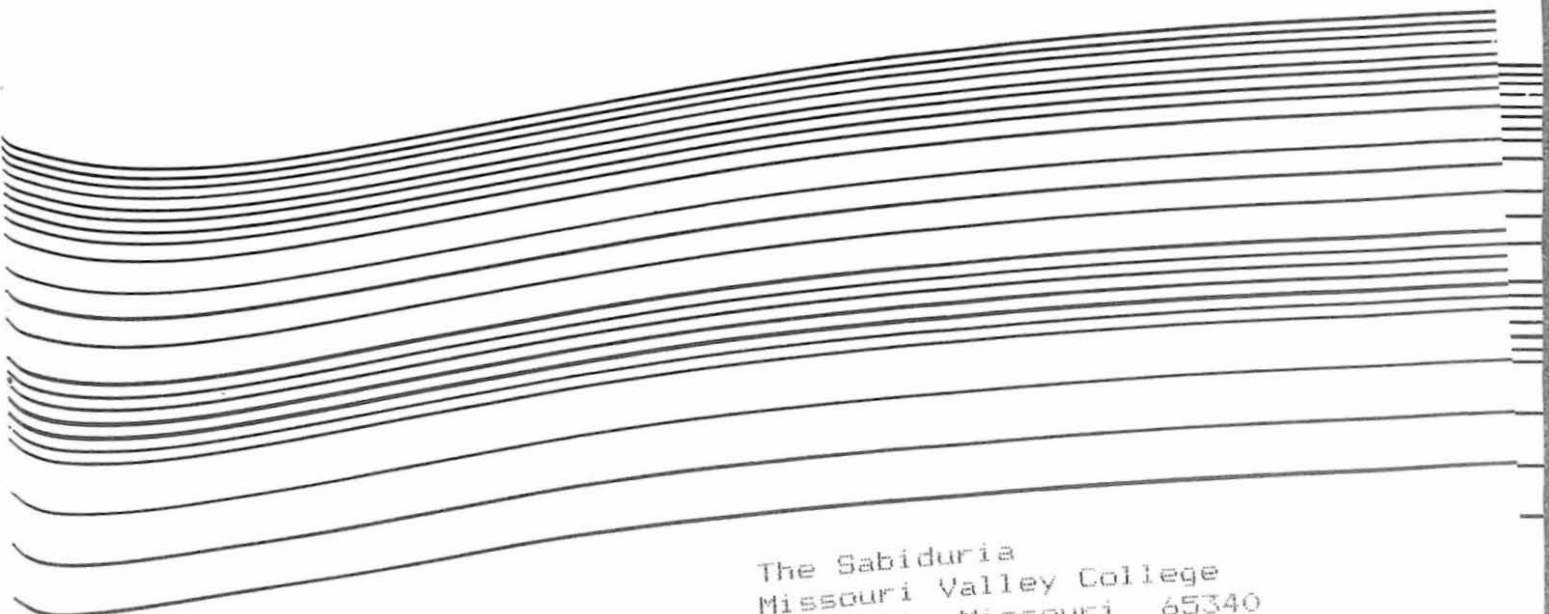

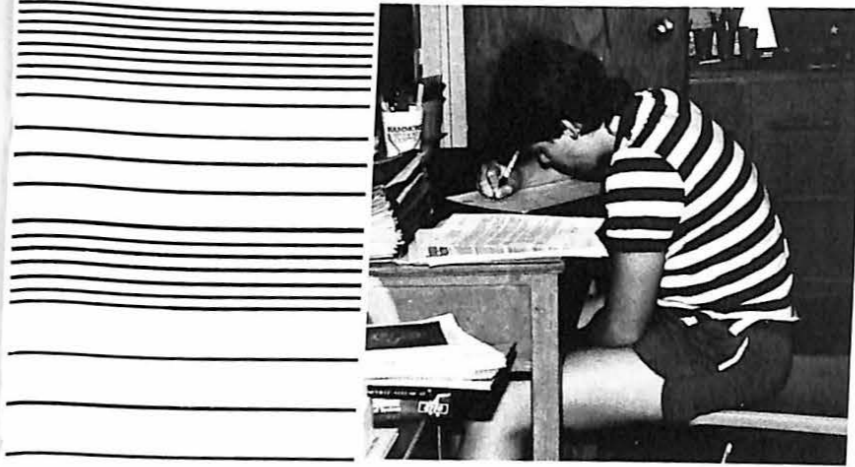

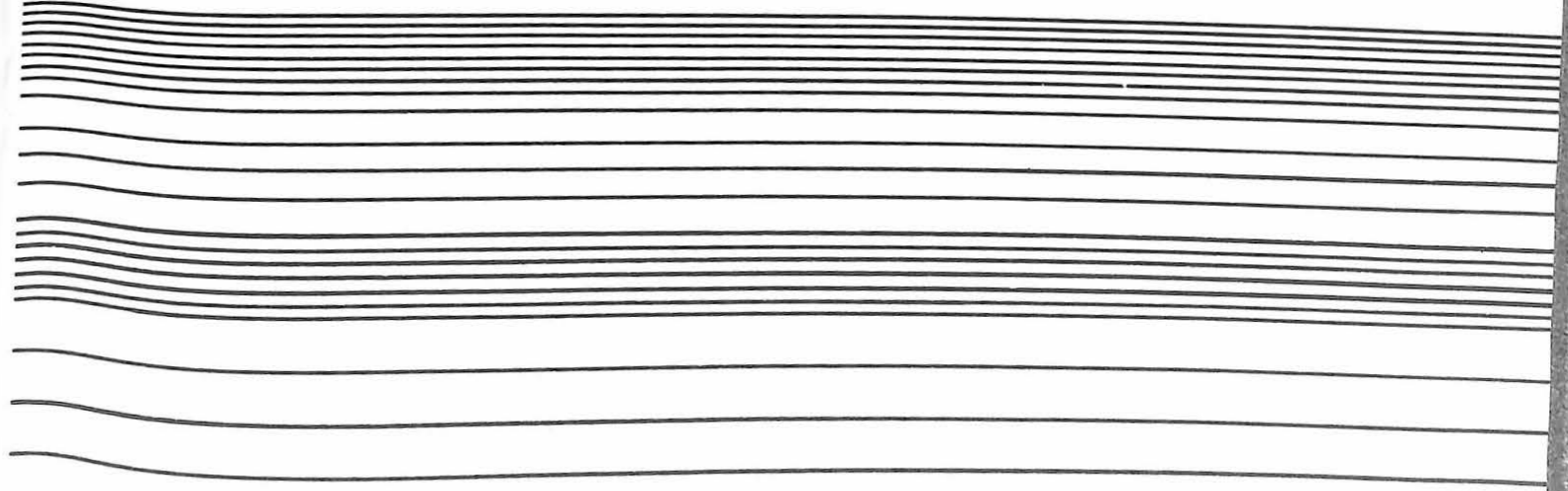


"WELCOME BACK!" President Earl Reeves welcomes students back home for a new school year at MVC.

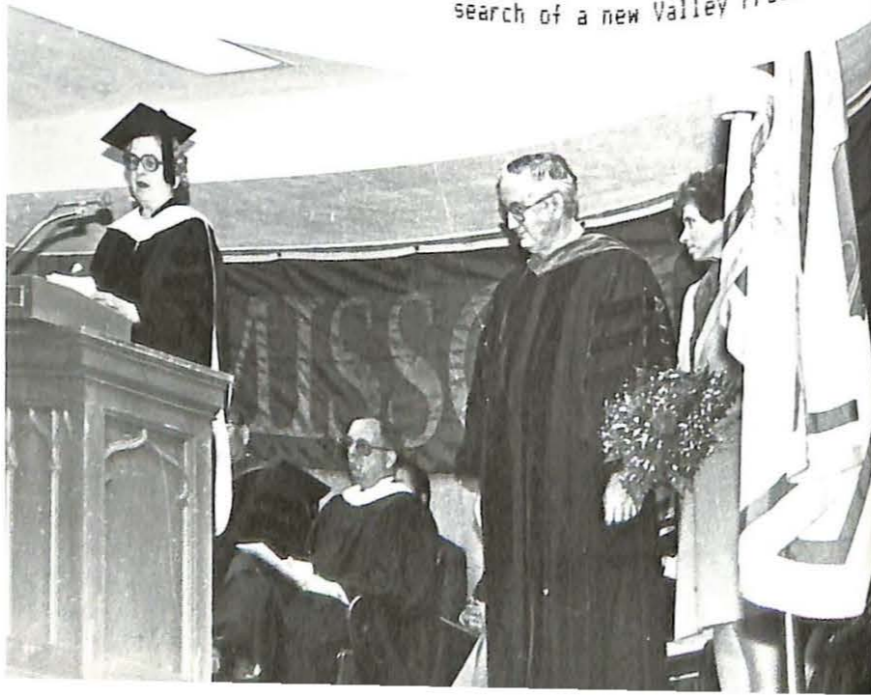

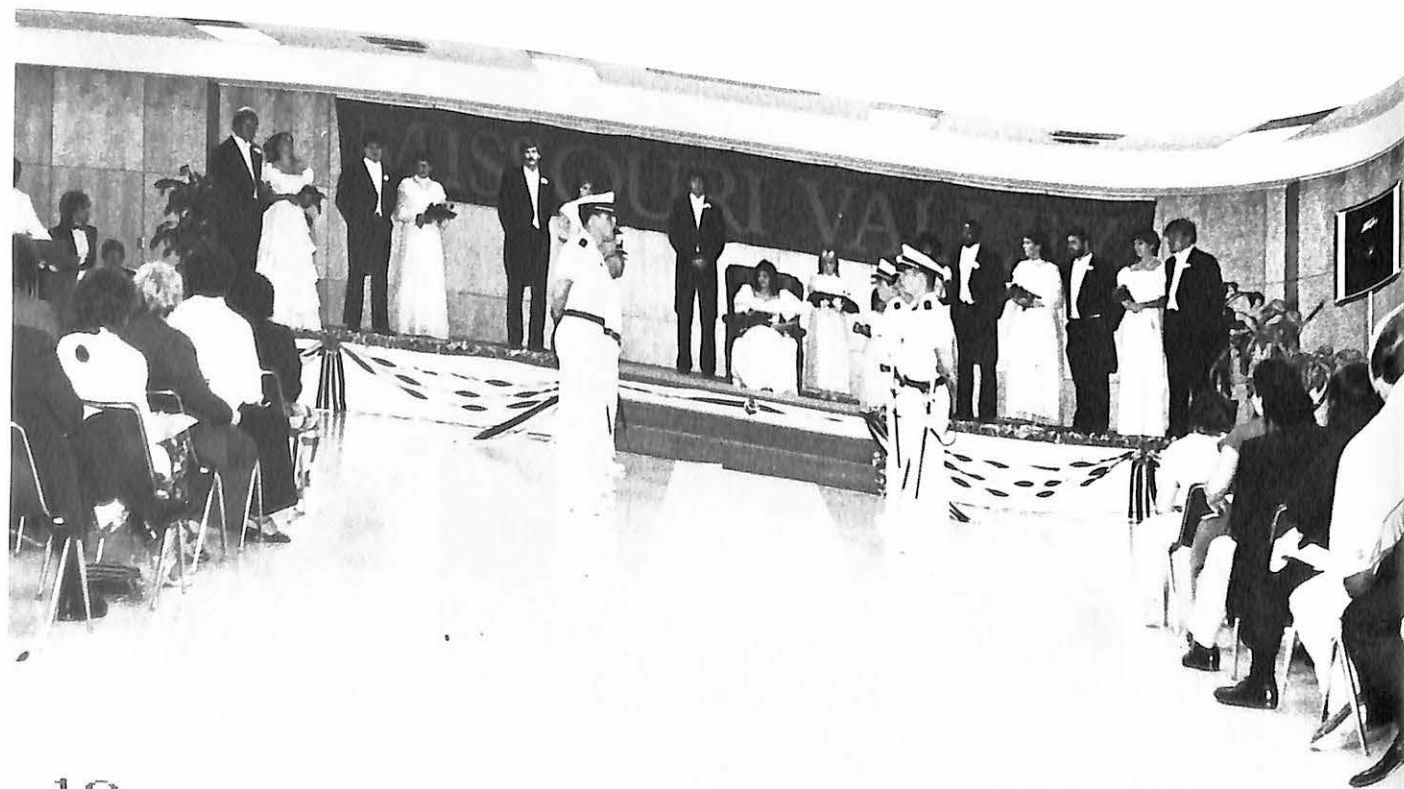

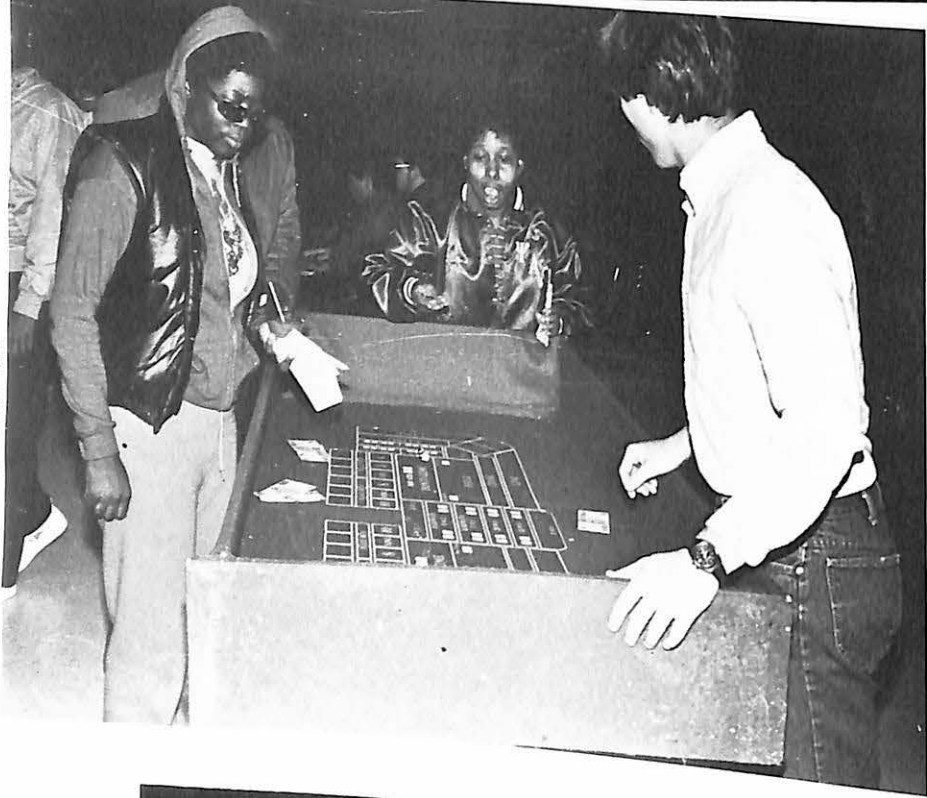

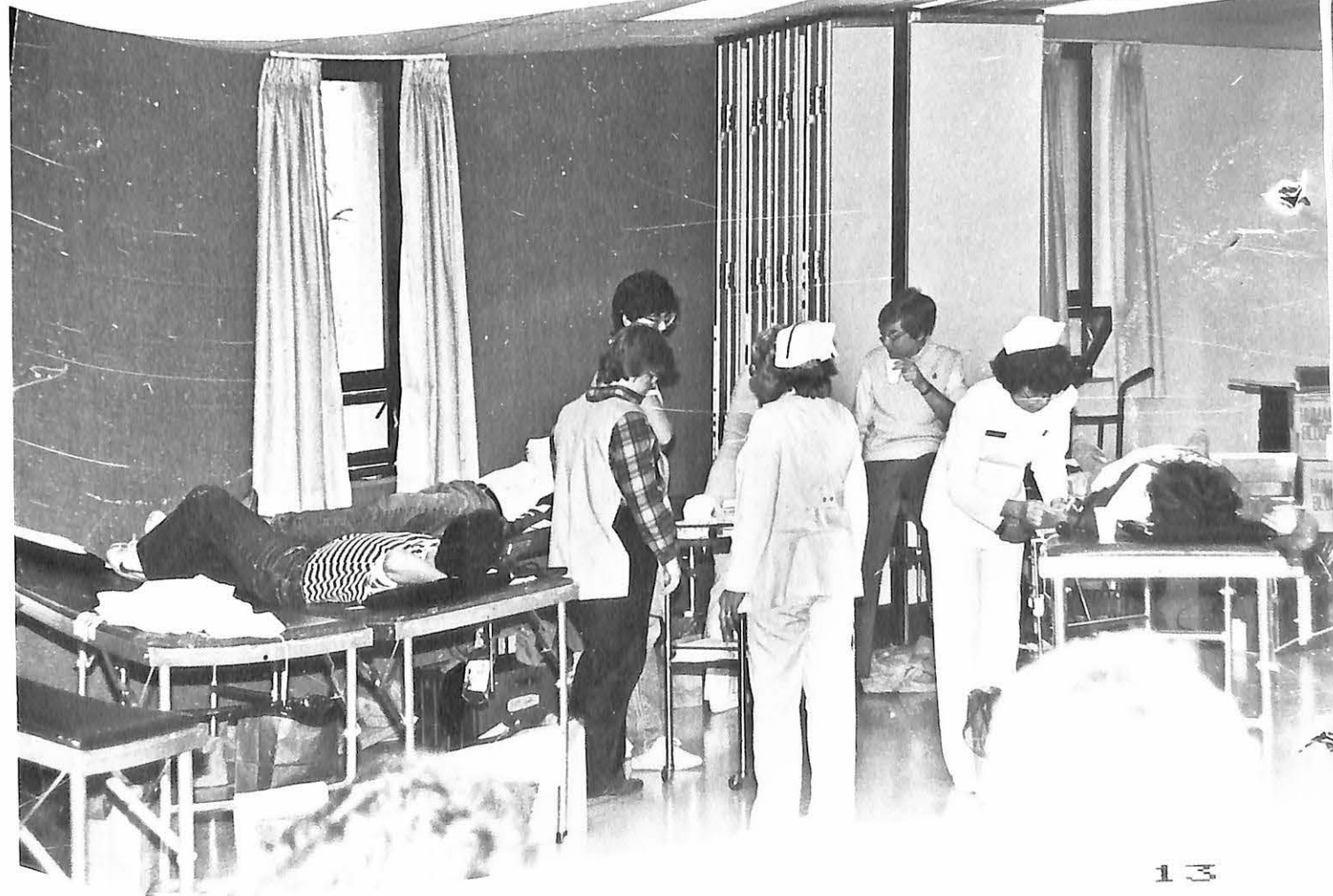

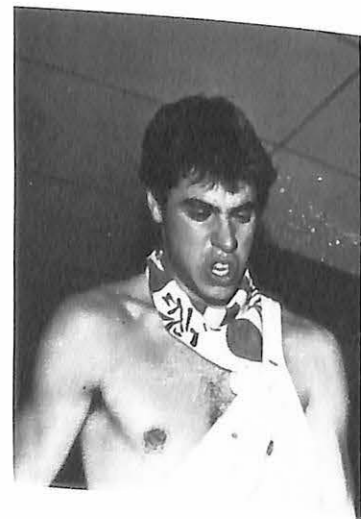

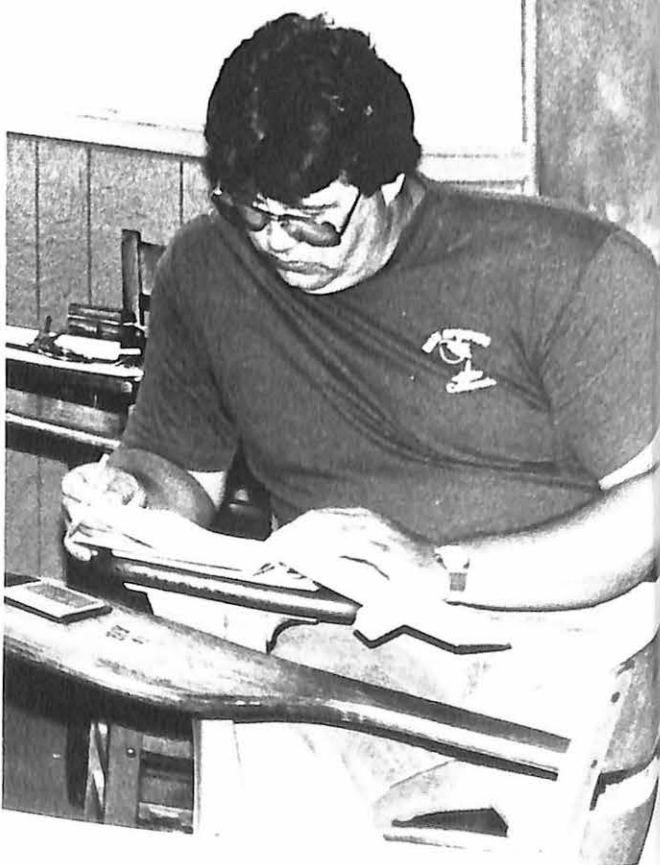

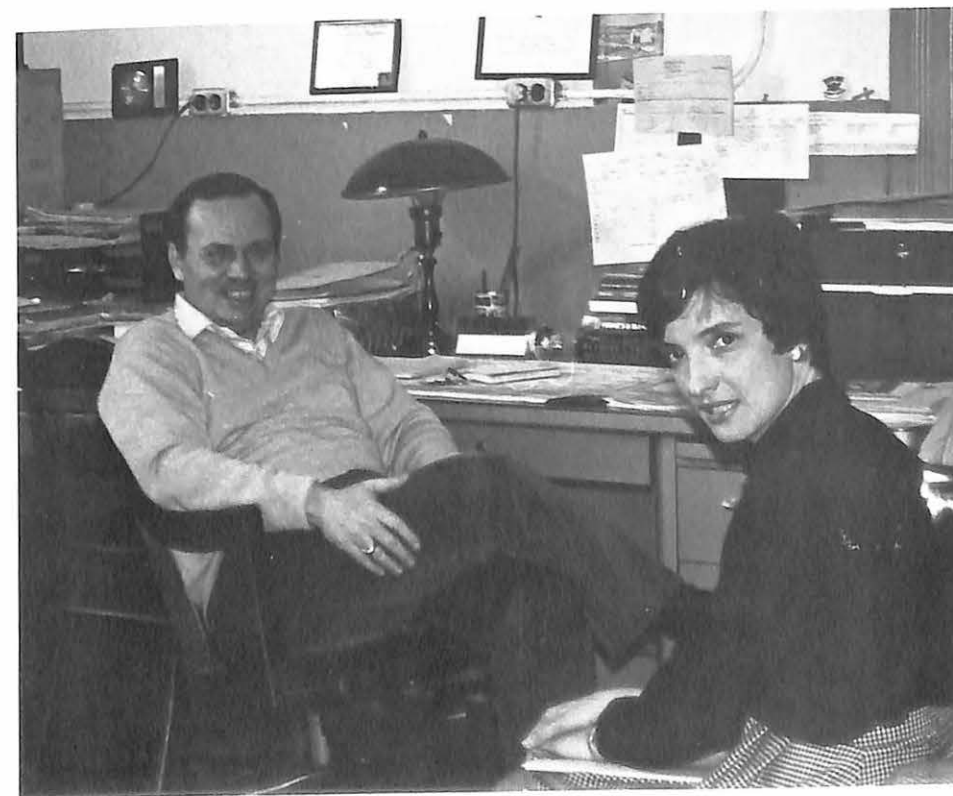

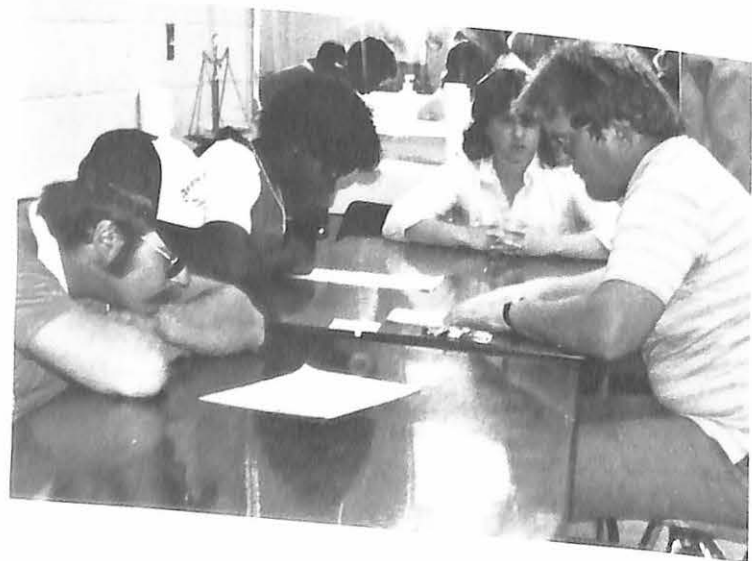

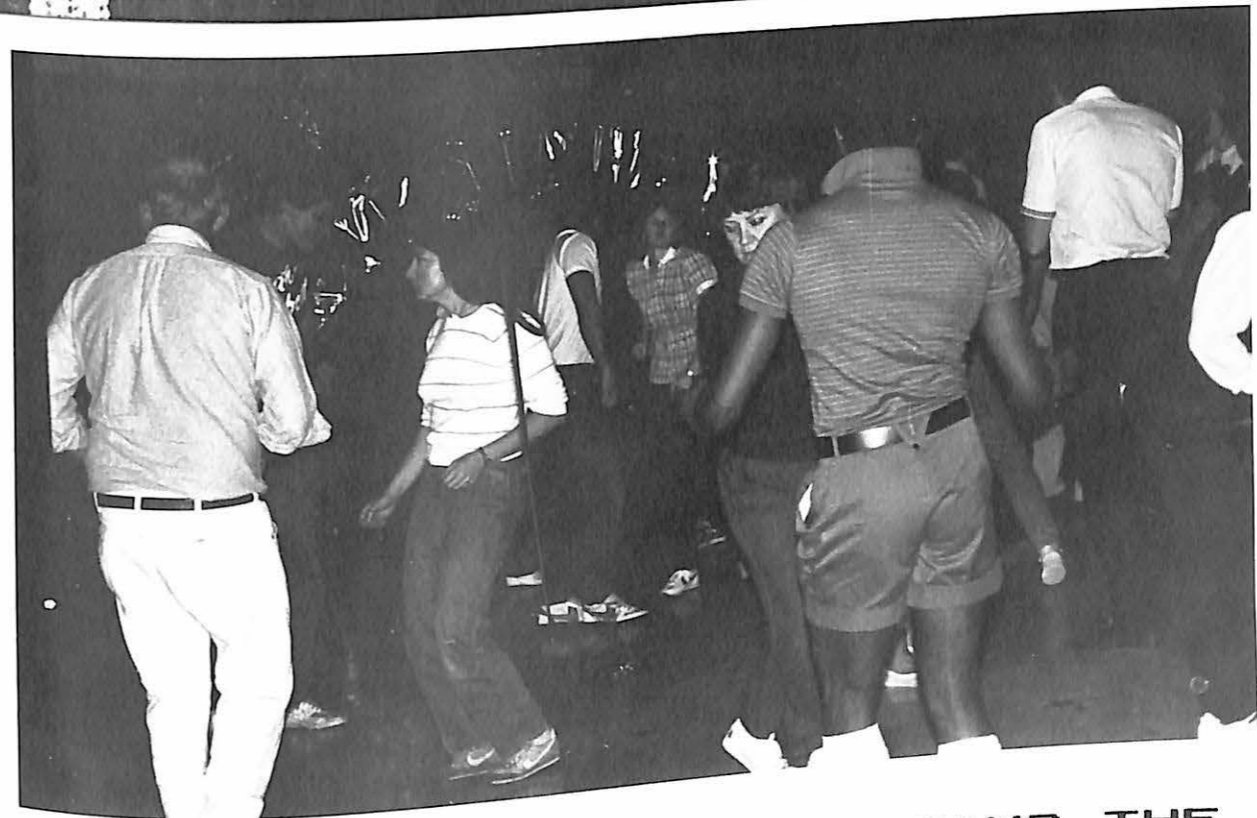

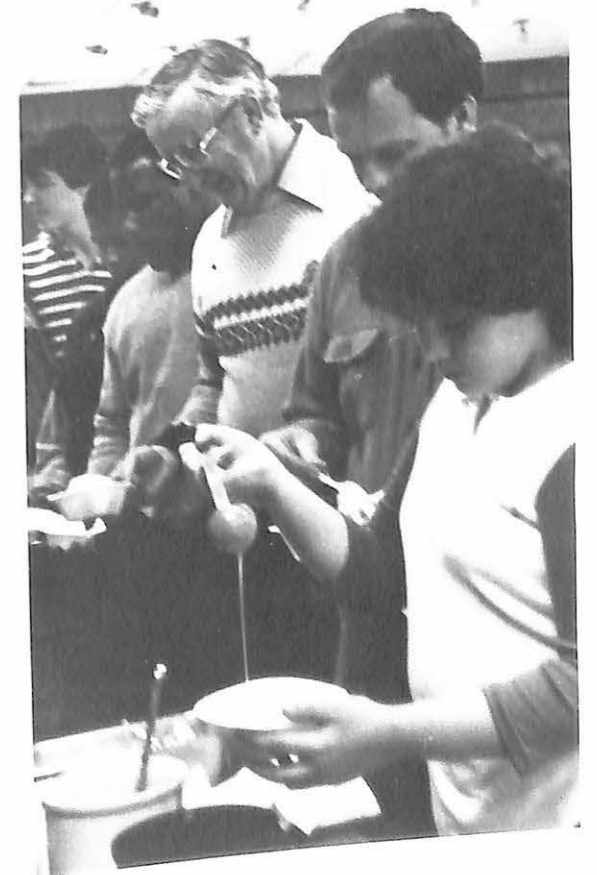

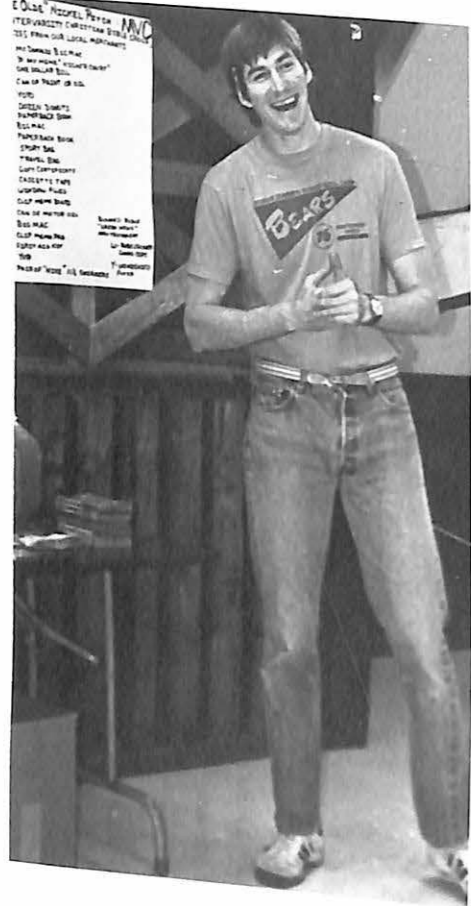

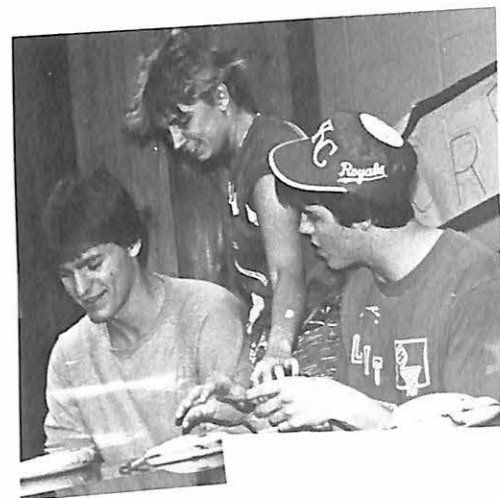

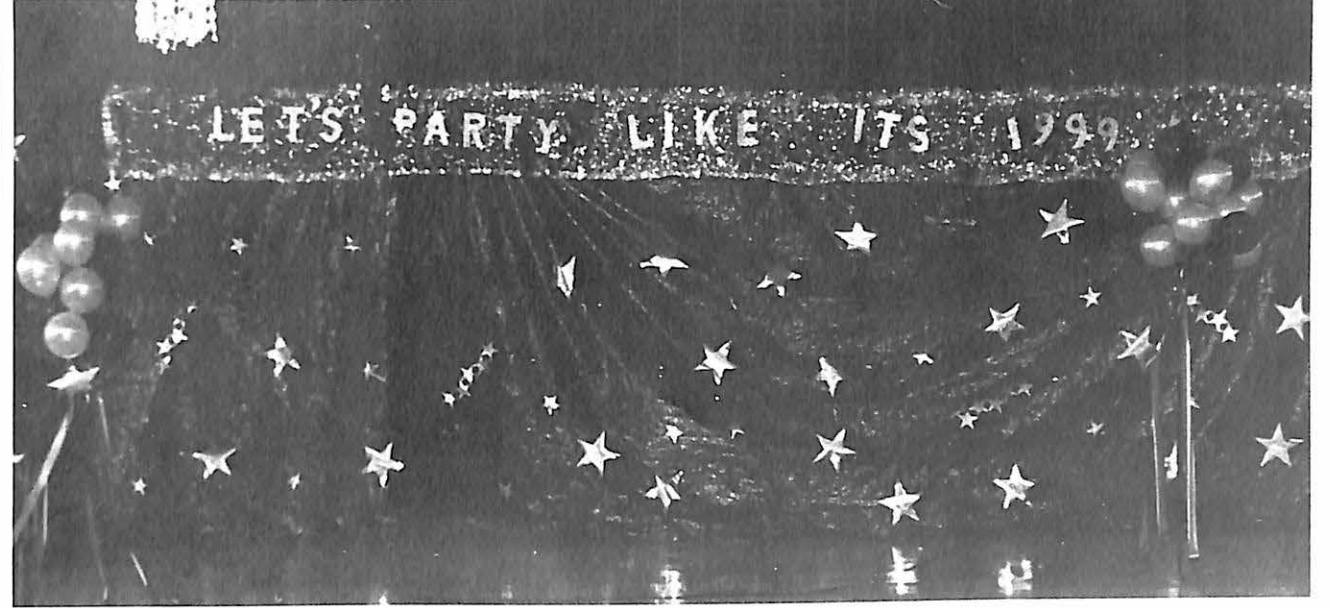

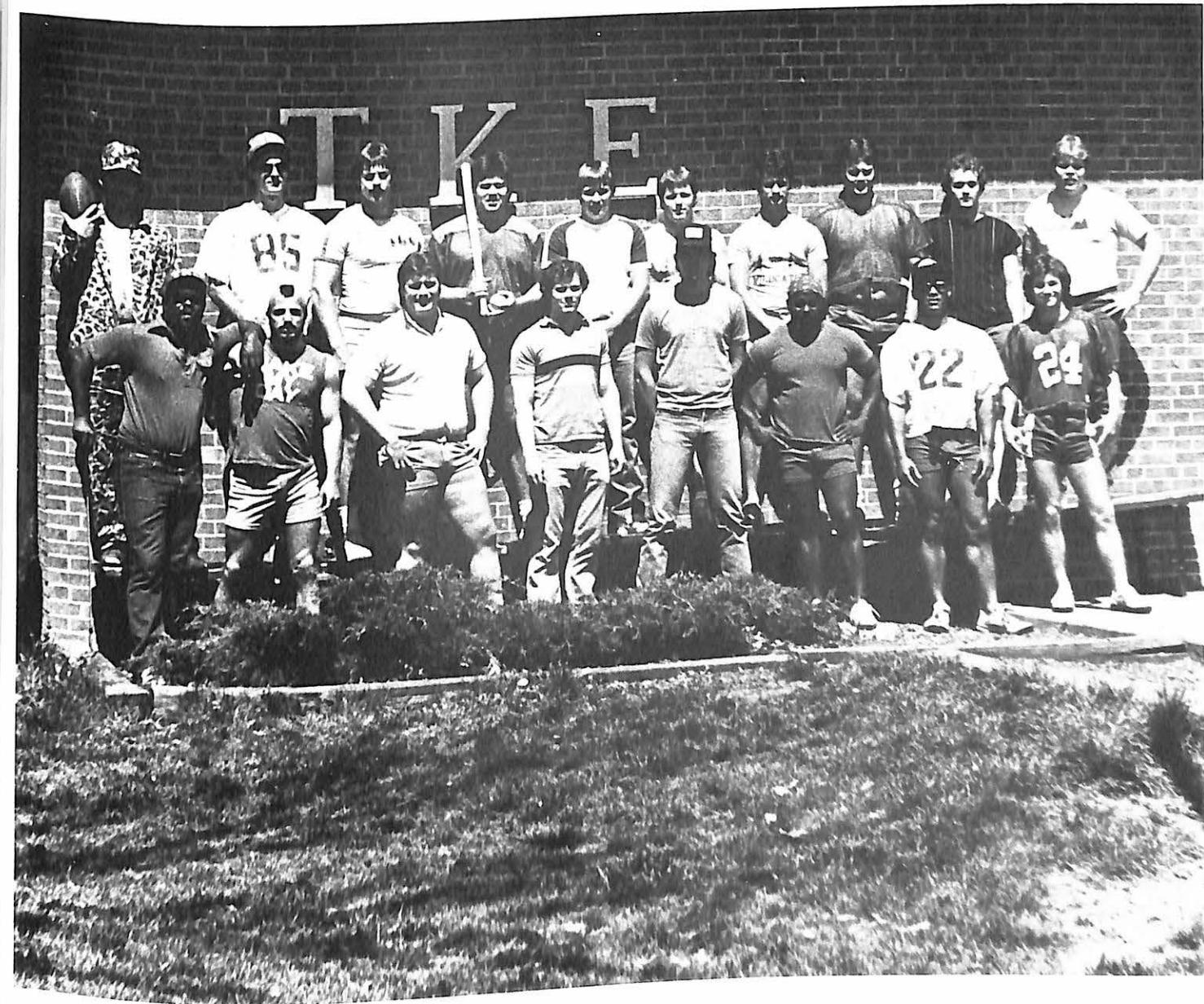

1984 FOOTBALL SEASON

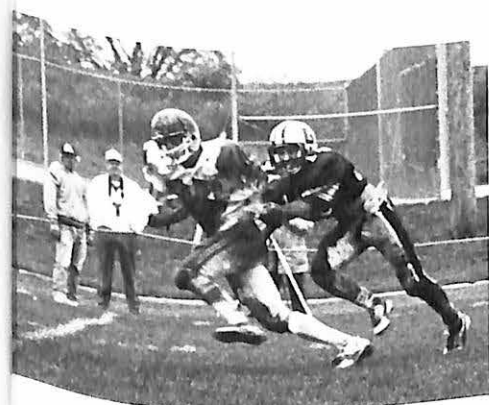
The 1984 football schedule was one of the most difficult that the "Vikings" have ever faced. The first 3 games were against non-conference teams with spring football and full scholarship programs for their team. Three of the next four opponents (HAAC schools) were ranked in the top 20 of the NAIA (#1, #9 and #18). We returned only two defensive and six offensive starters from 1983. Valley got off to a very slow start with an early 2-4 record but came on strong to finish the season at 6-4 and a 2nd place tie in the HAAC. By the end of the season we had a very good football team and the kind of team that the coaching staff would like to have taken into the post-season play. Our team defense was ranked 6th nationally. We were very proud of the progress of the 1984 team.

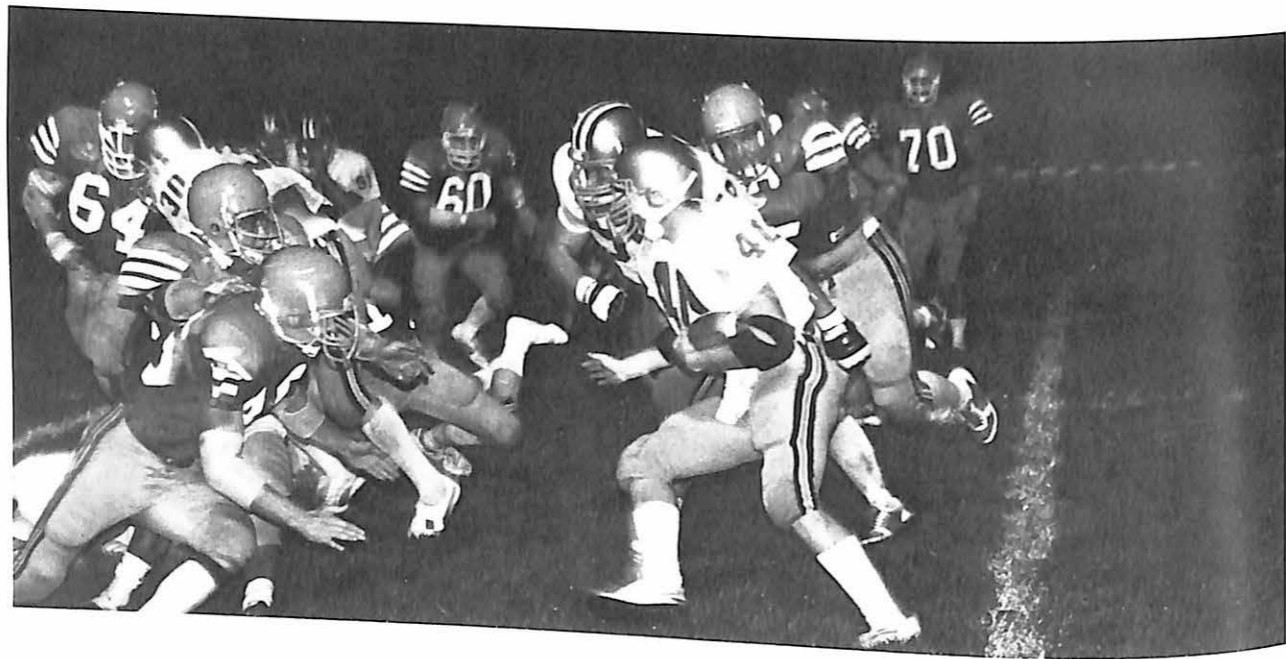

This year, we saw a complete change in our basketball program from a new head coach, Denny Fox, to an upgraded schedule on down to 25 new faces in the program.

The teams finished the season with a 6-24 record but with only two experienced players returning, and that being limited experience, not much more could be expected. 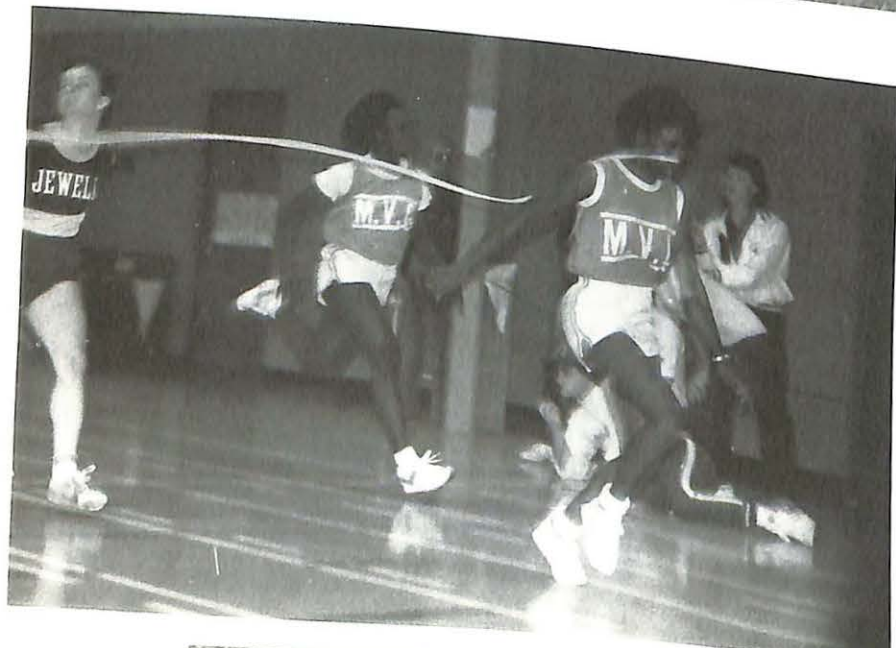

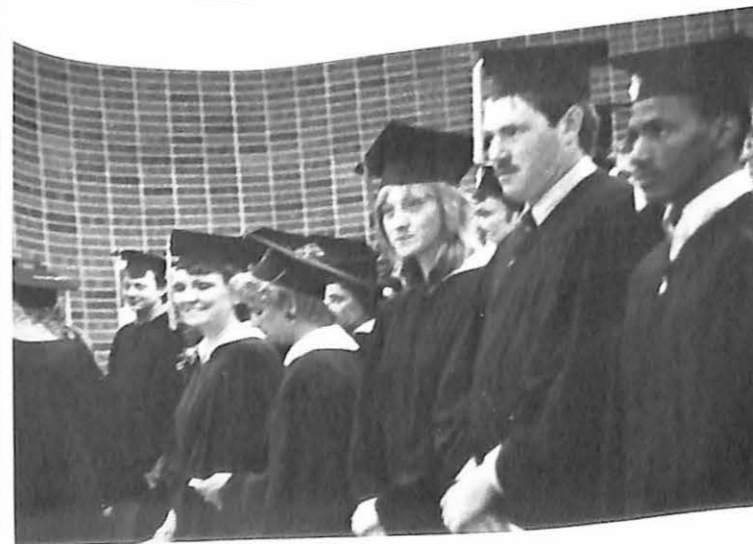
THE 96TH COMMENCEMENT
