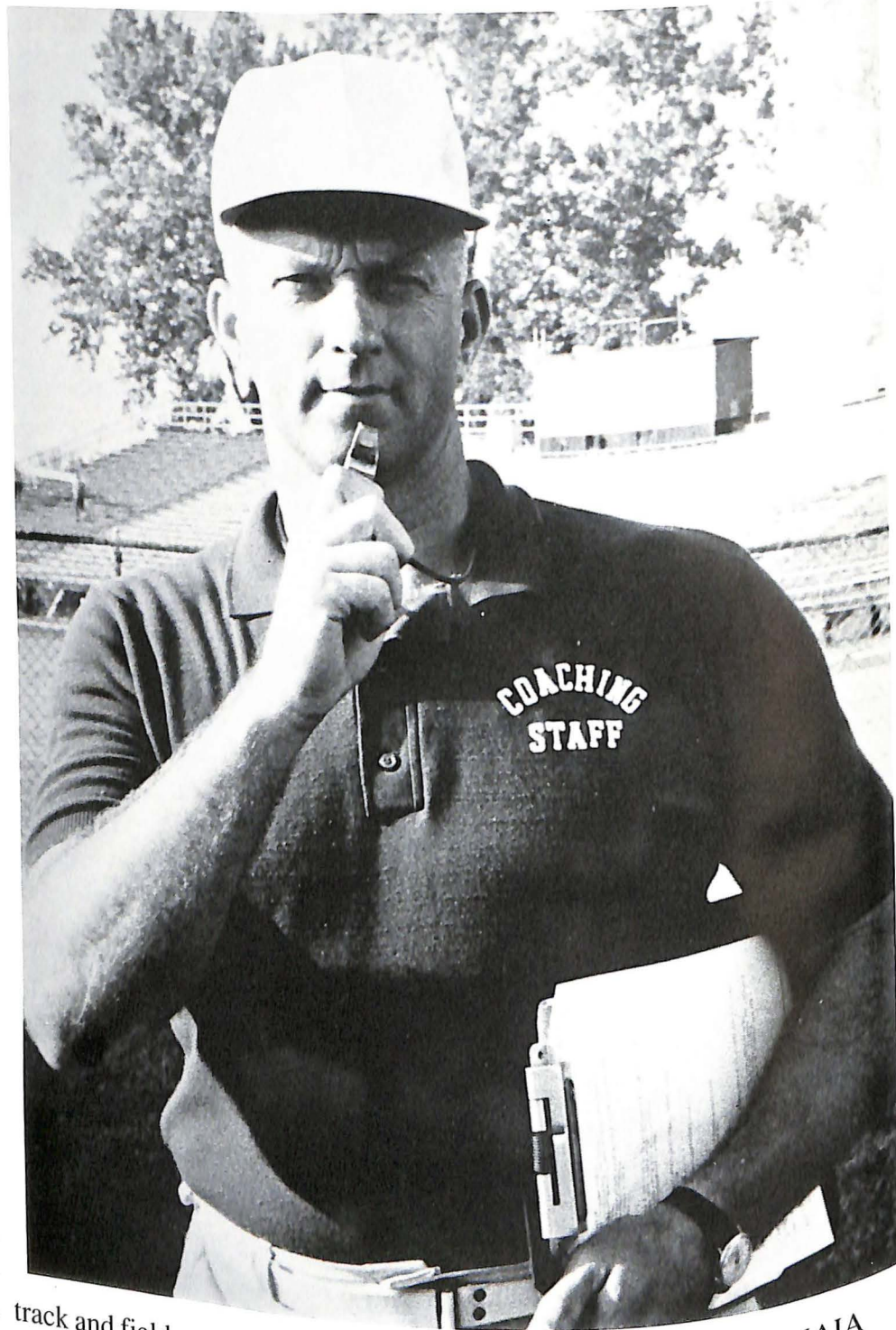
Coach Gibler graduated from MVC in 1957. As a Viking gridder, he was a four-year letterman in football as an end, and he lettered two years in track and field. He captained the 1956 Viking football team and was selected as a first team Little All-American by the Williamson's poll.

In 1968, he returned to his alma mater to take over the grid helm. Over the 23-year span, his football coaching record was 162 wins, 64 losses, and 8 ties. Coach Gibler assumed the position of director of athletics in 1973.

Coach Gibler was among the more winning coaches of the National Association of Inter-collegiate Athletics Division II and last January, in San Francisco, Calif., was formally inducted into the NAIA Athletic Coaches Hall of Fame.

In balloting within the Heart of America Athletic Conference Coach Gibler was named coach of the Year for 1990 as his Vikings posted an 8-2 overall season.

From 1968-83, he was head



track and field coach at MVC and was chosen NAIA District Track Coach of the Year in 1971. He was inducted into the MVC Athletic Hall of Fame in 1981. Gibler

also served as president of the NAIA Football Coaches Association in 1985.

The new Gibler Campus is named for him.

EARL J. REEVES: MISSOURI VALLEY'S LEADING MAN



Earl Reeves has held the distinguished office of President for more than seven years. In that time, enrollment has risen from less than 400 students to over 1000. Missouri Valley now has almost twice as many faculty and staff members as were here seven years ago.

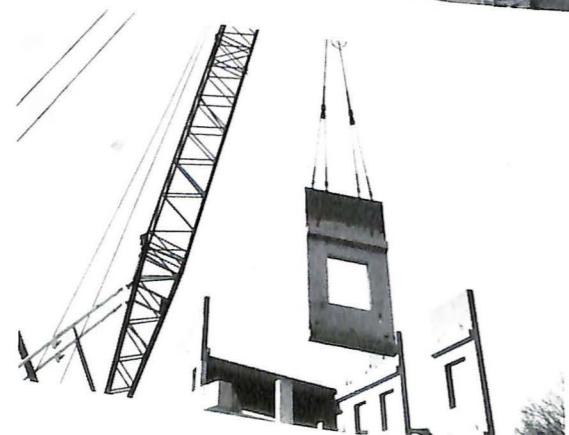
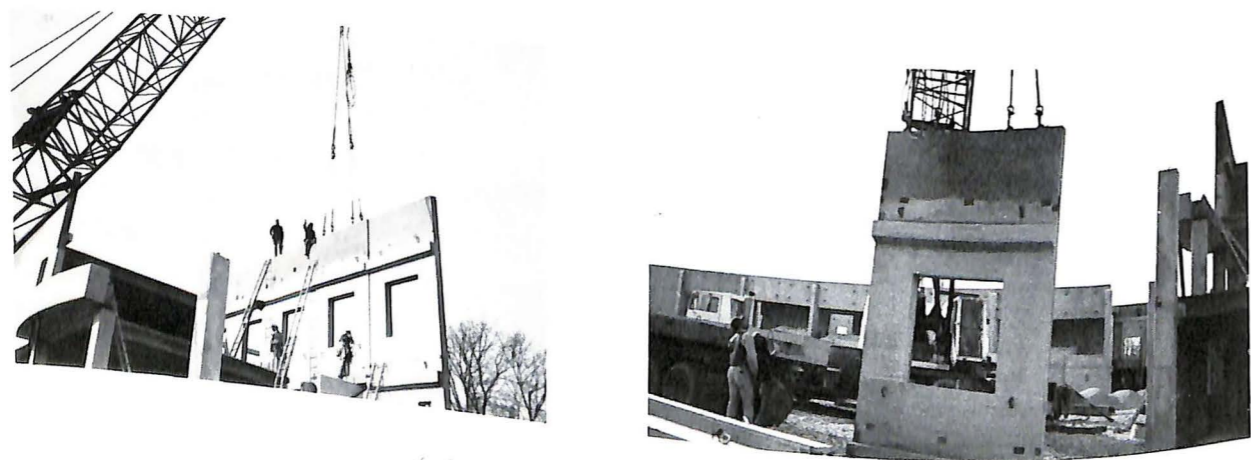
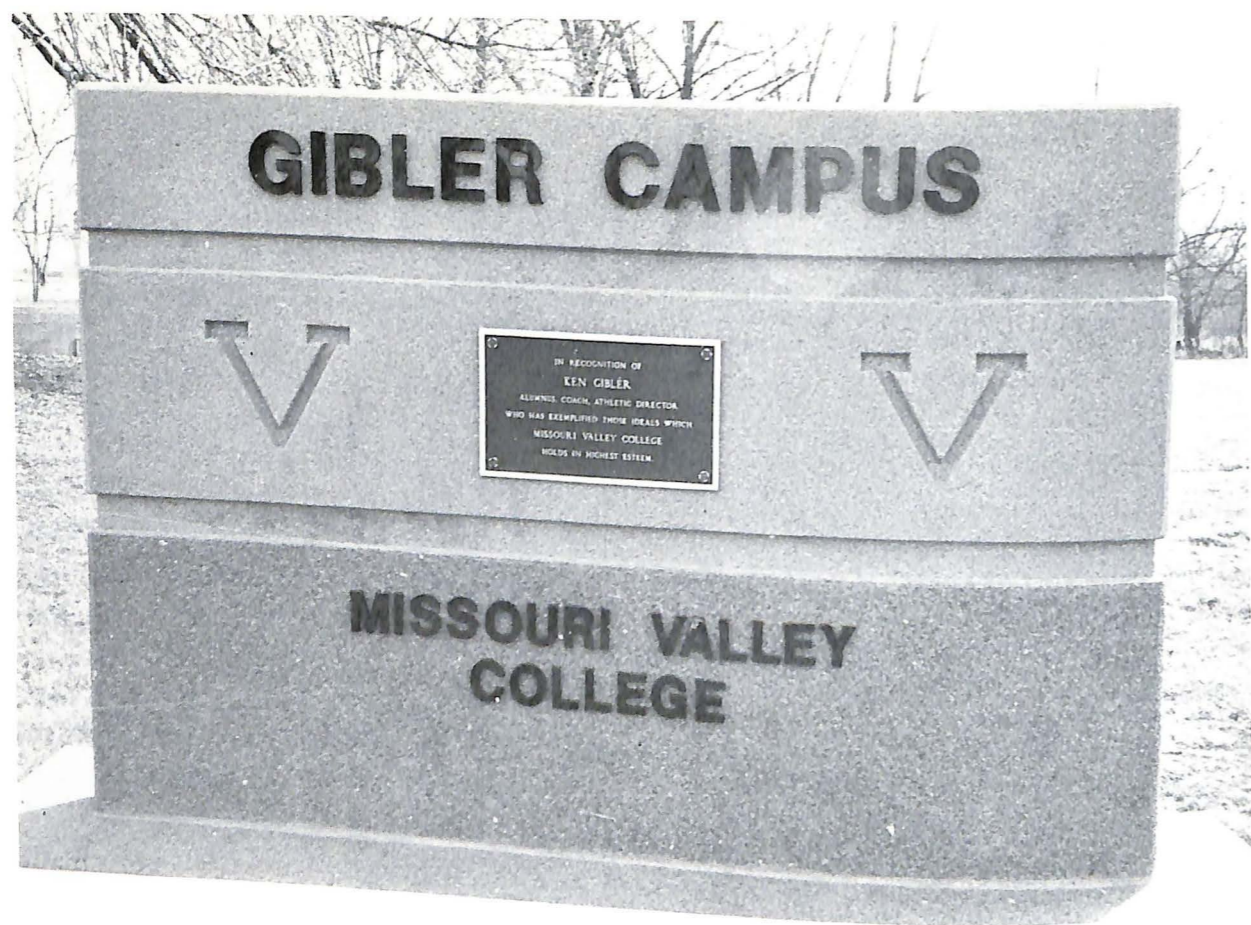
The new sports facility will be finished in 1991, and an expanded library is a future project.

MISSOURI VALLEY FOOTBALL

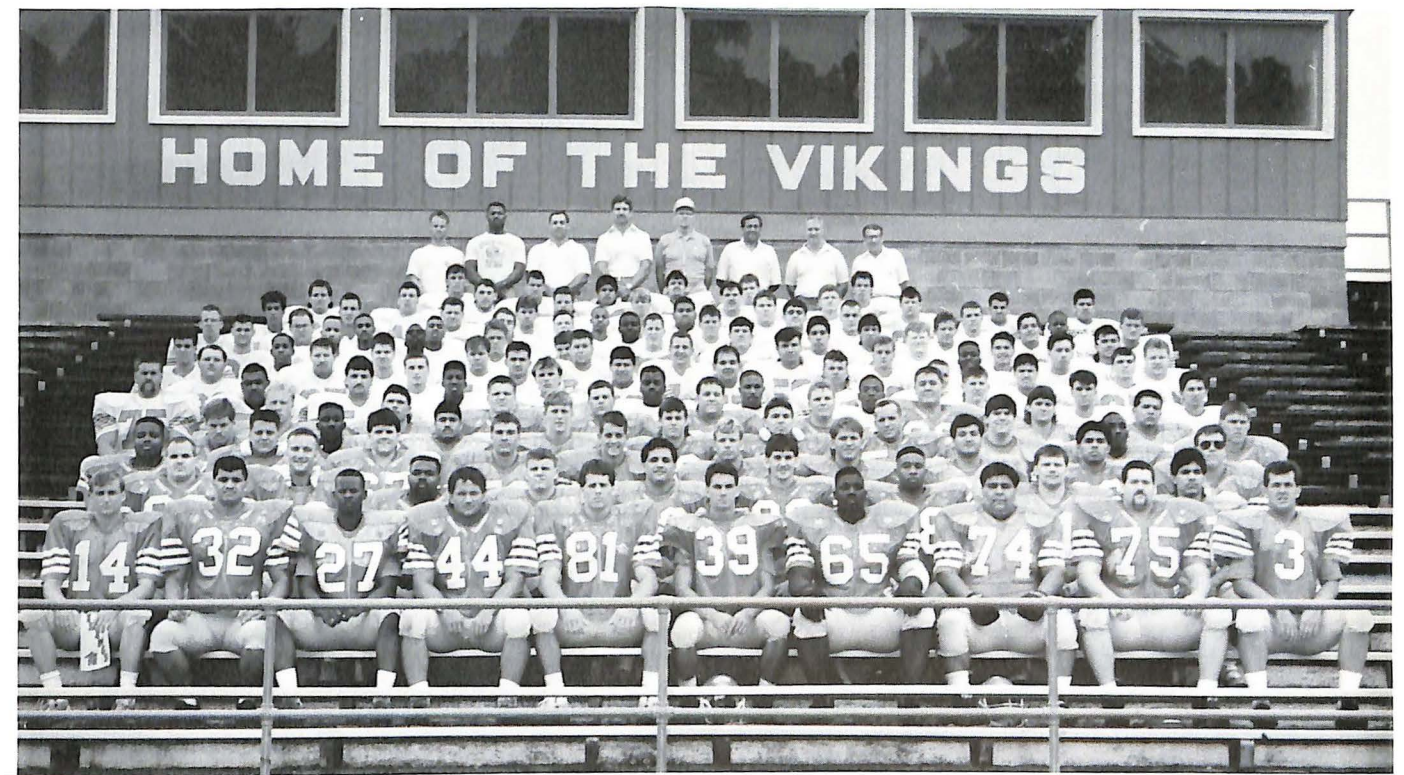

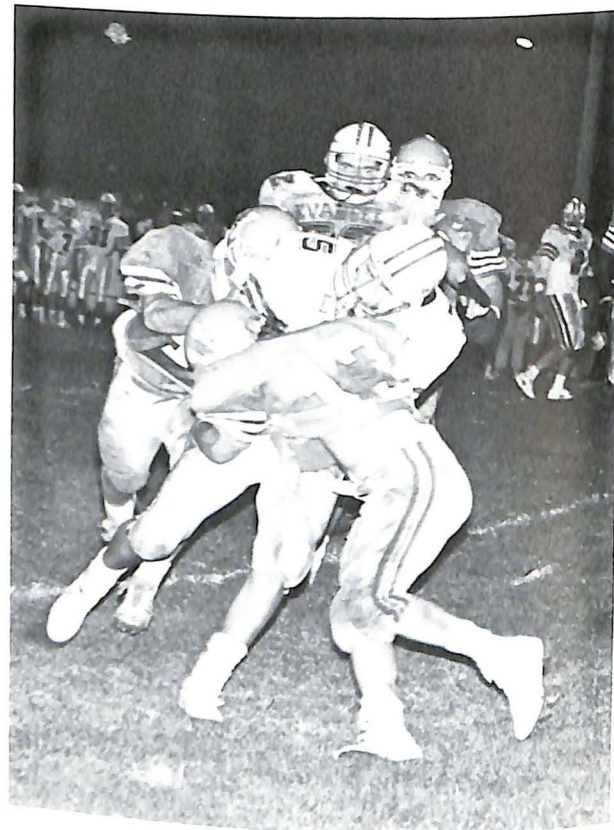

MEN'S SOCCER : A TOUGH SEASON

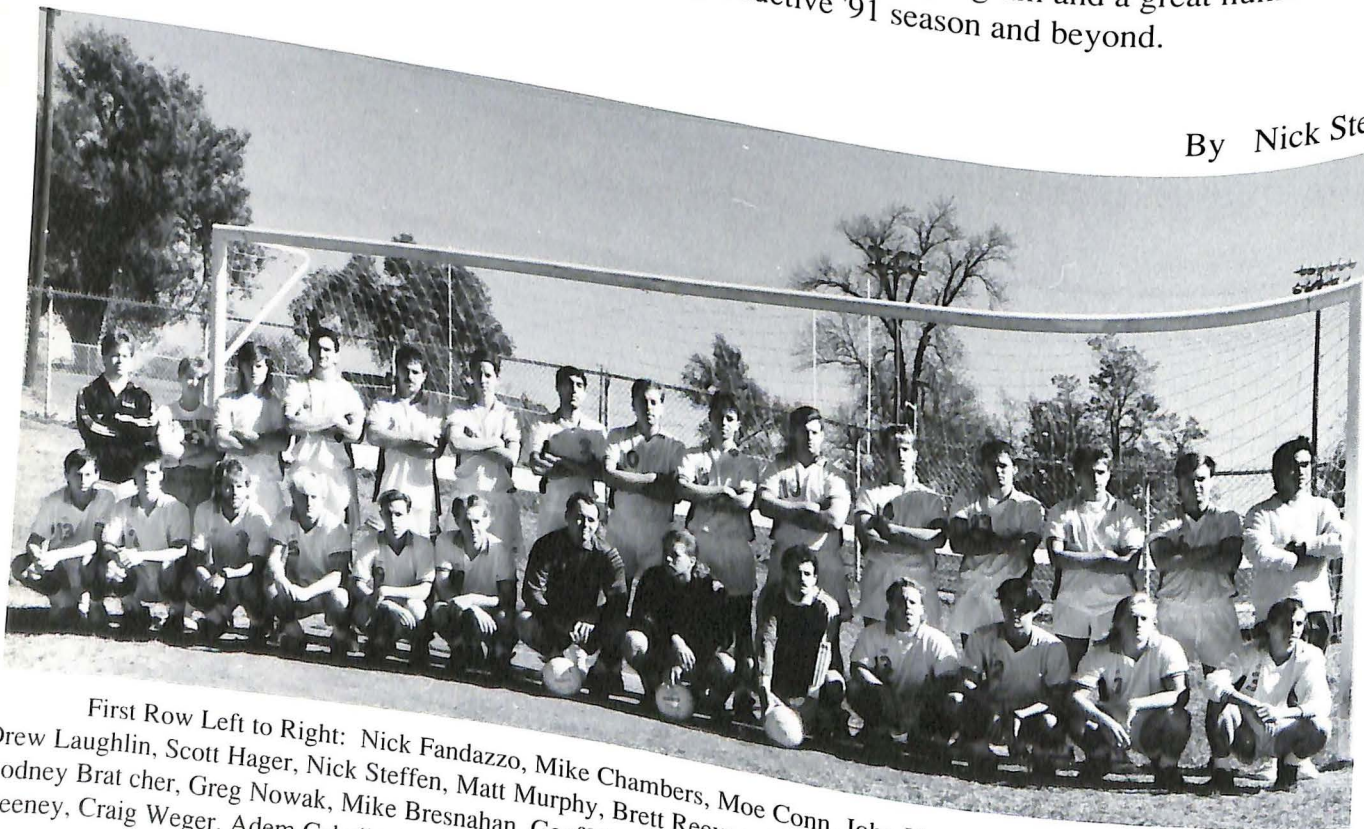

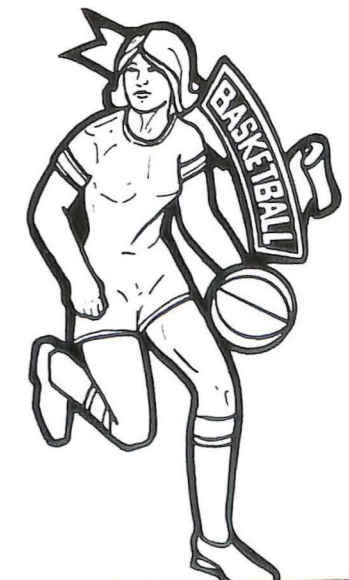
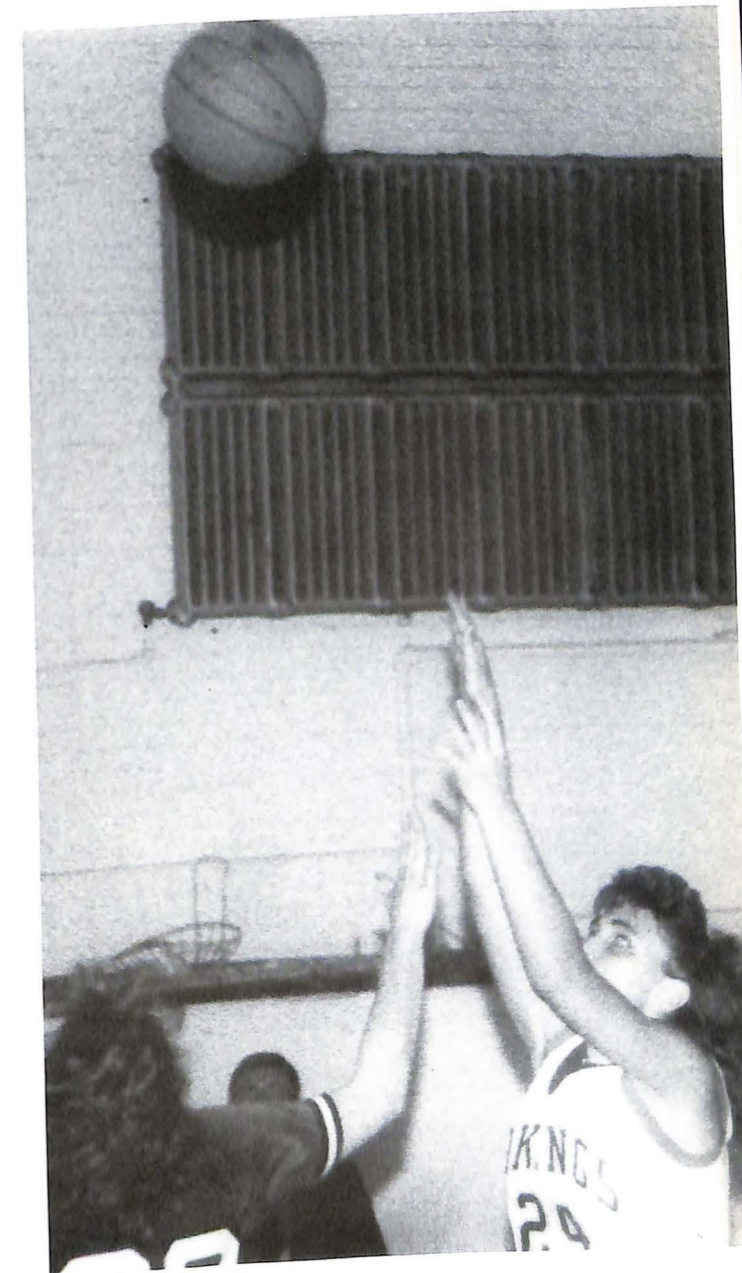

MVC BASKETBALL BEATS POLL

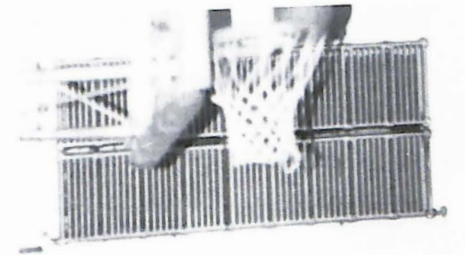
The Vikings finished this season with a surprising 20-11 record, despite an early season poll, which picked the Vikings to come in sixth, not third.

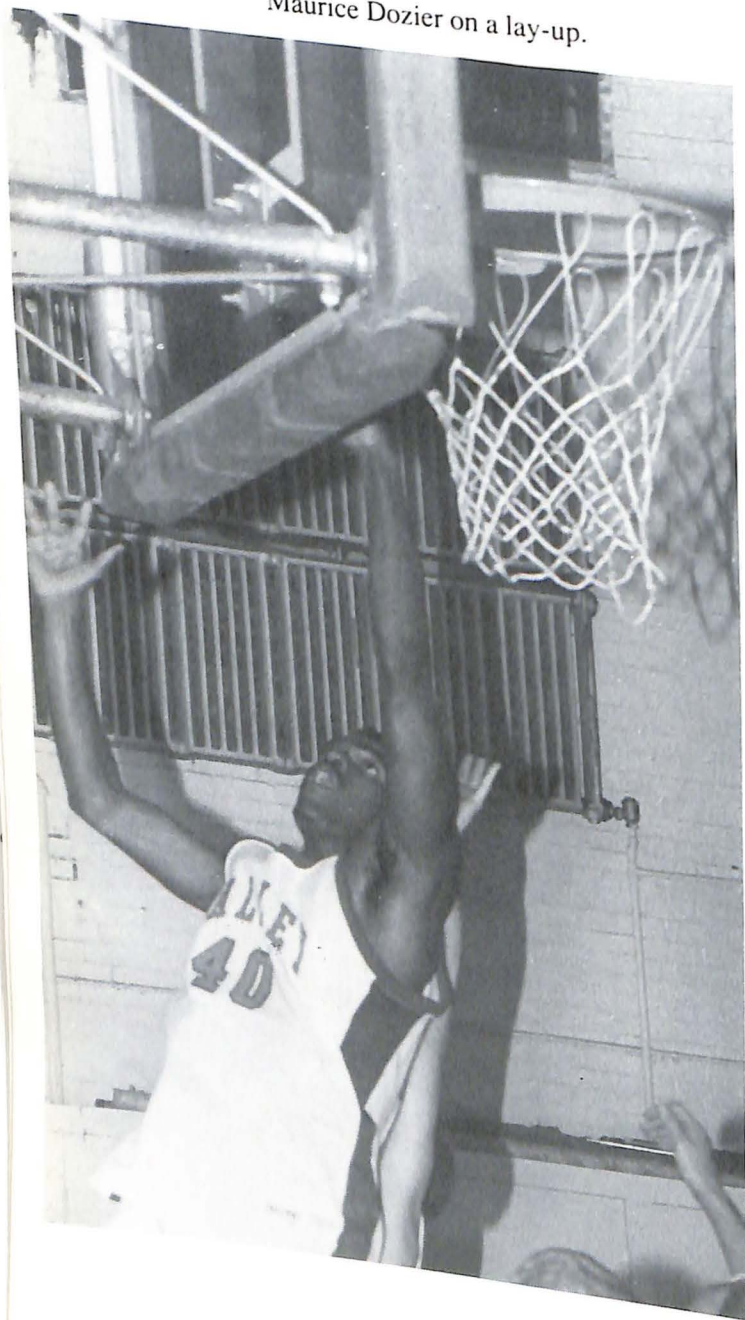

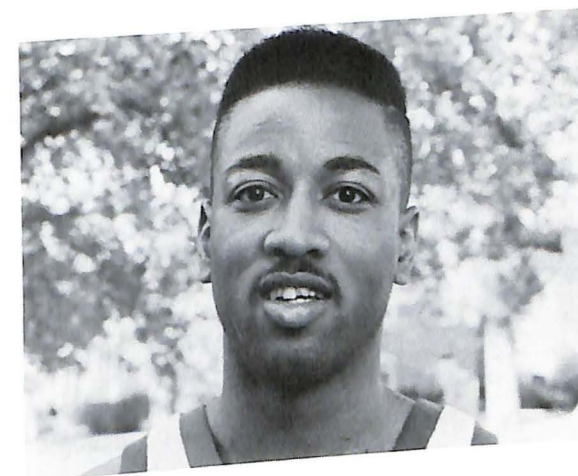
Fox caps MVC career with winning season

Missouri Valley's men's head basketball coach Denny Fox capped his seven-year stint with a winning season, despite polls predicting otherwise.

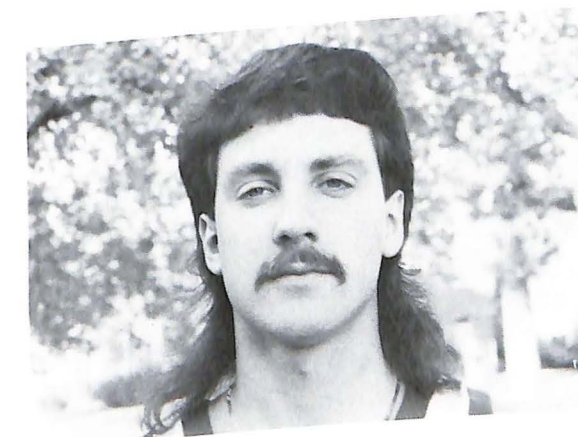
The Viking cagers were 20-11 for the year. Coach Fox was very proud of this year's team.

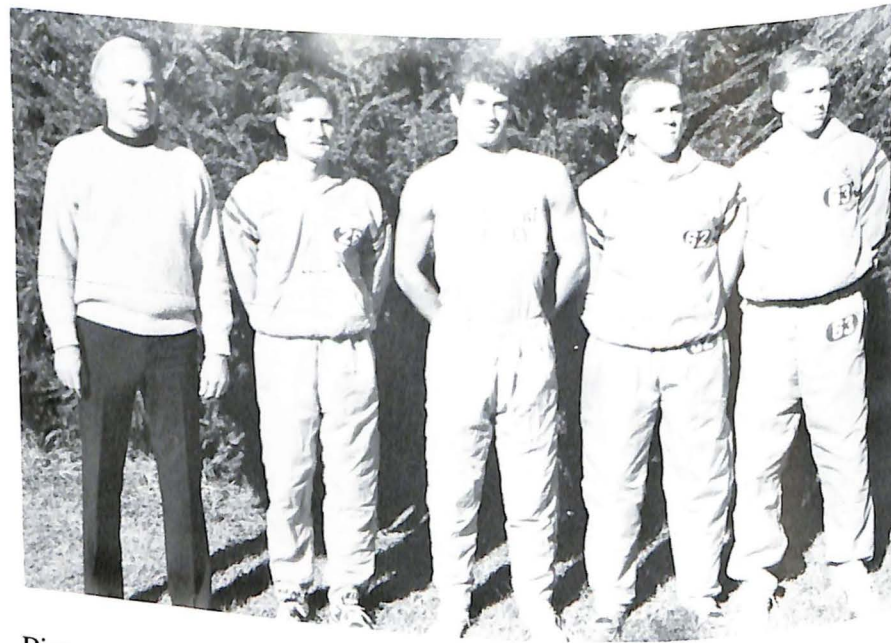
CROSS COUNTRY: OVER HILL AND DALE

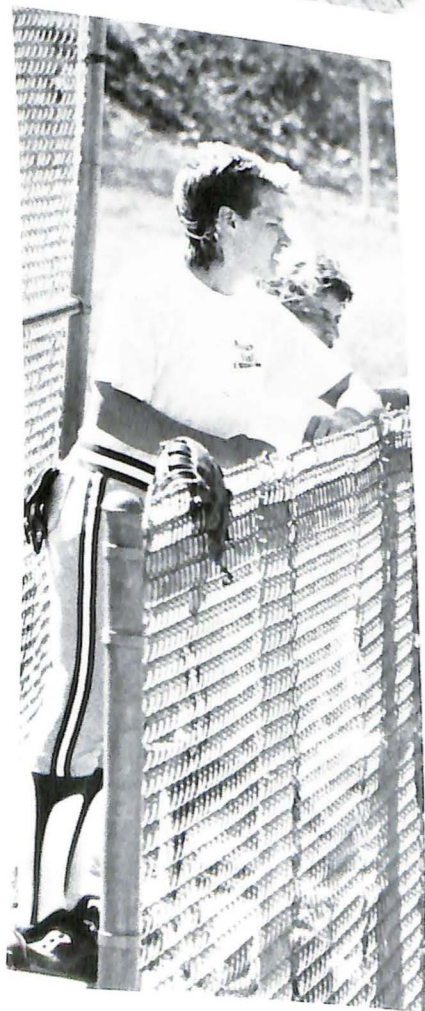
The 1990 year was astonishing for MVC Lady Vikings. They led this season with a 13-8 record, placing them second in the conference and eighth in district.

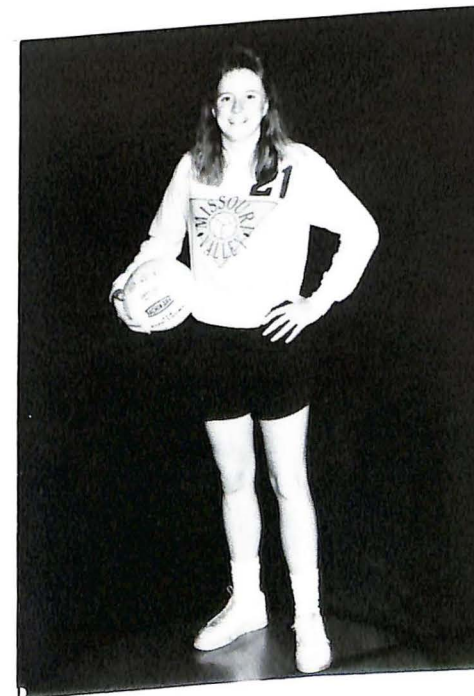

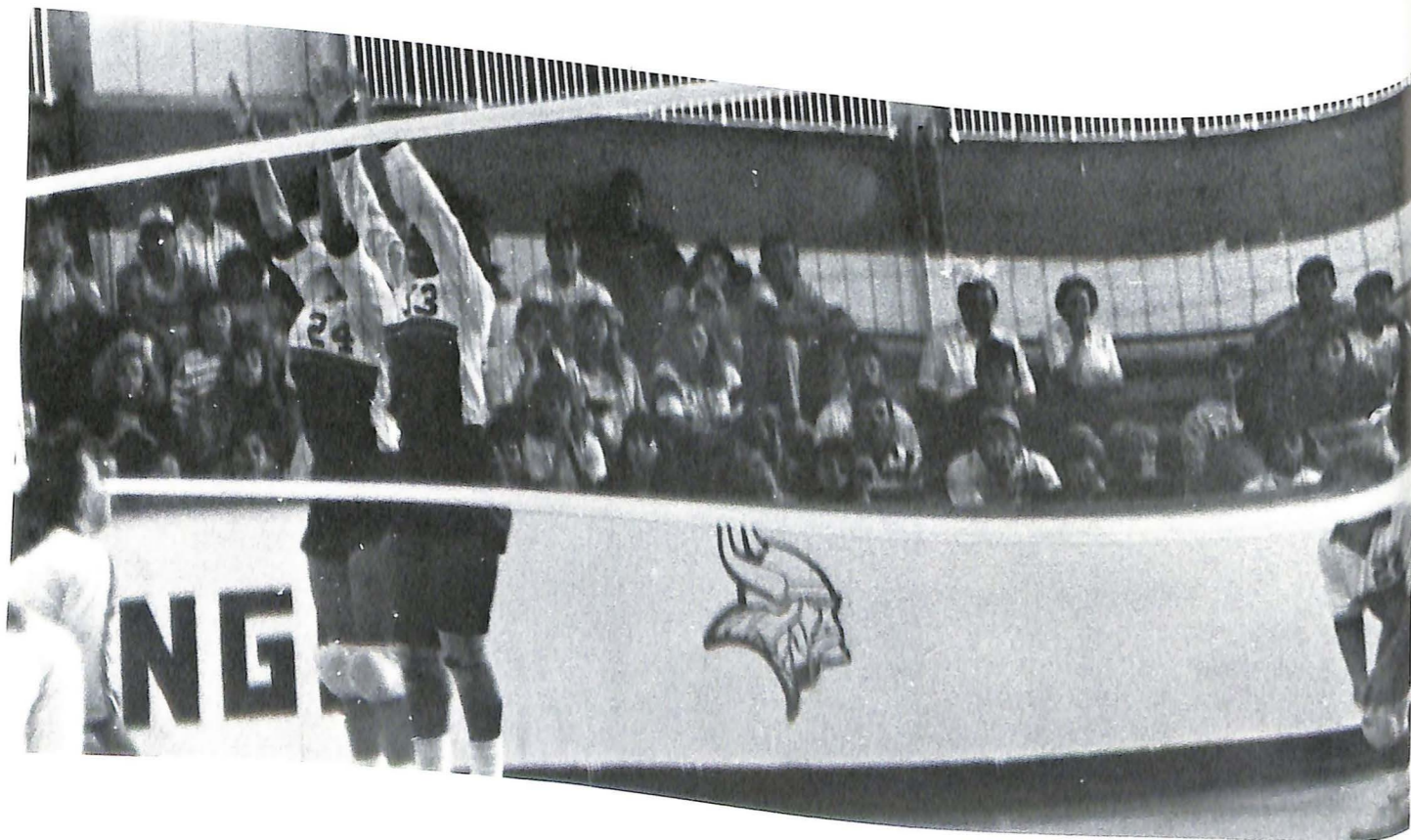


Volleyball Posts Winning Season

Coach Vickie McCloud's Lady Vikings closed out the 1990 volleyball campaign with a record of 19 wins and 16 losses.

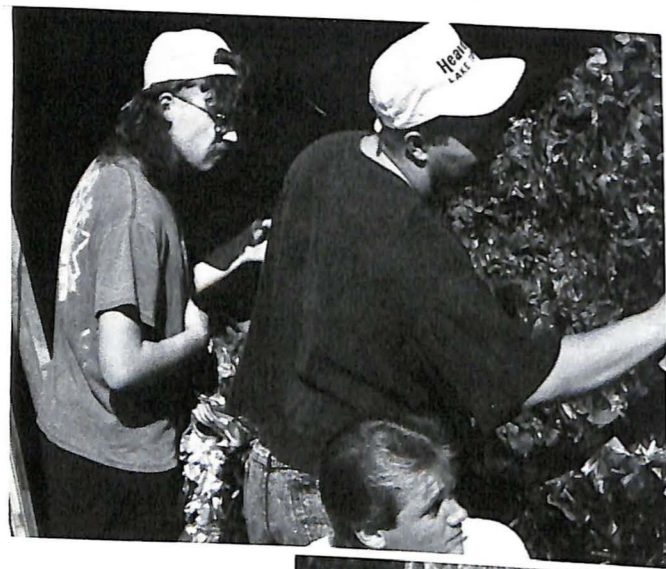
In the final volleyball action of the season, the MVC women defeated the Lady Owls of Tarkio College.
