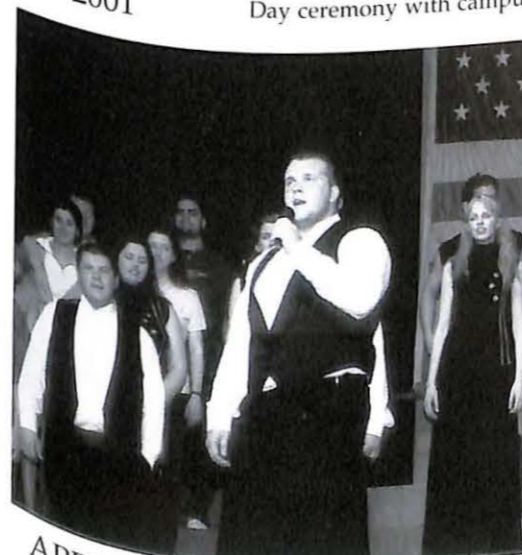

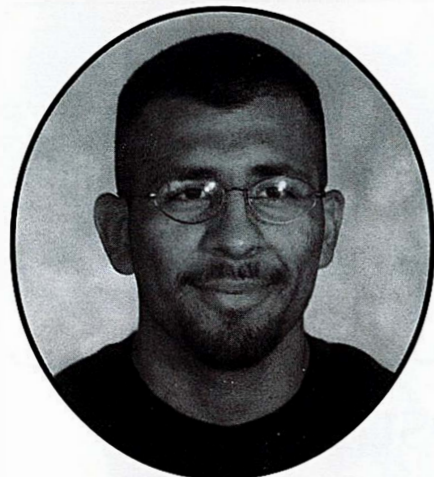

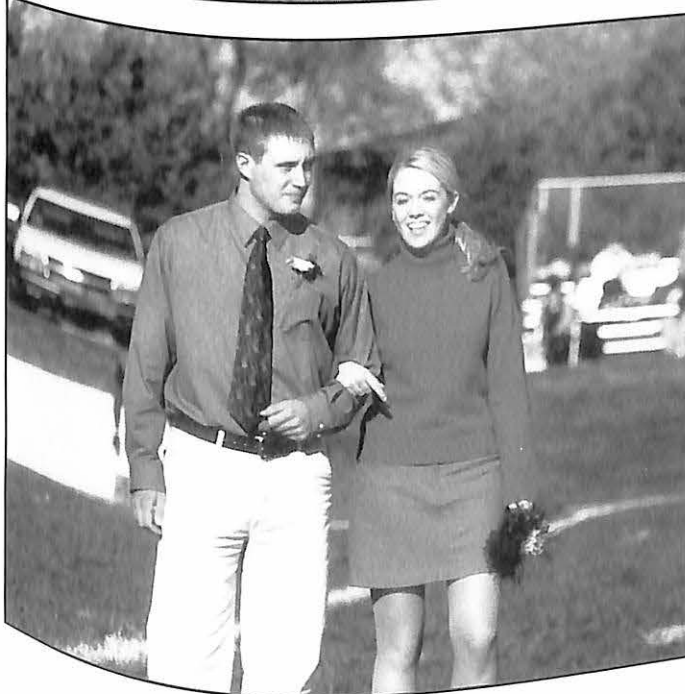

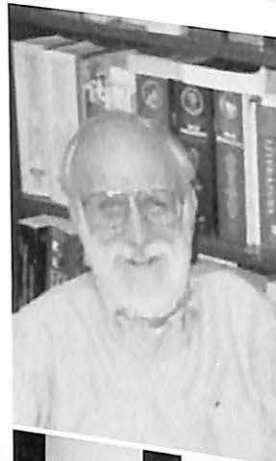

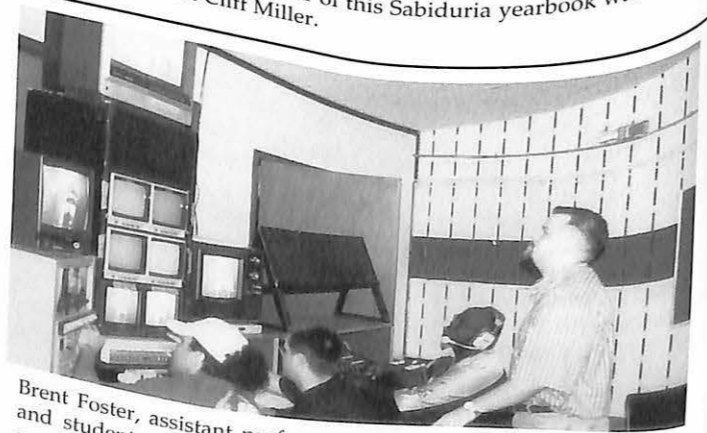

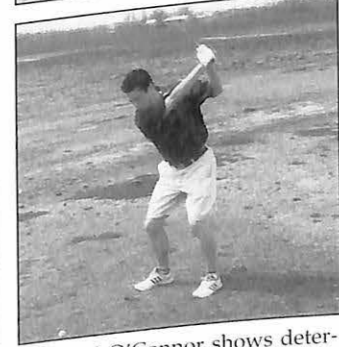

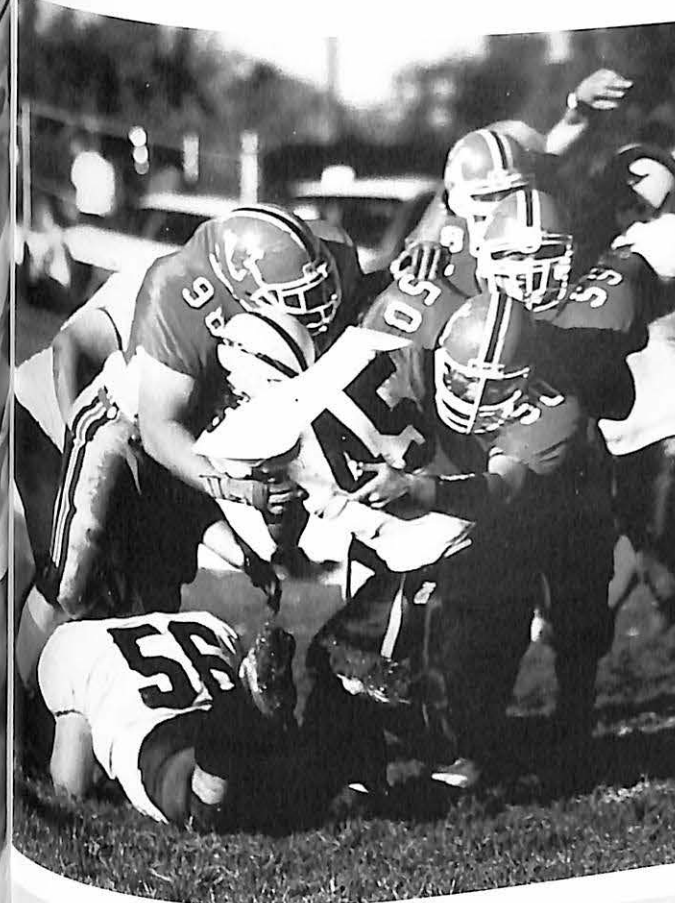

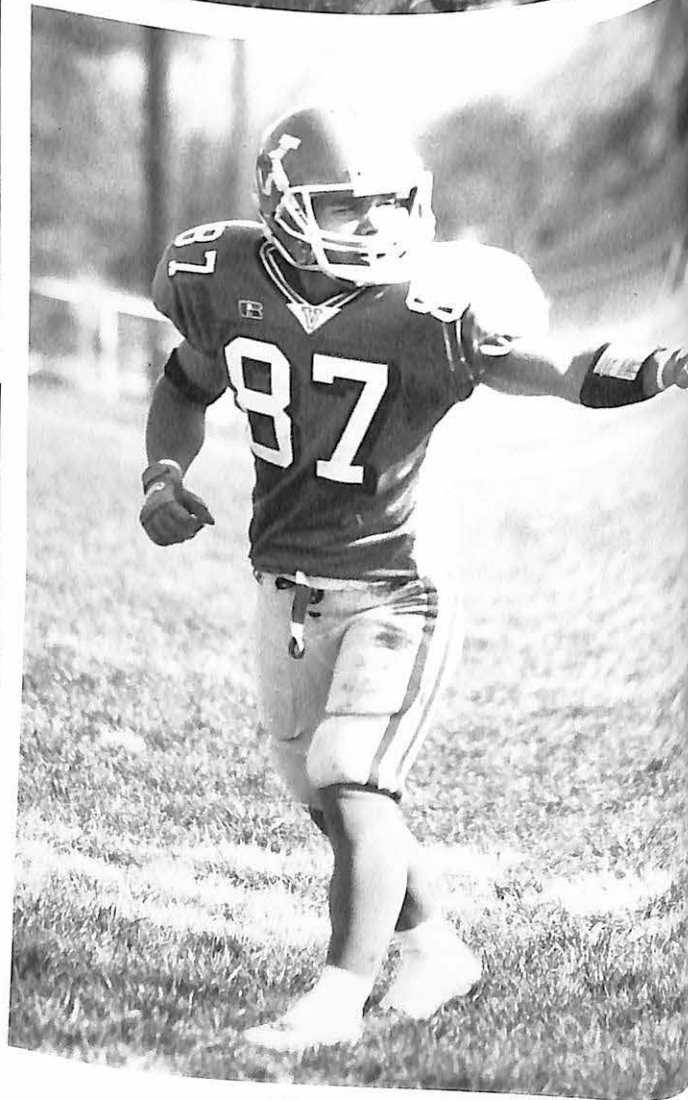

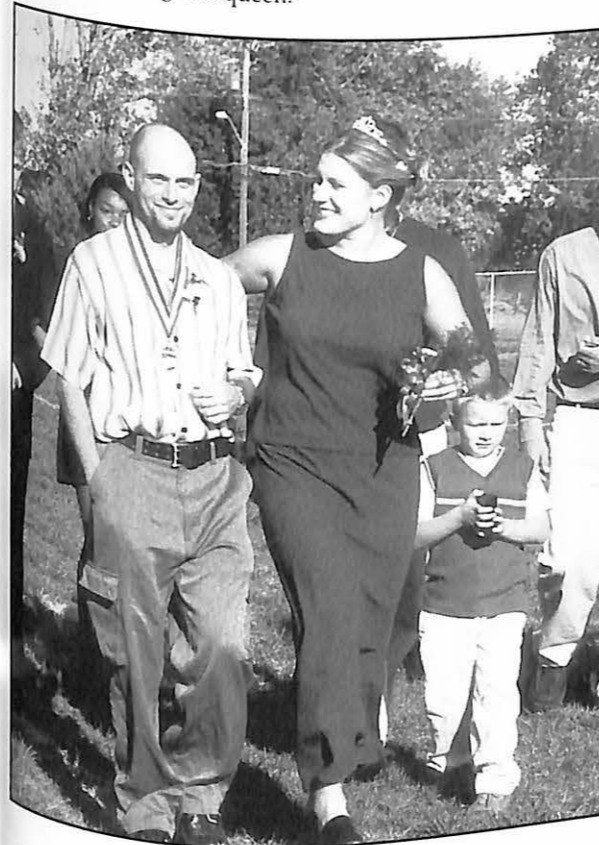

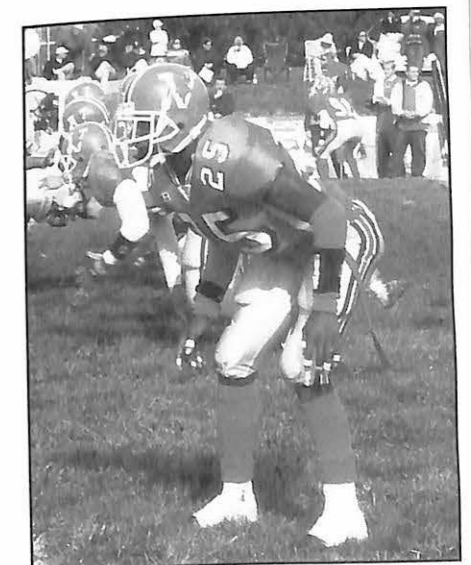

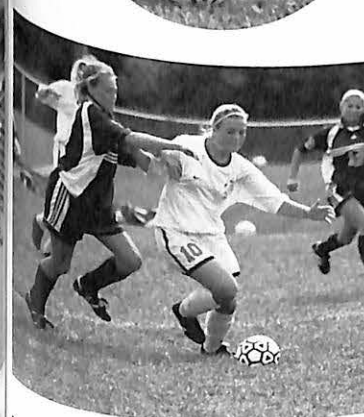

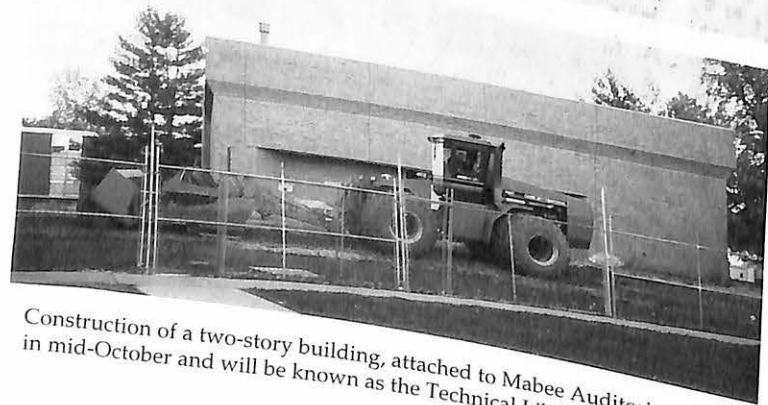

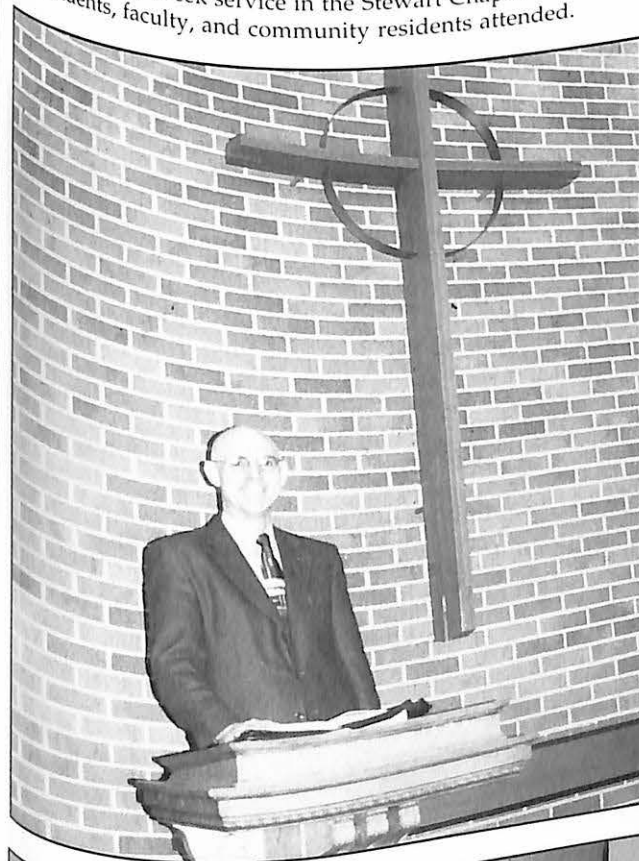

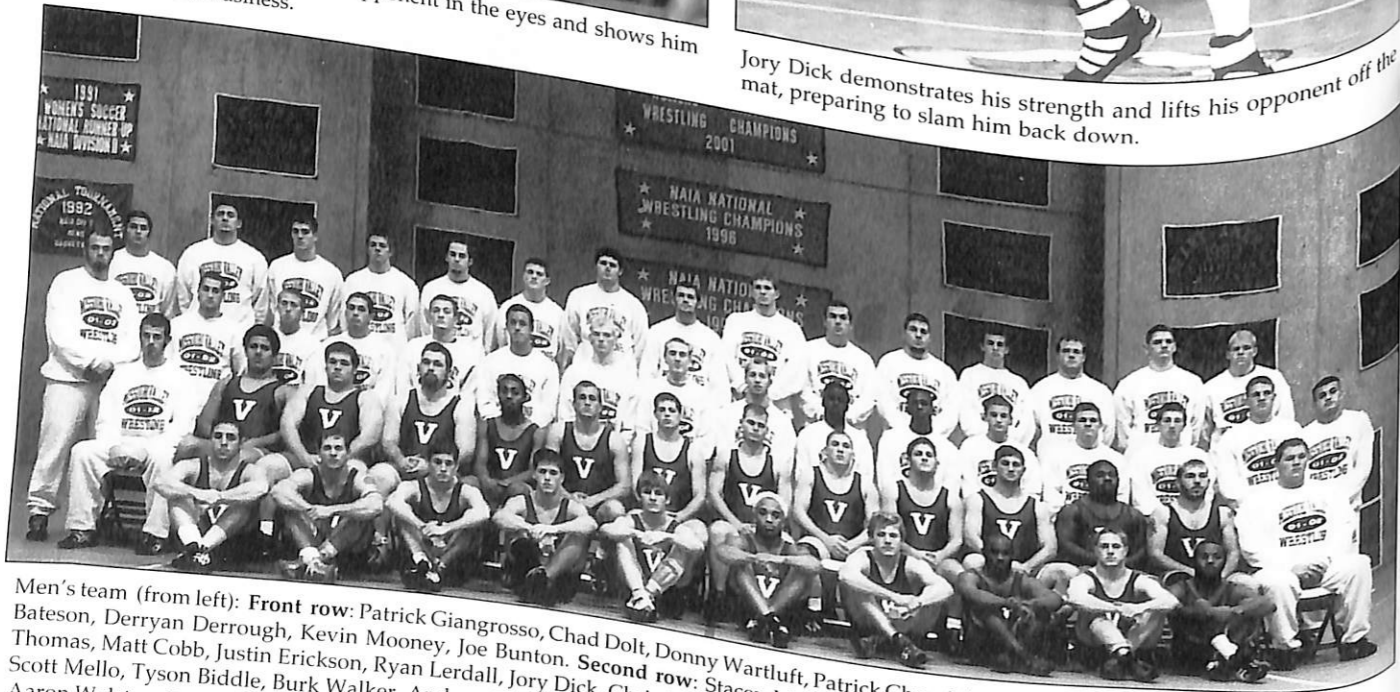

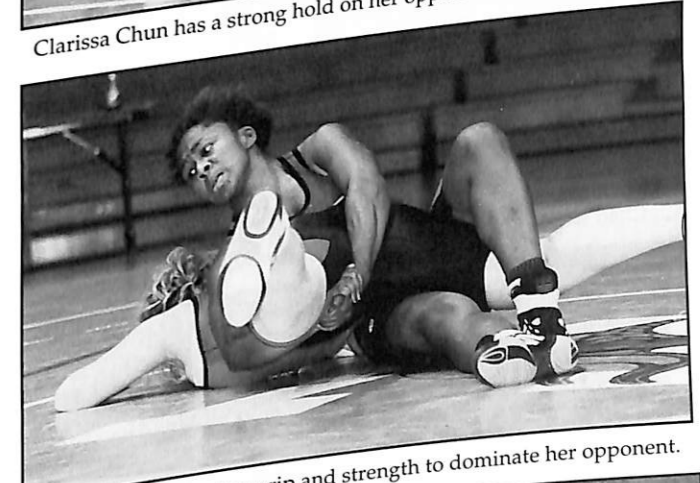

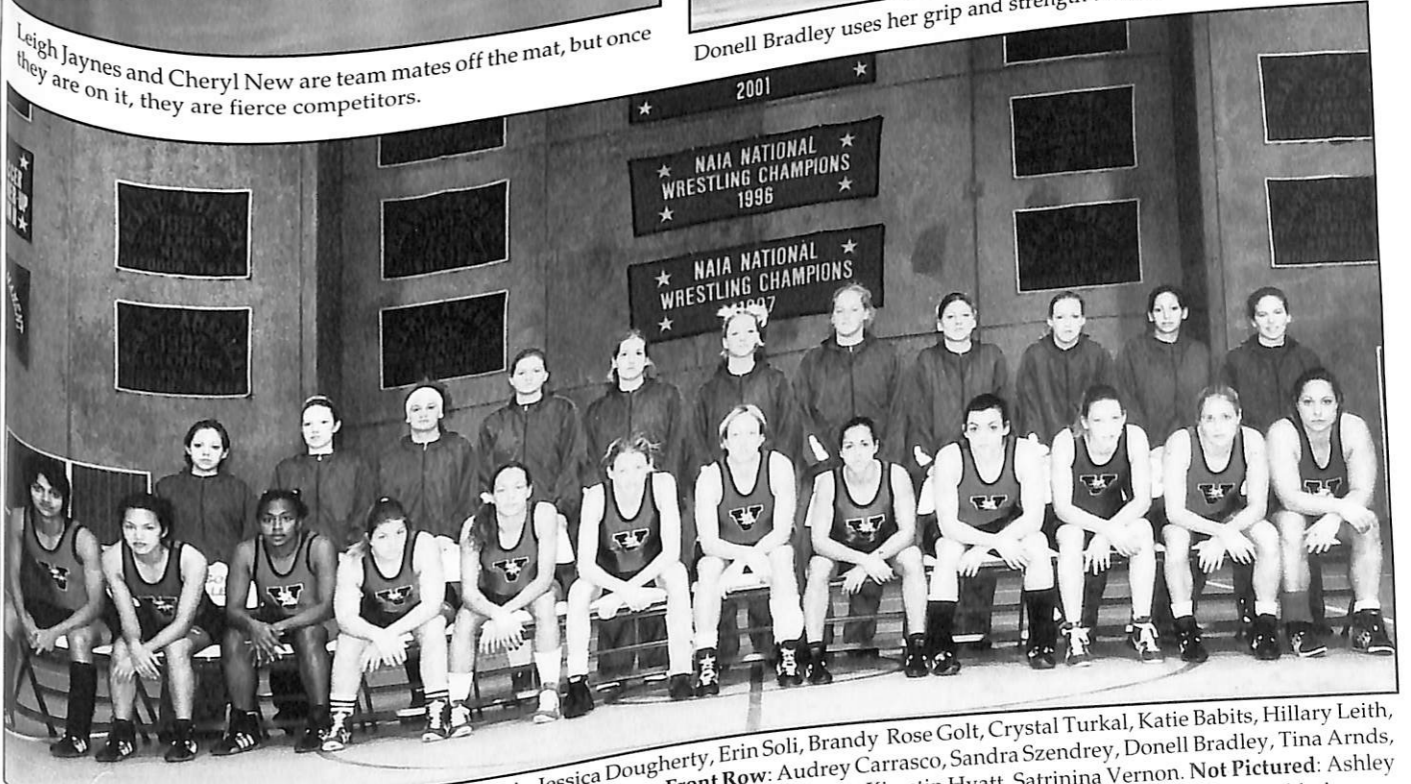

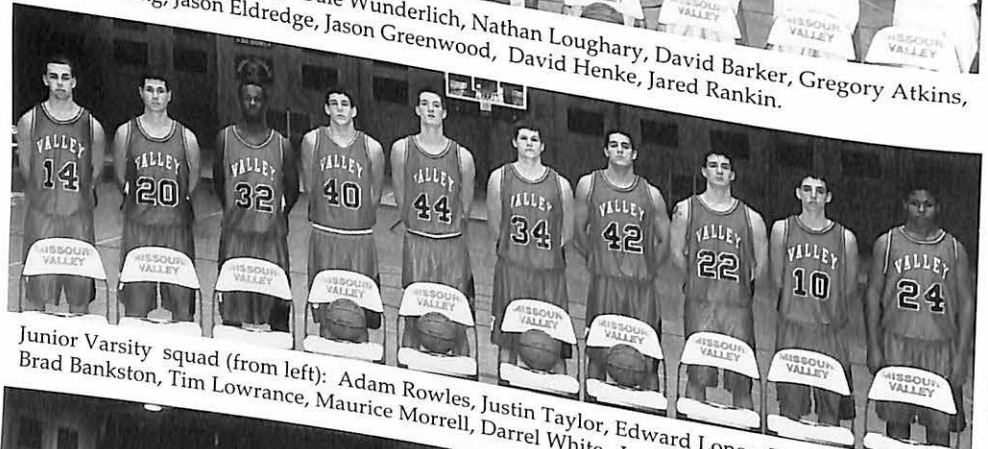

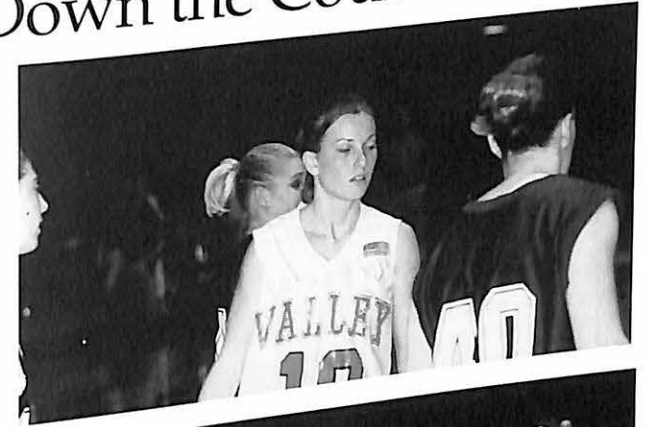

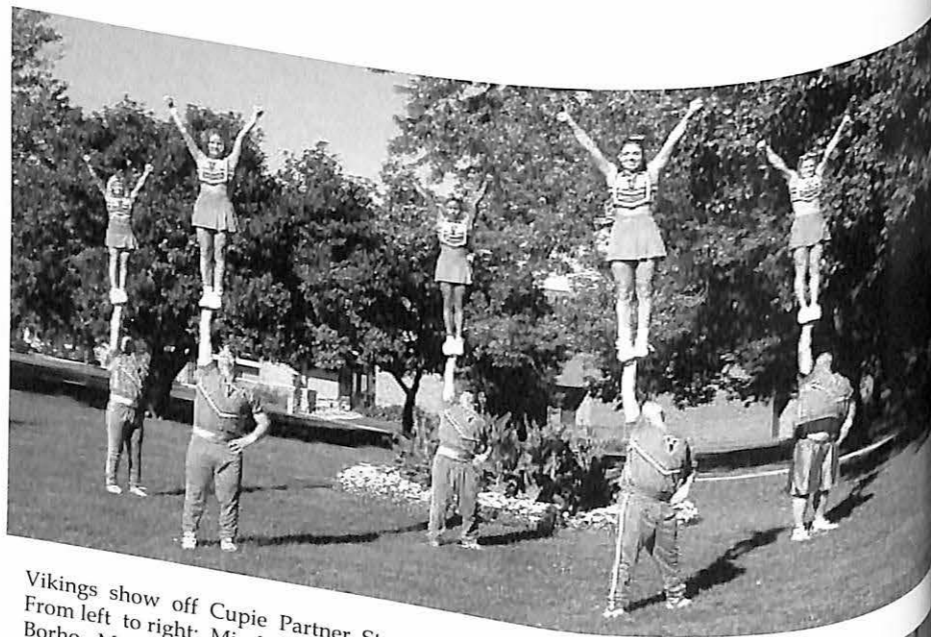

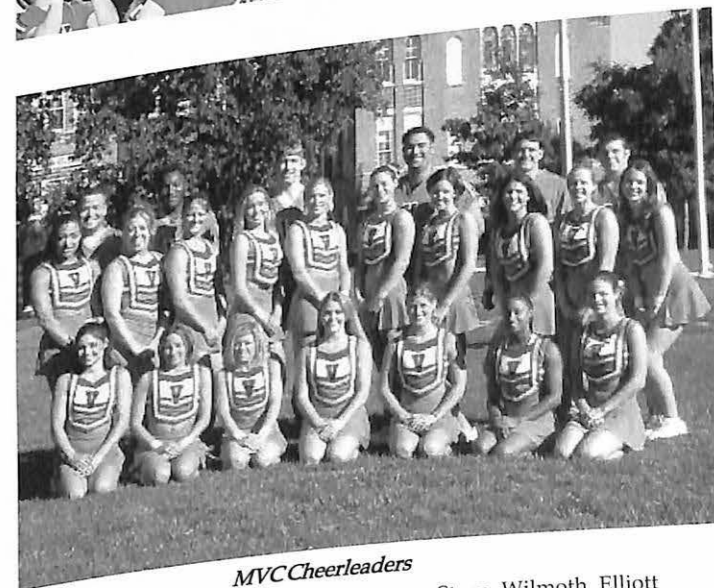

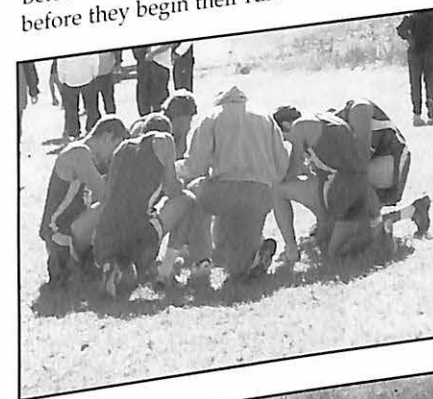

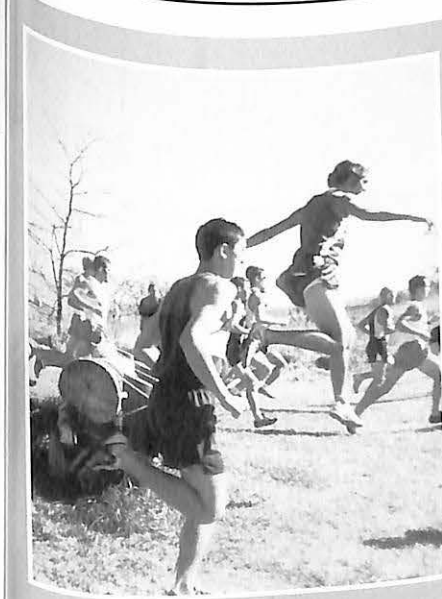

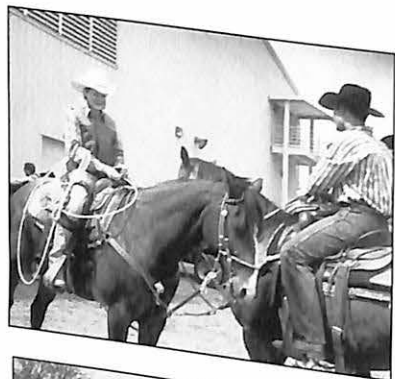

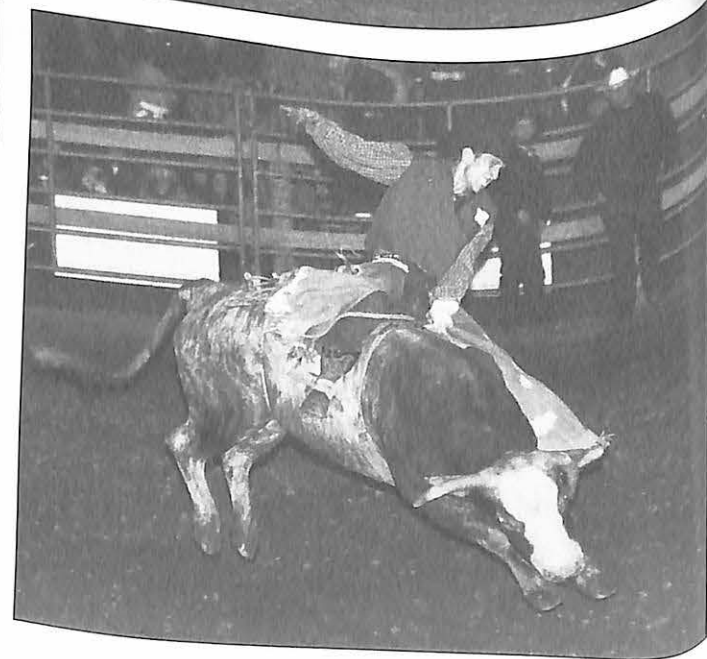

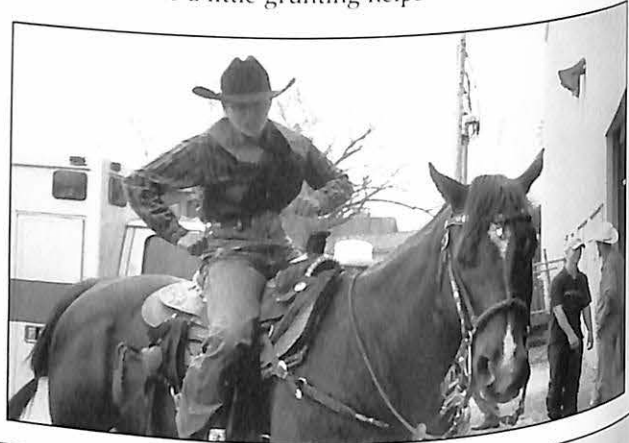

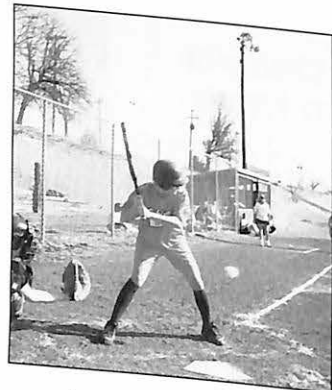

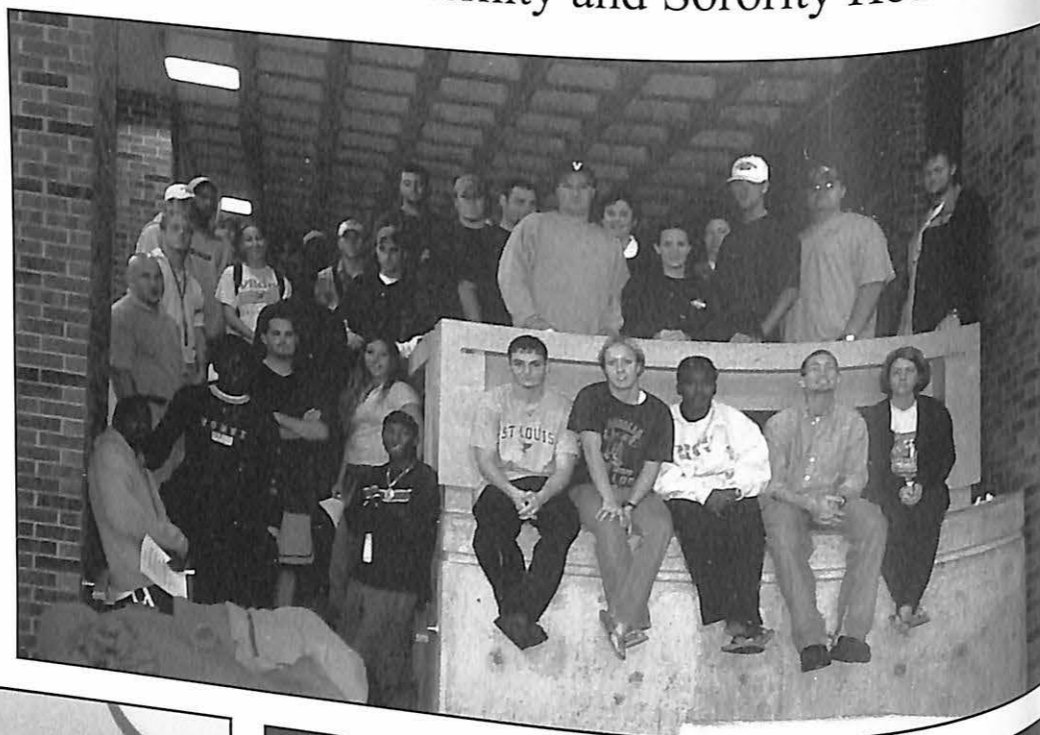

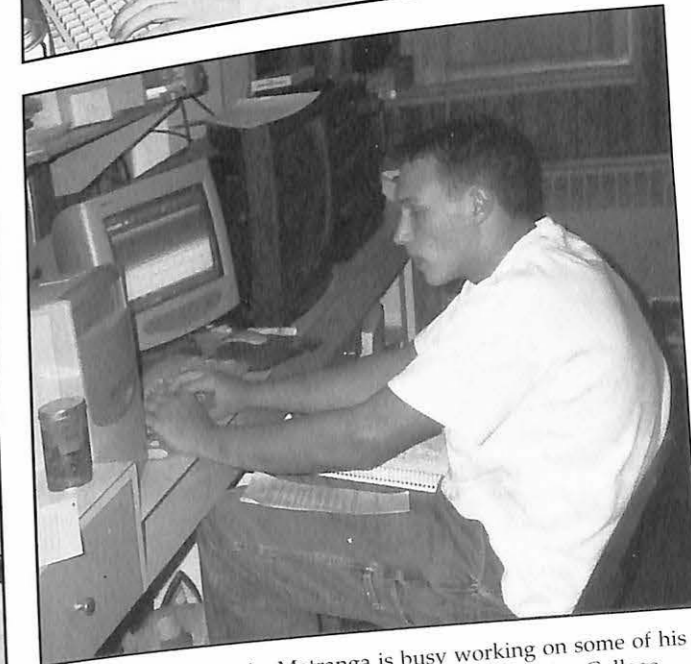

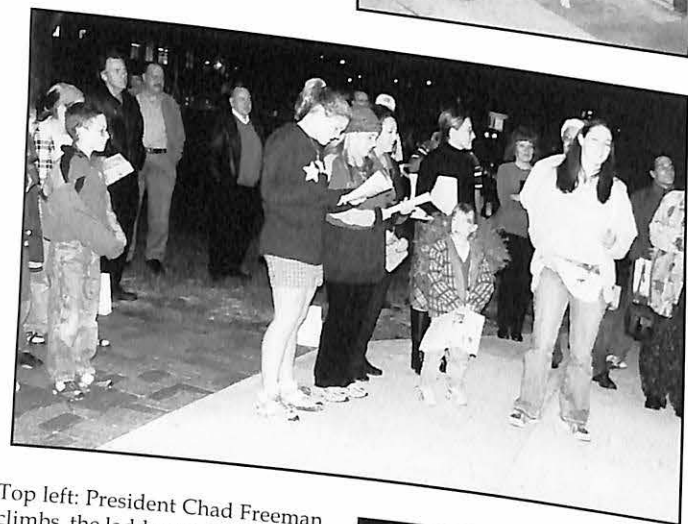

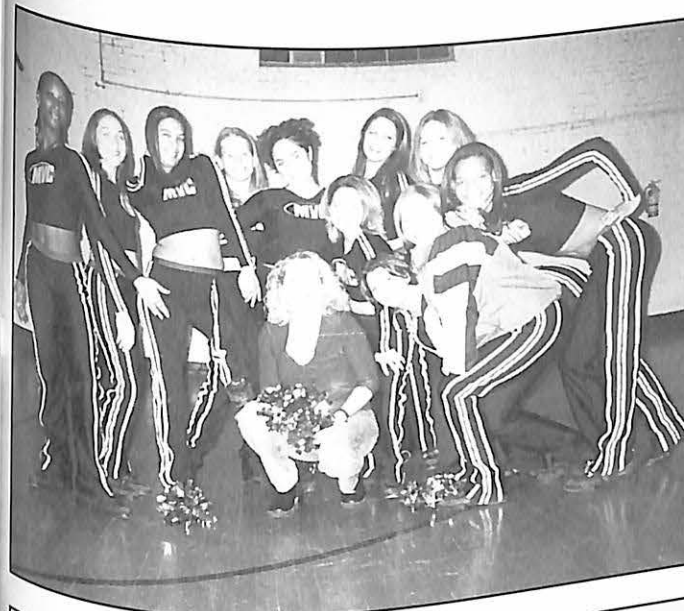

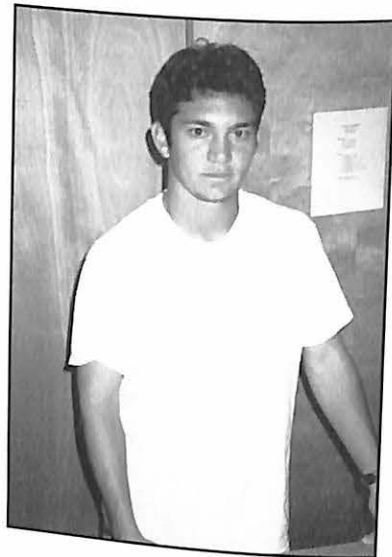

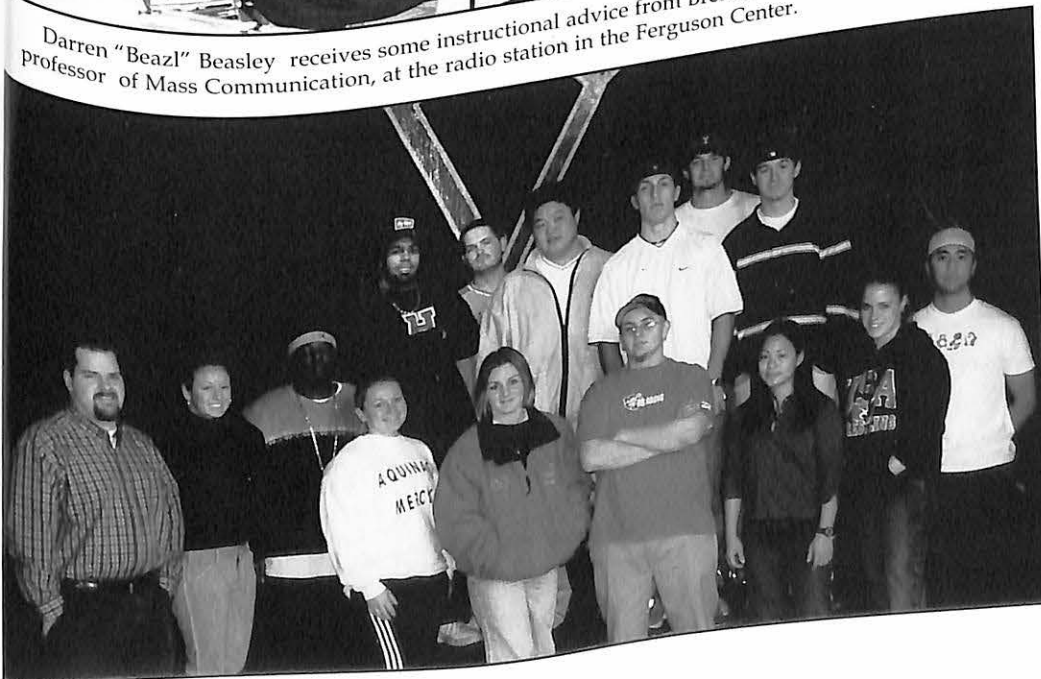

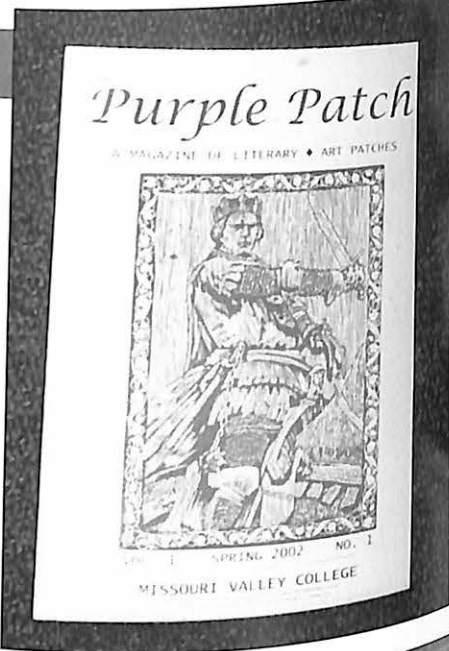

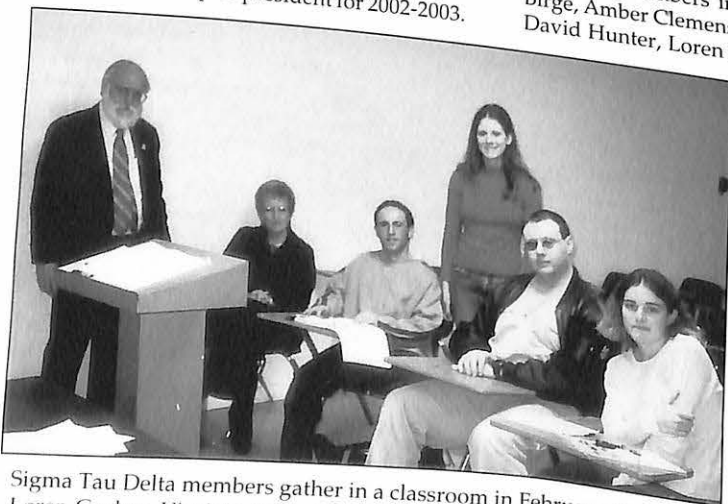

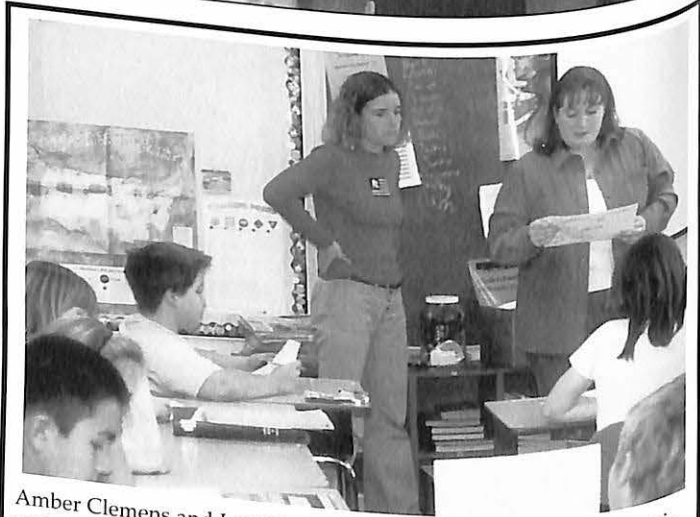
Accounting Club, SIFE team-up for lessons about business

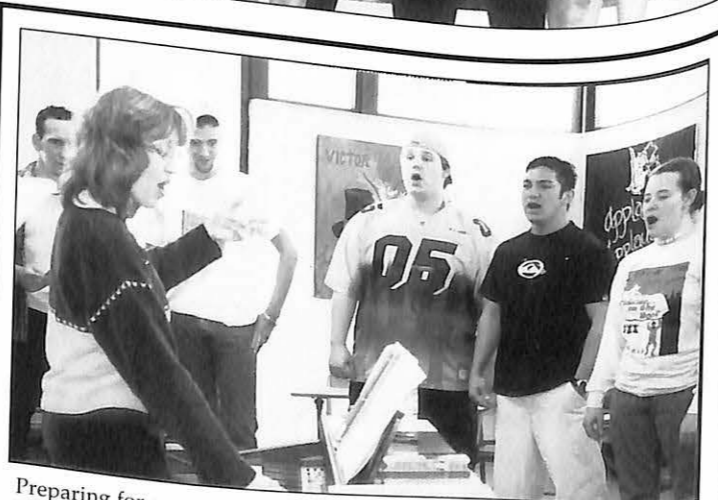

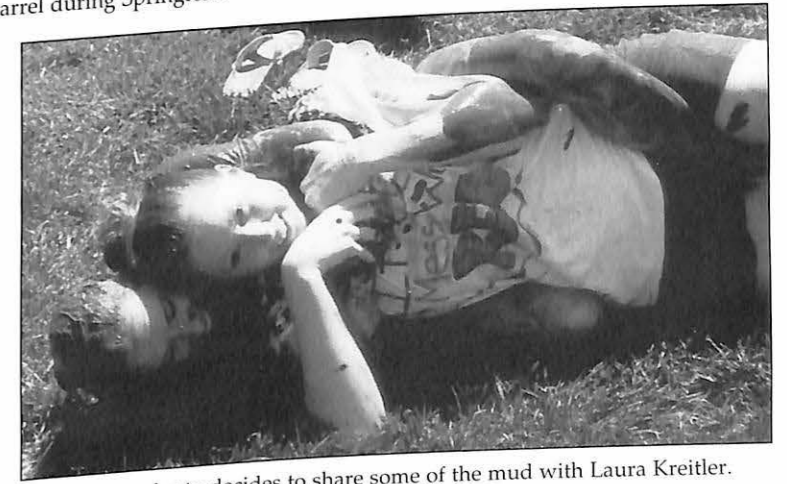

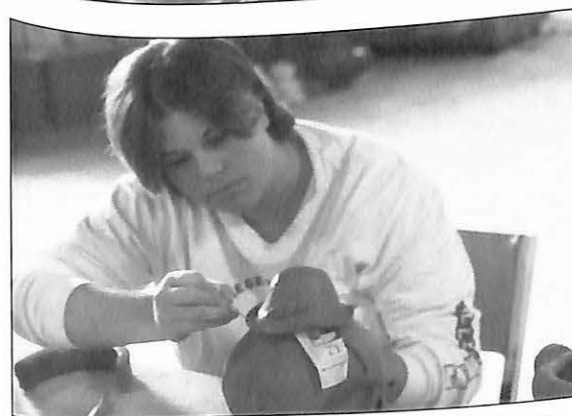
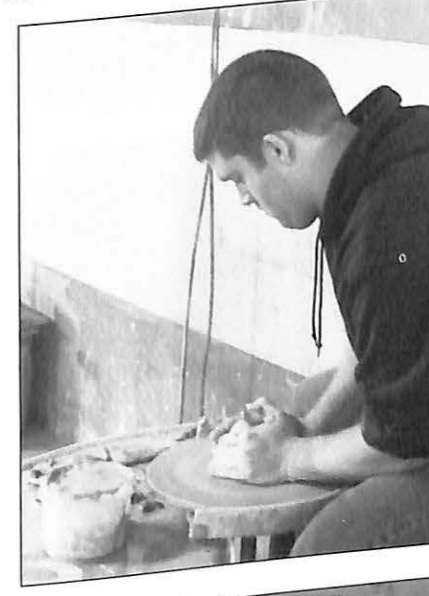

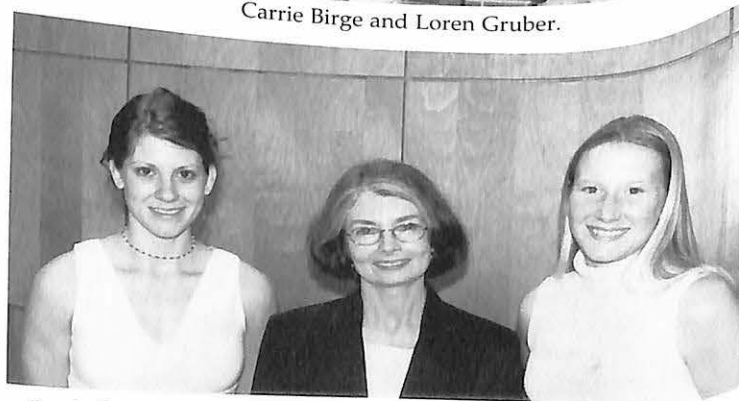

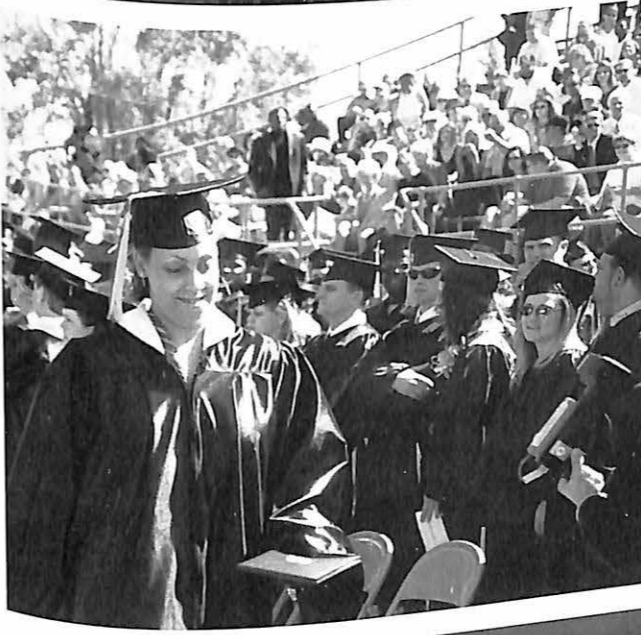
